1	FOR AN ACT relating to elections; to amend sections 49-1474.02
2	and 86-236, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2006;
3	to change requirements for campaign messages under the
4	Nebraska Political Accountability and Disclosure Act; to
5	provide requirements for political messages disseminated
6	under the Automatic Dialing-Announcing Devices Act;
7	to harmonize provisions; and to repeal the original
8	sections.

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Section 1. Section 49-1474.02, Revised Statutes

- 2 Cumulative Supplement, 2006, is amended to read:
- 3 49-1474.02 (1) Any person who makes an expenditure
- 4 reportable under the Nebraska Political Accountability and
- 5 Disclosure Act to disseminate by any means of telecommunication
- 6 a prerecorded message or a recorded message relating to a
- 7 candidate or ballot question shall include, immediately preceding
- 8 the message, in the message the name of the person, including
- 9 committees, making the expenditure. Such messages shall only be
- 10 disseminated between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 9:00 p.m. at
- 11 the location of the person receiving such messages. No more than
- 12 two such messages shall be disseminated to any one residential
- 13 <u>telephone line per calendar day.</u>
- 14 (2) Any person who makes an expenditure reportable under
- 15 the act to disseminate by any means of telecommunication a message
- 16 relating to a candidate or ballot question which is not a recorded
- 17 message or a prerecorded message shall, immediately upon the
- 18 request of the recipient of the message, disclose the name of
- 19 the person, including committees, making the expenditure. If the
- 20 message is disseminated through an employee or agent of the person
- 21 making the expenditure, the employee or agent shall, immediately
- 22 upon the request of the recipient of the message, disclose the name
- 23 of the person, including committees, making the expenditure.
- 24 (3) Any person who makes an expenditure reportable under
- 25 the act to disseminate by any electronic means, including the

- 2 question shall include in the message the name of the person,
- 3 including committees, making the expenditure.

- 9 Sec. 3. Any person using an automatic dialing-announcing
- 10 device for messages of a political nature, including, but not
- 11 limited to, messages relating to a candidate or ballot question,
- 12 shall:
- 13 (1) At the beginning of the message, state clearly the
- 14 identity of the person on whose behalf the message is being
- 15 transmitted;
- 16 (2) Include in the message a statement of whether or not
- 17 the message was authorized by a candidate and, if authorized, the
- 18 name of the candidate;
- 19 (3) Transmit such messages only between the hours of 8:00
- 20 a.m. and 9:00 p.m. at the location of the person receiving such
- 21 messages; and
- 22 (4) Transmit no more than two such messages to any one
- 23 residential telephone line per calendar day.
