#### A BILL

1	FOR AN ACT relating to the Nebraska Rules of the Road; to amend
2	section 60-6,186, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska,
3	and section 60-4,182, Revised Statutes Cumulative
4	Supplement, 2006; to clarify speed limits on certain
5	freeways; to harmonize provisions; to delete obsolete
6	provisions; to repeal the original sections; and to
7	declare an emergency.

Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1 Section 1. Section 60-4,182, Revised Statutes Cumulative

- 2 Supplement, 2006, is amended to read:
- 3 60-4,182 In order to prevent and eliminate successive
- 4 traffic violations, there is hereby provided a point system dealing
- 5 with traffic violations as disclosed by the files of the director.
- 6 The following point system shall be adopted:
- 7 (1) Conviction of motor vehicle homicide 12 points;
- 8 (2) Third offense drunken driving in violation of any
- 9 city or village ordinance or of section 60-6,196, as disclosed by
- 10 the records of the director, regardless of whether the trial court
- 11 found the same to be a third offense 12 points;
- 12 (3) Failure to stop and render aid as required under
- 13 section 60-697 in the event of involvement in a motor vehicle
- 14 accident resulting in the death or personal injury of another 6
- 15 points;
- 16 (4) Failure to stop and report as required under section
- 17 60-696 or any city or village ordinance in the event of a motor
- 18 vehicle accident resulting in property damage 6 points;
- 19 (5) Driving a motor vehicle while under the influence
- 20 of alcoholic liquor or any drug or when such person has a
- 21 concentration of eight-hundredths of one gram or more by weight of
- 22 alcohol per one hundred milliliters of his or her blood or per two
- 23 hundred ten liters of his or her breath in violation of any city or
- 24 village ordinance or of section 60-6,196 6 points;
- 25 (6) Willful reckless driving in violation of any city or

1 village ordinance or of section 60-6,214 or 60-6,217 - 6 points;

- 2 (7) Careless driving in violation of any city or village
- 3 ordinance or of section 60-6,212 4 points;
- 4 (8) Negligent driving in violation of any city or village
- 5 ordinance 3 points;
- 6 (9) Reckless driving in violation of any city or village
- 7 ordinance or of section 60-6,213 5 points;
- 8 (10) Speeding in violation of any city or village
- 9 ordinance or any of sections 60-6,185 to 60-6,190 and 60-6,313:
- 10 (a) Not more than five miles per hour over the speed
- 11 limit 1 point;
- 12 (b) More than five miles per hour but not more than ten
- 13 miles per hour over the speed limit 2 points; and
- 14 (c) More than ten miles per hour over the speed limit -
- 15 3 points, except that one point shall be assessed upon conviction
- 16 of exceeding by not more than ten miles per hour, two points shall
- 17 be assessed upon conviction of exceeding by more than ten miles per
- 18 hour but not more than fifteen miles per hour, and three points
- 19 shall be assessed upon conviction of exceeding by more than fifteen
- 20 miles per hour the speed limits provided for in subdivision (1)(e),
- 21 (f), or (h) of section 60-6,186;
- 22 (11) Failure to yield to a pedestrian not resulting in
- 23 bodily injury to a pedestrian 2 points;
- 24 (12) Failure to yield to a pedestrian resulting in bodily
- 25 injury to a pedestrian 4 points; and

1 (13) All other traffic violations involving the operation

- 2 of motor vehicles by the operator for which reports to the
- 3 Department of Motor Vehicles are required under sections 60-497.01
- 4 and 60-497.02, not including violations involving an occupant
- 5 protection system pursuant to section 60-6,270, parking violations,
- 6 violations for operating a motor vehicle without a valid operator's
- 7 license in the operator's possession, muffler violations,
- 8 overwidth, overheight, or overlength violations, motorcycle or
- 9 moped protective helmet violations, or overloading of trucks 1
- 10 point.
- 11 All such points shall be assessed against the driving
- 12 record of the operator as of the date of the violation for which
- 13 conviction was had. Points may be reduced by the department under
- 14 section 60-4,188.
- 15 In all cases, the forfeiture of bail not vacated shall be
- 16 regarded as equivalent to the conviction of the offense with which
- 17 the operator was charged.
- 18 The point system shall not apply to persons convicted
- 19 of traffic violations committed while operating a bicycle or an
- 20 electric personal assistive mobility device as defined in section
- 21 60-618.02.
- 22 Sec. 2. Section 60-6,186, Reissue Revised Statutes of
- 23 Nebraska, is amended to read:
- 24 60-6,186 (1) Except when a special hazard exists that
- 25 requires lower speed for compliance with section 60-6,185, the

1 limits set forth in this section and sections 60-6,187, 60-6,188,

- 2 60-6,305, and 60-6,313 shall be the maximum lawful speeds unless
- 3 reduced pursuant to subsection (2) of this section, and no person
- 4 shall drive a vehicle on a highway at a speed in excess of such
- 5 maximum limits:
- 6 (a) Twenty-five miles per hour in any residential
- 7 district;
- 8 (b) Twenty miles per hour in any business district;
- 9 (c) Fifty miles per hour upon any highway that is not
- 10 dustless surfaced and not part of the state highway system;
- (d) Fifty-five miles per hour upon any dustless-surfaced
- 12 highway not a part of the state highway system;
- 13 (e) (i) Until September 1, 1996, fifty-five miles per hour
- 14 upon any part of the state highway system other than an expressway
- 15 or a freeway; and
- 16 (ii) Beginning on and after September 1, 1996, sixty (e)
- 17 Sixty miles per hour upon any part of the state highway system
- 18 other than an expressway or a freeway, except that the Department
- 19 of Roads may, where existing design and traffic conditions allow,
- 20 according to an engineering study, authorize a speed limit five
- 21 miles per hour greater;
- 22 (f) Sixty-five miles per hour upon an expressway that is
- 23 part of the state highway system; and
- 24 (g) Sixty-five miles per hour upon a freeway that is part
- 25 of the state highway system but not part of the National System of

- 1 Interstate and Defense Highways; and
- 2 (g) (h) Seventy-five miles per hour upon a freeway that
- 3 is part of the state highway system and upon the National System
- 4 of Interstate and Defense Highways, except that the maximum speed
- 5 limit shall be sixty miles per hour for:
- 6 (i) Any portion of a freeway and the National System of
- 7 Interstate and Defense Highways located in Douglas County; and
- 8 (ii) That portion of the National System of Interstate
- 9 and Defense Highways designated as Interstate 180 in Lancaster
- 10 County and Interstate 129 in Dakota County.
- 11 (2) The maximum speed limits established in subsection
- 12 (1) of this section may be reduced by the Department of Roads or by
- 13 local authorities pursuant to section 60-6,188 or 60-6,190.
- 14 (3) The Department of Roads and local authorities may
- 15 erect and maintain suitable signs along highways under their
- 16 respective jurisdictions in such number and at such locations as
- 17 they deem necessary to give adequate notice of the speed limits
- 18 established pursuant to subsection (1) or (2) of this section upon
- 19 such highways.

- 22 Cumulative Supplement, 2006, are repealed.
- 23 Sec. 4. Since an emergency exists, this act takes effect
- 24 when passed and approved according to law.
