## A BILL

FOR AN ACT relating to legal procedure; to amend sections 42-353 and 43-1803, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska; to change complaint and petition provisions from date to year of birth; and to repeal the original sections. Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

Section 1. Section 42-353, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is amended to read: 42-353 The pleadings required by sections 42-347 to 42-381 shall be governed by the rules of pleading in civil actions promulgated under section 25-801.01. The complaint shall include the following:

7 (1) The name and address of the plaintiff and his or her8 attorney;

9 (2) The name and address, if known, of the defendant;

10 (3) The date and place of marriage;

(4) The name and <u>date year of birth of each child whose</u>
custody or welfare may be affected by the proceedings;

13 (5) If the plaintiff is a party to any other pending
14 action for divorce, separation, or dissolution of marriage, a
15 statement as to where such action is pending;

(6) A statement of the relief sought by the plaintiff,
including adjustment of custody, property, and support rights; and
(7) An allegation that the marriage is irretrievably
broken.

Sec. 2. Section 43-1803, Reissue Revised Statutes of
Nebraska, is amended to read:

43-1803 (1) If the minor child's parent or parents are deceased or have never been married, a grandparent seeking visitation shall file a petition in the district court in the county in which the minor child resides. If the marriage of the

parents of a minor child has been dissolved or a petition for 1 2 the dissolution of such marriage has been filed, is still pending, 3 but no decree has been entered, a grandparent seeking visitation shall file a petition for such visitation in the district court 4 5 in the county in which the dissolution was had or the proceedings are taking place. The county court or the district court may hear 6 7 the proceeding as provided in section 25-2740. The form of the 8 petition and all other pleadings required by this section shall be 9 prescribed by the Supreme Court. The petition shall include the 10 following: 11 (a) The name and address of the petitioner and his or her 12 attorney; 13 (b) The name and address of the parent, guardian, or 14 other party having custody of the child or children; 15 (c) The name and address of any parent not having custody of the child or children if applicable; 16 (d) The name and date year of birth of each child with 17 18 whom visitation is sought; 19 (e) The relationship of petitioner to such child or 20 children; 21 (f) An allegation that the parties have attempted to reconcile their differences, but the differences are irreconcilable 22 and such parties have no recourse but to seek redress from the 23 court; and 24 25 (g) A statement of the relief sought.

1 (2) When a petition seeking visitation is filed, a copy 2 of the petition shall be served upon the parent or parents or other 3 party having custody of the child and upon any parent not having 4 custody of such child by personal service or in the manner provided 5 in section 25-517.02.
