Section 24-1301, Revised Statutes Cumulative 1 2 Supplement, 2006, is amended to read: 3 24-1301 The Legislature finds and declares that drug use contributes to and other offenses contribute to increased crime 4 5 in Nebraska, costs millions of dollars in lost productivity, and 6 contributes to the burden placed upon law enforcement, court, and 7 correctional systems in Nebraska. 8 The Legislature also finds and declares that drug court 9 programs and problem solving court programs are effective in 10 reducing recidivism of persons who participate in and complete drug 11 court such programs. The Legislature recognizes that a drug court 12 program or a problem solving court program offers a person accused 13 of drug offenses and other offenses an alternative to traditional 14 criminal justice or juvenile justice proceedings.
