Additional Comments regarding segregation status: There are different kinds of prison segregation, but they look a lot alike, with long lock-in times, severe restrictions on activities and on contact with other inmates, and extreme security measures such as frequent cell and body searches. Even though administrative and protective segregation are not supposed to punish, they are often operated in similar ways to punitive segregation. Long ago, courts recognized that prolonged isolation and sensory deprivation can be psychologically damaging. The Supreme Court said of Nineteenth century solitary confinement that "a considerable number of prisoners fell, after even a short confinement, into a semi-fatuous condition from which it was next to impossible to arouse them, and others became violently insane; others still, committed suicide; while those who stood the ordeal better were not generally reformed, and in most cases did not recover sufficient mental activity to be of any subsequent service to the community." In *re Medley*, 134 U.S. 160, 168, 10 S.Ct. 384 (1890). Modern courts have also acknowledged "what anyway seems pretty obvious, that isolating a humane being from other human beings year after year or even month after month can cause substantial psychological damage, even if the ISC is not total." See *Davenport v. DeRobertis*, 844 F.2d 1310, 1313, 1316 (7th Cir. 1988) accord, *Madrid v. Gomez*, 889 F. Supp. 1146, 1235 (N.D. Cal. 1995) ("many, if not most, inmates in the SHU experience some degree of psychological trauma in reaction to their extreme social isolation and the severely restricted environmental stimulation in SHU") *Langley v. Coughlin*, 715 F. Supp. 522, 540 (S.D. N.Y. 1989); *Baraldini v. Meese*, 691 F. Supp. 432, 446-47 (D.D.C. 1988) (citing testimony re sensory disturbance, perceptual distortions, and other psychological effects of segregation), *rev'd on other grounds*, 884 F.2d 615 (D.C. Cir. 1989); *Bono v. Saxbe*, 450 F. Supp. 934, 946-47 (E.D. Ill. 1978), *aff'd in part and remanded in part on other grounds*, 620 F.2d 609 (7th Cir. 1980). Several of the cited cases rely on the research and testimony of psychiatrist Stuart Grassian. See *Stuart Grassian, M.D., Psychopathological Effects of solitary confinement*, 140 Am. J. Psychiatry 11 (1983); *Stuart Grassian and Nancy Friedman, Effects of sensory deprivation in psychiatric seclusion and solitary confinement*, 8 INT'L J. of LAW AND PSYCHIATRY 49 (1986). Despite this recognition, courts have not been willing to prohibit isolated confinement in conventional segregation units.

In my situation, I am currently on protective custody status and been in segregation for over 6 years. I have requested on numerous occasions to be transferred to the Lincoln Correctional Center general population in order to be placed in a least restrictive alternative but prison administrator and warden at the Tecumseh state correctional institution has repeatedly refuse to grant my request. I have repeatedly expressed my concerns if left or placed at the TSCI general population or NSP general population, however, prison officials seem to capriciously deny my request to get transferred to LCC general population to maliciously continue my segregation status and/or utilize the segregation status as a punishment tool. Prison officials have given me excuse after excuse for reason of not transferring me to the LCC general population, however, LCC, NSP and TSCI are all suited with the capabilities to house inmates on maximum custody level. I have spent a lot of time in segregation and I will be the first one to say that it has made a tremendous negative impact on my behavior, however, fear staff are also to blame for which they have engaged in sexual abuse towards me. I just want to experience again some normalcy and live in a decent living environment in hopes to recuperate and readjust myself to some sense of normalcy.

Stress plays a big ^{Factor} of these issues then it doesn't make it any better when staff in segregation is not appropriate, proper, profession, job fearing, understandable, respectful. 2.) When staff break laws and regulations here are no disciplinary action given, "NO Discipline". Relies & regulations (Guidelines) that they ^(STAFF) test out and try to enforce but never follow. -OR- They (STAFF) make up rules as the day goes on that's a big big issue (problem) "STAFF make up rules as they go on". And when an inmate point it out that's its not in the rules & regulation inmate-handbook - The higher rank will always agree with co-worker even in wrong situations. 3.) Staff playing with people mail -OR- handling it out to the wrong person because they do not care. Its not their mail, so they do whatever.

