1 1. On page 53, strike lines 20 through 29 and insert:

6 There is included in the appropriation to this program for FY2023-24

9 appropriation to this program for FY2024-25 \$11,314,060 General Funds and  
10 \$14,230,000 Cash Funds for state aid, which shall only be used for such  
11 purpose.

12 2. On page 56, after line 27 insert the following new paragraph:

13 "There is included in the amount shown as aid for this program for  
14 FY2023-24 \$5,000,000 Cash Funds from the Nebraska Health Care Cash Fund  
15 and for FY2024-25 \$5,000,000 Cash Funds from the Nebraska Health Care  
16 Cash Fund for a pilot program related to gun violence. The Department of  
17 Health and Human Services shall distribute the funds to the Charles Drew  
18 Health Center to create a pilot program to assess the need for  
19 substantial efforts to prevent post-traumatic stress disorder through the  
20 reduction of community gun violence. The pilot program shall assess the  
21 degree of community exposure to acts of violence, including, but not  
22 limited to, witnessing incidents of fighting or shooting, hearing  
23 gunshots, or experiencing an act of community violence; identify  
24 treatment services; use the best available evidence-supported assessment  
25 procedures and intervention strategies that include non-office-based  
26 treatment settings and parent-operated programs; build a sustainable and

1 accessible program beyond the pilot community to engage community  
2 partnerships with key stakeholders, including, but not limited to,  
3 churches, law enforcement agencies, civic organizations, and businesses;  
4 and conduct periodic evaluations for all post-traumatic stress disorder  
5 assessment and treatment services, including costs and settings for care,  
6 and proximal and distal client outcomes. It is the intent of the  
7 Legislature to appropriate five million dollars from the Nebraska Health  
8 Care Cash Fund to the department for the pilot program for each of fiscal  
9 years 2025-26, 2026-27, and 2027-28."
