A BILL

- 1 FOR AN ACT relating to agriculture; to adopt the Food Supply Animal
- Veterinary Incentive Program Act; and to state funding
- 3 intent.
- 4 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1 Section 1. Sections 1 to 8 of this act shall be known and

- 2 may be cited as the Food Supply Animal Veterinary Incentive Program
- 3 Act.
- 4 Sec. 2. For purposes of the Food Supply Animal Veterinary
- 5 Incentive Program Act:
- 6 (1) Department means the Department of Agriculture;
- 7 (2) Food supply animal includes cattle, hogs, sheep,
- 8 goats, and poultry;
- 9 (3) Food supply animal veterinarian means a veterinarian
- 10 who is engaged in general or food supply animal practice as his
- 11 or her primary focus of practice and who has a substantial portion
- 12 of his or her practice devoted to food supply animal veterinary
- 13 medicine;
- 14 (4) Program means the Food Supply Animal Veterinary
- 15 Incentive Program; and
- 16 (5) Rural mixed animal veterinary practice means practice
- 17 as a food supply animal veterinarian in a rural area and a
- 18 substantial portion of the practice involves food supply animal
- 19 veterinary practice.
- 20 Sec. 3. Each year the department shall select from a pool
- 21 of applicants four veterinarians to participate in the program.
- 22 The selected veterinarians are eligible to receive up to eighty
- 23 thousand dollars under the program as an incentive to locate in
- 24 <u>rural Nebraska and practice food supply animal veterinary medicine.</u>
- 25 Sec. 4. (1) To be eligible for funds under the program,

- 1 <u>an applicant shall:</u>
- 2 (a) Be a graduate of an approved veterinary medical
- 3 school;
- 4 (b) Be licensed to practice veterinary medicine in this
- 5 state;
- 6 (c) Contract to provide full-time veterinary medicine
- 7 services in a rural mixed animal veterinary practice for four years
- 8 in one or more communities approved by the department; and
- 9 (d) Be accredited by the United States Department of
- 10 Agriculture, Animal and Plant Inspection Service, Veterinary
- 11 Services to provide services relating to food supply animals by the
- 12 end of the first year of service.
- 13 (2) Rural communities that are located in areas
- 14 designated as shortage areas for food supply animal veterinary
- 15 medical services, as such areas are designated by the American
- 16 Veterinary Medical Association on the effective date of this act,
- 17 shall have preference as communities approved for contracts under
- 18 the program.
- 19 Sec. 5. (1) Program funds shall be distributed as
- 20 <u>follows:</u>
- 21 (a) After completing the first year of service under the
- 22 contract, the veterinarian is eligible to receive up to fifteen
- 23 thousand dollars;
- 24 (b) After completing the second year of service under the
- 25 contract, the veterinarian is eligible to receive up to fifteen

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- 2 (c) After completing the third year of service under the
- 3 contract, the veterinarian is eligible to receive up to twenty-five
- 4 thousand dollars; and
- 5 (d) After completing the fourth year of service under the
- 6 contract, the veterinarian is eligible to receive up to twenty-five
- 7 thousand dollars.
- 8 (2) If the veterinarian does not complete an entire year
- 9 of service, the amount distributed under this section for that year
- 10 shall be prorated.
- 11 Sec. 6. (1) A veterinarian shall be released from the
- 12 program contract without penalty if:
- 13 <u>(a) The veterinarian has completed the service</u>
- 14 requirements of the contract;
- 15 (b) The veterinarian is unable to complete the service
- 16 requirement of the contract because of a permanent physical
- 17 <u>disability;</u>
- 18 (c) The veterinarian demonstrates extreme hardship or
- 19 shows other good cause justifying the release; or
- 20 (d) The veterinarian dies.
- 21 (2) A veterinarian may be released from the program
- 22 contract if the veterinarian's license to practice in Nebraska or
- 23 federal accreditation is suspended or revoked.
- 24 <u>(3) The State of Nebraska shall be released from</u>
- 25 any further obligation under the Food Supply Animal Veterinary

1 Incentive Program Act or any contract entered into with a

- 2 veterinarian under the act if the veterinarian is released from the
- 3 program pursuant to this section.
- 4 Sec. 7. The Food Supply Animal Veterinary Incentive Fund
- 5 is created. Any money in the fund available for investment shall be
- 6 invested by the state investment officer pursuant to the Nebraska
- 7 Capital Expansion Act and the Nebraska State Funds Investment Act.
- 8 Sec. 8. The department shall adopt and promulgate rules
- 9 and regulations to carry out the Food Supply Animal Veterinary
- 10 Incentive Program Act.
- 11 Sec. 9. It is the intent of the Legislature that the Food
- 12 Supply Animal Veterinary Incentive Program Act be funded by General
- 13 Fund appropriations.