Further more: Protective Custody inmate going on a contact visit must not be handcuffed in visiting room. if they are on level A7 it is degrading to the inmate and for those that are visiting him inmates on level A7 are considered ready for transition no need for restraints. Note: Inmates talk about assaulting me, everyday and threatening to kill me. the guards or any of the staff dont do anything about it. makes me so paranoid. at times I think I have to do them before they do me. Routinely, inmates regress because anytime well behaving inmates encounter aggressive inmates, they are subjected to segregation not due their own fault. Segregation is also used to target inmates administrators want off the yards. Inmates find themselves locked away because staff holds a grudge - on a 'payback' thing. Also, most of the beds in general population being full as well as segregation being full keeps those in segregation from going back to general population. When too many inmates are in prison due to overcrowding an excuse typically gets provided that those in segregation are problem inmates to cover up the fact there is just nowhere else to put people. Misconduct reports and segregation do not work because of overuse and abuse. The ripple effect of such - when long term inmates might seek pardons or commutation. Everyone is lumped into one pot of we're all 'all bad', although our institution record speaks and character references go ignored. Sentences are just too long for some who learn a lesson easily.

The mental health and segregation medical are lacking because inmates are kept in cells as opposed to being seen in a conducive setting to inmates treatment. Security measures exist to allow screening inmates face to face (via shackle/handcuffs). Inmates have died in segregation for lack of proper attention, and denial is the norm in segregation. No one cares what you want. You get it when (and if) they give it. The Staff need more people skills. There is an everload of staff with cruel attitudes. Any requests for clarity on treatment or rules is met with disdain.

Both facilities use cages that are no bigger than the cells when at yard. It makes inmates feel like caged animals. It also provides no chance to be social which causes a person to withdraw into themselves even more. NSP does not provide any sort of equipment to use for exercise in the big yards. Both facilities provide no equipment for exercise when in cages. The cages cause inmates to not even want to go to yard. Neither facility has water access while at yard no matter what the temperature is.

Neither facility offers programming in segregation or general population. Both facilities use state justification to keep inmates in segregation for as long as possible, to use up as many beds as possible in segregation to make room in general population to ease the over crowding.

Mental health staff do not check on segregated inmates unless the inmate requests to be seen. Most inmates do not request help for fear of being over heard by other inmates. There is no privacy provided. The air quality in the cells is horrible.

When you first get to segregation at NSP you can only order Junk Food from canteen, ie. Candy bars, cookies and chips.

Both facilities use personal hygiene as an incentive.

NSP does not have a working level program. TSCI cheats inmates on the levels program. Inmates transferred to TSCI who are already on level 7A have to restart level 7A upon entering unit 1F. Other inmates can't level up until beds open up in 1F.

And the grievance process does not exist. It is so bias that if you complain you already know there will be retaliation towards you. And the "Write Up" System is used improperly. And when it is known that the write up is false there is nothing done to the officer who wrote it.

And there needs to be a standard for medical. As a diabetic there is no proper meal plan, we have never seen an "Endocrinologist" Diabetic Dr. There is nothing on the store that is good for a Diabetic. And there are not enough blood sugar checks done in a day. Average checks should be done before and after each meal. We get lucky if it's twice. Or medical is inflexible with insulin when an inmate has a visit. For example they want to give us insulin at 4:20 p.m. but we have a visit at 5:00 - or 5:20 and either we have to skip our shot and go without it or take it and wait 45 to 1 hour or more before we eat something which is dangerous. Also they are giving medication improperly, and possibly dangerous because it's given incorrectly. According to FDA and their own paperwork. I write grievances on the matter and I was ignored. Being on Deathrow we are viewed as dead men and so everything comes second, mental health, medical, guards, and in general treatment.

