Summary of purpose and/or changes:

Section 2 would amend § 42-924 to provide additional authority for a court issuing a domestic violence protection order to direct the care or enjoin contact with a household pet.

Explanation of amendments:

This amendment replaces the original bill.

Section 1 is unchanged.

In AM482, section 2 would amend § 42-924 to provide for the "sole possession" of a household pet instead of "directing the care, custody, or control" of the pet. The amended version would add the authority for a court to enjoin a respondent from coming into contact, harming, or killing a pet owned by the respondent. The amendment would also add language to clarify that possession under the protection order only lasts for the duration of the order and the order does not give petitioner the authority to transfer, sell, or dispose of the pet, except for humane euthanasia recommended by a licensed veterinarian.
