A BILL

1	FOR	AN	ACT relating to the state fair; to amend sections
2			2-101 and 2-104, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,
3			2006; to create the State Fair Future Commission and
4			provide powers and duties; to provide for relocation; to
5			harmonize provisions; to repeal the original sections;
6			and to declare an emergency.

7 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

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1	Section 1. (1) The Legislature finds that the needs of
2	the state fair have evolved over time so that the infrastructure at
3	the current location no longer meets the needs of the state fair.
4	(2) In order to continue to promote and showcase Nebraska
5	agriculture, industry, commerce, and the arts, sciences, and
6	technology, to present a forum for knowledge and ideas, and to
7	provide a safe, clean environment that is accessible to all, it is
8	the intent of the Legislature that the state fair be moved from its
9	current location to a new location.
10	(3) The Legislature further finds that due to the
11	vicinity of the land, known on the effective date of this
12	act as the Nebraska State Fairgrounds, to the University of
13	Nebraska-Lincoln campus, such land should be transferred to the
14	<u>University of Nebraska.</u>
15	Sec. 2. The State Fair Future Commission is established.
16	The commission shall study and make a recommendation to the
17	Legislature as to a new and suitable site for the location of
18	the state fair to be known as the Nebraska State Fairgrounds and
19	recommend plans for the transition and relocation of the state fair
20	including the horseracing track and related facilities.
21	Sec. 3. In determining the site for the state fair, the
22	State Fair Future Commission shall consider the following:
23	(1) Market factors including a population base sufficient
24	to support both fair and non-fair activities;
25	(2) The physical attributes of the site including

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1	compatible land use and primary and secondary road access;
2	(3) Visibility from and along primary road access;
3	(4) Suitability for the construction of a one-mile horse
4	track and grandstand;
5	(5) Topography and soil structure;
6	(6) Infrastructure needs;
7	(7) Available adjacent land for potential expansion;
8	(8) Site amenities; and
9	(9) Cost for site acquisition and relocation.
10	Sec. 4. The State Fair Future Commission shall hold
11	a public hearing on the future location of the Nebraska State
12	Fairgrounds and the process for transition and relocation of the
13	state fair in each of the state's three congressional districts on
14	or before December 31, 2008.
15	Sec. 5. The State Fair Future Commission shall issue a
16	report containing the recommendations required in section 2 of this
17	act to the Executive Board of the Legislative Council on or before
18	<u>December 31, 2008.</u>
19	Sec. 6. <u>(1) The State Fair Future Commission shall be</u>
20	composed of six members. The Governor shall appoint three members
21	of the commission, one from each of the state's three congressional
22	districts. The Legislature shall appoint three members of the
23	commission, one from each of the state's three congressional
24	districts. The members shall be appointed within thirty days after
25	the effective date of this act.

1	(2) The commission shall select a chairperson who
2	shall be responsible for keeping a record of all proceedings,
3	transactions, and official acts which may be necessary to carry
4	out the intent and purposes of sections 1 to 6 of this act. The
5	Executive Board of the Legislative Council shall provide such staff
6	support as the commission may require.
7	(3) The members of the commission shall be reimbursed for
8	their actual and necessary expenses as provided in sections 81-1174
9	to 81-1177.
10	(4) The commission shall consult and coordinate with
11	the Nebraska State Fair Board, the University of Nebraska, the
12	Nebraska Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association, and
13	the Agriculture Committee of the Legislature, as appropriate and
14	necessary.
15	Sec. 7. Section 2-101, Revised Statutes Cumulative
16	Supplement, 2006, is amended to read:
17	2-101 (1) The Nebraska State Fair Board, formerly known
18	as the State Board of Agriculture, shall hold an annual meeting for
19	the purpose of deliberating and consulting as to the wants,
20	prospects, and conditions of the agricultural, horticultural,
21	industrial, mechanical, and other interests throughout the state,
22	as well as those interests in the encouragement and perpetuation of
23	the arts, skilled crafts, and sciences.
24	(2) The Nebraska State Fair Board may provide in its

25 constitution and bylaws for the qualification and participation

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of delegates at the annual meeting from such associations 1 2 incorporated under the laws of the state for purposes of promoting 3 and furthering the interests of participants in agricultural, horticultural, industrial, mechanical, or other pursuits or for the 4 5 encouragement and perpetuation of the arts, skilled crafts, and sciences, and from such associations as provide for the training, 6 7 encouragement, and competition of the youth of Nebraska in such 8 endeavors. The annual meeting shall be held in every odd-numbered 9 year at the capital of the state and in every even-numbered year at 10 such location as the board determines. The chairperson of the board 11 shall also have the power to call meetings of the board whenever he 12 or she may deem it expedient. All meetings of the board shall be 13 conducted in accordance with the Open Meetings Act.

14 (3) (a) Until moved under subdivision (b) of this 15 <u>subsection, the</u> state fair shall be held at or near the city of 16 Lincoln, in Lancaster County, under the direction and supervision 17 of the Nebraska State Fair Board. 7 upon the site and tract of land 18 <u>selected and now owned by the state for that purpose and known as</u> 19 <u>the Nebraska State Fairgrounds.</u>

20 (b) The state fair relocation process shall be completed 21 by August 1, 2012.

22 (c) The board may, at its discretion, hold or dispense 23 with the holding of the fair, in any year.

24 Sec. 8. Section 2-104, Revised Statutes Cumulative 25 Supplement, 2006, is amended to read:

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2-104 (1) The State of Nebraska may provide for the 1 2 occupation, use, and management of the site and tract of land in 3 Lancaster County, selected and now owned by the State of Nebraska and known as the Nebraska State Fairgrounds, by the Nebraska 4 5 State Fair Board for purposes of (a) exhibitions of agricultural, horticultural, industrial, mechanical, or other products and 6 resources of the state, including proper exhibits and expositions 7 8 of the arts, skilled crafts, and sciences, (b) the conduct of 9 live and simulcast horseracing, and (c) other uses and purposes 10 determined by the board, including the leasing of parts of the 11 state fairgrounds. Such occupation, use, and management shall be 12 pursuant to a property management agreement entered into between 13 the board and the Department of Administrative Services on behalf 14 of the State of Nebraska. The board shall assume the role and 15 responsibilities of the State Board of Agriculture under any such 16 property management agreement in effect on January 1, 2003, and 17 such agreement may be amended from time to time as necessary to 18 carry out the purposes of sections 2-101 and 2-103 to 2-106 and as 19 amended shall continue in force and effect.

20 (2) Any property management agreement between the State 21 of Nebraska and the Nebraska State Fair Board pursuant to this 22 section shall provide for the reporting of information by the 23 board as deemed appropriate by the Department of Administrative 24 Services for ascertaining the development of private funding 25 sources, the use of state appropriations, the status of the

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Nebraska State Fairgrounds facility maintenance and improvements,
the fiscal status of the Nebraska State Fair, and the activities
and goals established for the state fair and the state fairgrounds.
Sec. 9. Original sections 2-101 and 2-104, Revised
Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2006, are repealed.
Sec. 10. Since an emergency exists, this act takes effect
when passed and approved according to law.