And two weeks on that really out no joke! your kitchen go crazy sometimes it just dont seem appropriate, for the amount of time on it, and for the reasons they use it. I got demerited for contraband and I got my misconduct report dismissed yet I never was allowed to get my levels restored and I find myself here today working my way back up to level 7. This segregation program makes no sense. When I got into this altercation the Captain Mr. Conley told me that the guy I fought was his personal C.I. and that I had no reason to fight him so my consequences would be him keeping me in segregation/I-M for the next 2-3 years. I didn't believe him but true to his word. It's going on 2 years of me being held in segregation on I-M. Honestly there's been guys/inmates that have used weapons in their altercations and they've been released back to population before especially some come back to segregation and yet they still let them back out. The inmates I fought have been released back to population. Well the Captains C.I. was and is for the other was pending P.C. We asked to get transferred to LCC with my younger brother cause to me it seems like TSCI don't want me back in population. Also me being in LCC with my younger brother would help me get into the Residential Substance Abuse Treatment that they have to offer not only this reason. I believe it will help my time around us help me become a better person by the time I'm ready to transition back out to society. We been told that if I get back out to population L.C.C. will gladly accept my transfer but yet I'm still being held in segregation. It seems that the inmates that get crazy and out of control get the most attention and I don't wanna go down this road cause I'm color collective and a very humble person. I just would like a little recognition and soon.

I haven't been able to talk with mental health since December of 2013. Mental health would come see all inmates at least once a month and since the beginning of the year I've only seen them come to see maybe four inmates on the gallery. I tried to talk to mental health and was told to send a inmate interview request with my concerns and I still never got a reply. The only time I see mental health other than when they come to talk with chosen inmates is at a physical review and it's still hard to get any questions answered about mental health programming. Basically it's hard to catch mental health when they come to a gallery and they don't come down here like they say. I have also seen CIA provoke inmates with mental health problems and make their time harder.

Staff don't come down and try to work with inmates like their concerned about helping an inmate be successful in prison and on the streets. I've sent requests asking to get moved so I can start program. C.V.O.R.T is only at one institution as far as I know. I send inmate interview request and staff will say come to the review, but then they still don't answer any questions or try to come to conclusion to a situation. Because I'm being forced on involuntary P.C, I've signed refusal forms and I'm still classified on this status. The institution is going to make me fight the classification for probably up to two years and that is too long to be down here.

Segregation status in T.S.C.I. is completely ridiculous. Its more the administration than the actual segregated confinement. For example: I just served 3 months in segregation for "horse play" with one of my best friends; and the time before that I served 43 days for warning the C.O.'s that my cell mate was using the restroom as they were about to begin a cell search. I've been a lucky inmate to not yet be buried or forgotten in segregation. Its being segregated for so long for situations so petty that is causing inmates mental health to deteriorate. Every long trip in segregation changes a person for the worst, whether they admit it or not. And on top of that there is no counseling or programming to help and inmate get better. They just take your phone calls, visits, law library time, and all other privileges for years at a time with no real reason behind it, but then expect an inmate to stay "sane" and to understand why they're doing what they're doing. The whole thing is cruel and unusual. Something so simple as "one on one" private counseling sessions could possibly make a huge difference to someone, giving them a chance to vent instead of holding in pent up anger for years at a time.

