#### Summary of purpose and/or changes:

Summary:

This bill would prohibit state and local government agencies from requiring disclosure or disclosing information in their possession relating to supporters, volunteers or contributors to 501(c) nonprofit organizations. The measure exempts the Accountability and Disclosure Act requirements and court related actions. The bill provides for injunctive relief and damages for violations.

### **Explanation of amendments:**

The committee amendment adds further exceptions relating to evaluation of applications for occupational and facilities licenses, performance of criminal history record information checks where expressly authorized by statute, and the

Department of Banking and Finance relating to its oversight authority.

The amendment also clarifies the nature of relief authorized for claims made under the Act, to include a maximum of \$2,500 liquidated damages per violation, and appropriate preliminary, equitable, or declaratory relief.
