

AMENDMENTS TO LB814

(Amendments to Standing Committee amendments, AM915)

Introduced by Wayne, 13.

1           1. On page 53, strike lines 20 through 29 and insert:

6           There is included in the appropriation to this program for FY2023-24  
7 \$11,314,060 General Funds and \$14,671,882 Cash Funds for state aid, which  
8 shall only be used for such purpose. There is included in the  
9 appropriation to this program for FY2024-25 \$11,314,060 General Funds and  
10 \$14,230,000 Cash Funds for state aid, which shall only be used for such  
11 purpose.

12           2. On page 56, after line 27 insert the following new paragraph:

13           "There is included in the amount shown as aid for this program for  
14 FY2023-24 \$5,000,000 Cash Funds from the Nebraska Health Care Cash Fund  
15 and for FY2024-25 \$5,000,000 Cash Funds from the Nebraska Health Care  
16 Cash Fund for a pilot program related to gun violence. The Department of  
17 Health and Human Services shall, on or before August 1 of each year,  
18 distribute the funds to the Charles Drew Health Center for a pilot  
19 program to assess the need for substantial efforts to prevent post-  
20 traumatic stress disorder through the reduction of community gun  
21 violence. The pilot program shall assess the degree of community exposure  
22 to acts of violence, including, but not limited to, witnessing incidents  
23 of fighting or shooting, hearing gunshots, or experiencing an act of  
24 community violence; identify treatment services; use the best available  
25 evidence-supported assessment procedures and intervention strategies that  
26 include non-office-based treatment settings and parent-operated programs;

1 build a sustainable and accessible program beyond the pilot community to  
2 engage community partnerships with key stakeholders, including, but not  
3 limited to, churches, law enforcement agencies, civic organizations, and  
4 businesses; and conduct periodic evaluations for all post-traumatic  
5 stress disorder assessment and treatment services, including costs and  
6 settings for care, and proximal and distal client outcomes. It is the  
7 intent of the Legislature to appropriate five million dollars from Cash  
8 Funds to the department for the pilot program for each of fiscal years  
9 2025-26, 2026-27, and 2027-28."