Additional Comments regarding segregation status: I was placed in segregation because a case worker wrote a misconduct report (MR # 4476) stating that she saw me and two other inmates ([redacted] and [redacted]) punching each other with closed fist in the head and upper torso. This all took place in view of one of the two cameras in Housing Unit 2A and in front of the control center. This case worker wrote the MR lied we were never fighting or punching each other, when the MR was read to me I told the Investigating officer I wanted the video footage as evidence at my hearing in front of the Institutional Disciplinary Committee. At my hearing the video was purposely withheld and instead they showed the video from the camera that was not pointing at us and there was no evidence (pictures of injuries, statements written by other inmates, staff or medical staff) that was presented that support the ~~allegation~~ false allegations even though this fight took place in front of ~~the~~ ^{the} control center with a staff member inside and in front of all the inmates. I was however found guilty even after all 3 inmates involved including me wrote statements that no one was fighting and the non-existing evidence. I'm now on Administrative confinement and will probably be in segregation for a long time over this. About two weeks after my hearing a Corporal (C.O.) working my gallery told me he saw the video of the "fight" and that it clearly shows that we were not fighting. This is the same video that I asked for evidence but was not presented at my hearing. I have written the warden many times about this but all he does and wants to know is the name of the C.O. who told me this. I'm not telling you this so that you can specifically look into my case but to give you an example of the false allegations and abuse of power being used to keep us in segregation. Out of the 200 cells in segregation at least 50 are here on bogus allegations the problem is that if they were to acknowledge us and get us out ~~there~~ ^{where} they wouldn't have any place to put us so they got to keep the hole full do ~~it~~ ^{they} ~~it~~ ^{they}

I am now being punished by the institution along with the gang that wanted me to join. I have to spend 22 hrs a day in my cell with no ability to do any type of programs. But the gang members that wanted me in to do a hit ~~now~~ have all opportunities to do anything. So this makes me wonder if joining a gang in here would have gave me more benefits. I have talked to several other inmates that are in the same predicament that I am. They refused to be part or take part in gang activities and now they ended up in here. I want to be productive in a positive way and ready myself for my release. I am just wanting a safe return to my family, and to be a better person. The staff in here thumb their nose at us and kick us when we are down. Staff members have even stole our medications out of the medication box this happened in my unit 3C @ Nsp. We can't understand why staff want to abuse us mentally the way they do. We also have a staff member that will pop our doors 10 to 18 x's in a row just to annoy us. I have PTSD This scares me and triggers flash backs.

Additional Comments regarding segregation status: I have not been offered any kind of mental health treatment since I have been in segregation and I have documented KITAS I have written to mental health, my understand of the history of segregation is it's for a person to think about their actions well I was involved in a 2 on 1 altercation on 1-1-14 I was placed on Administrative Segregation for my participation in this altercation the date today is 8-30-14 I was given 4 month more they said because I am a security threat to the safety and security of the institution so I am not eligible to leave segregation until 12-30-14 I have completed there levels program here in the control unit I have only had one write up down here which resulted in Room Restriction, I have noticed my mental health to continue to deteriorate since my stay in the control unit I feel my stay in the control unit is overdue and excessive and it has contributed to my mental health problems now since all of this early releases they have the spotlight on them and they offered a self betterment program which I was not offered instead it was give to people who have been in the segregation unit only a couple of months, why wouldn't you put the people who are going to be eligible to leave segregation in this program before those who are still on disciplinary segregation, in my case I believe excess punishment could be leading to deaver mental health issues due to only being offered a program when people start asking questions please look into the following. Also there is a big Gang Problem in these prisons and if any member just gets it in their head they want you gone they send people to jump you. I am not Gang Affiliated and had a job in the Prison Braille Shop and was a Certified Brailist. All of a sudden I was targeted by the African American Gangs as a racist yet did nothing to deserve any accusation. So I am in Protective Custody which is overcrowded where we receive one hour of yard, and one hour of Dayroom with no job because jobs are few. With a transfer to Tecumseh approved yet like so many were in Protective Custody and they want transfer us. There are no programs, and it is a very bad place to be. If your Committee can help please do.

I believe segregation rules should be followed throughout the unit regardless of the staff, or inmate & their relationship. No programs are allowed on segregation status, however if certain inmates aren't even allowed to be released from segregation (referring to protective custody) they shouldn't be held accountable for threats & attacks made against them, heinous crime, gang affiliation, none of that should stop a person from the programs that "claim" to help inmates re-enter society.
