1	FOR AN A	ACT relating to economic development; to amend sections
2		81-1201.04, 81-1201.05, and 81-1201.14, Reissue Revised
3		Statutes of Nebraska; to change membership and
4		duties of the Economic Development Commission; to
5		eliminate provisions relating to the Nebraska Industrial
6		Competitiveness Alliance; and to repeal the original
7		sections.

8 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

Section 1. Section 81-1201.04, Reissue Revised Statutes
 of Nebraska, is amended to read:

3 81-1201.04 The commission shall consist of nine voting members appointed by the Governor. The chairperson of the 4 5 commission shall be one of the nine appointed members and shall be chosen by the commission. Each congressional district in 6 7 Nebraska shall be represented by three members, and the Governor 8 shall solicit nominations for appointments to the commission from 9 recognized economic development groups in Nebraska. The members of 10 the commission shall be representative, to the extent possible, of 11 the various geographic areas of the state and of both the urban and 12 rural population. The director shall serve as an ad hoc nonvoting 13 member of the commission. In appointing the members, the Governor 14 shall seek to create a broad-based commission representative of 15 the Nebraska economy. To achieve this objective the Governor shall 16 consider persons with backgrounds in the following areas: appoint 17 individuals from the following private industry sectors:

18 (1) Production agriculture;

19 (2) <u>Manufacturing;</u> At least two individuals from
20 manufacturing, one such individual shall represent a company with
21 no more than seventy-five employees;

22 (3) Transportation and communications; logistics;

23 (4) Travel and tourism; and

24 (5) Insurance. Financial services and insurance;

25 (6) Information technology and communications; and

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(7) Biotechnology. The commission and department are encouraged to involve other essential groups in the work of the commission, including, but not limited to, the (a) University of Nebraska, (b) Department of Agriculture, (c) State Energy Office, (d) educational institutions, (e) Department of Labor, and (f) Nebraska Investment Finance Authority. No more than five voting members of the commission shall belong to the same political party. The commission shall provide programmatic policy guidance and oversight to the Nebraska Manufacturing Extension Partnership. Sec. 2. Section 81-1201.05, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is amended to read: 81-1201.05 Members of the commission shall serve for terms of six four years, except that of the members initially appointed one member from each congressional district shall be appointed for a term of two years, one member for a term of four years, and one member for a term of six years. serving on the effective date of this act may serve for the remainder of their six-year terms. Members shall be limited to two consecutive terms. The director shall serve on the commission for the term of his or her appointment as director. If a vacancy occurs, the Governor

23 within forty-five working days after the date the vacancy occurs,
24 to finish the unexpired term of the member. The members of the
25 commission shall serve without compensation but may be reimbursed

for their actual and necessary expenses as provided in sections
 81-1174 to 81-1177 for state employees. The Governor shall make the
 initial appointments within sixty days after July 17, 1986.

Sec. 3. Section 81-1201.14, Reissue Revised Statutes of
Nebraska, is amended to read:

6 81-1201.14 The primary responsibility of the Existing Business Assistance Division shall be to provide assistance to 7 8 instate businesses. Such assistance shall encourage the startup 9 of new businesses and the retention and expansion of existing 10 businesses. Emphasis shall be placed upon meeting the unique needs 11 of small businesses in the state. Activities of the division shall 12 include, but not be limited to, financial packaging, technical 13 assistance, contacts with existing businesses regarding needs, 14 work force development, job training assistance, export technical 15 assistance, and assistance to businesses in accessing new markets 16 and new technologies.

The division shall avoid duplication with existing 17 18 programs already in place which assist small businesses and 19 entrepreneurs, and the department and the division shall deliver 20 their programs through, to the extent possible, the Nebraska 21 Business Development Center, Nebraska FoodStrategy, the University of Nebraska-Lincoln Food Processing Center, the Nebraska Investment 22 Finance Authority, the Small Business Administration of the federal 23 24 government, the Nebraska Industrial Competitiveness Alliance, and 25 other related organizations.

1 The Nebraska Industrial Competitiveness Alliance is 2 hereby created within the department. The alliance shall be a 3 cooperative partnership of individuals and organizations from business, labor, education, and government which assists Nebraska 4 5 manufacturers to be more competitive in the world market. The 6 alliance shall be governed by a board appointed by the Governor 7 upon recommendation from the department. The Nebraska Industrial 8 Competitiveness Alliance Board shall consist of twenty-two to 9 twenty-eight members of which the majority shall be individuals 10 from the private sector and at least one-half of whom shall 11 represent small and medium-sized manufacturers. Not more than eight 12 members of the board shall be from state or local government. The 13 board shall establish and approve bylaws to govern its operations 14 and will have the following powers and duties:

15 (1) To advise the Governor and state agencies on policies 16 and activities that will advance the competitiveness of Nebraska's 17 manufacturing sector;

18 (2) To provide programmatic policy, guidance, and 19 oversight to the Nebraska Industrial Competitiveness Service 20 manufacturing extension program and the School-to-Work Program and 21 provide oversight to the Science and Technology Program and any 22 other programs as assigned by the Governor or by the department; 23 (3) To establish a fee for selected services; and

24 (4) To receive and approve the expenditure of funds
 25 appropriated by the Legislature or received through federal program

1 grants, gifts, bequests, fees, commissions, and other contributions
2 from private sources.

3 Members of the Nebraska Industrial Competitiveness 4 Alliance Board shall not be liable to the state, to the alliance, 5 or to any other person as a result of their activities, whether 6 ministerial or discretionary, except for dishonesty, negligence, or 7 intentional violation of the law.

9 81-1201.14, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, are repealed.
