1	FOR AN ACT relating to state officers; to amend section
2	84-712.05, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2006; to
3	provide for confidentiality of certain municipality records
4	as prescribed; and to repeal the original section.
5	Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

Section 1. Section 84-712.05, Revised Statutes Cumulative
Supplement, 2006, is amended to read:

3 84-712.05. The following records, unless publicly disclosed 4 in an open court, open administrative proceeding, or open meeting or 5 disclosed by a public entity pursuant to its duties, may be withheld 6 from the public by the lawful custodian of the records:

7 (1) Personal information in records regarding a student, 8 prospective student, or former student of any educational institution or exempt school that has effectuated an election not to meet state 9 approval or accreditation requirements pursuant to section 79-1601 10 11 when such records are maintained by and in the possession of a public 12 entity, other than routine directory information specified and made public consistent with 20 U.S.C. 1232g, as such section existed on 13 14 January 1, 2003;

15 (2) Medical records, other than records of births and deaths 16 and except as provided in subdivision (5) of this section, in any form 17 concerning any person; records of elections filed under section 18 44-2821; and patient safety work product under the Patient Safety 19 Improvement Act;

20 (3) Trade secrets, academic and scientific research work 21 which is in progress and unpublished, and other proprietary or 22 commercial information which if released would give advantage to 23 business competitors and serve no public purpose;

(4) Records which represent the work product of an attorney and the public body involved which are related to preparation for litigation, labor negotiations, or claims made by or against the public body or which are confidential communications as defined in

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1 section 27-503;

2 (5) Records developed or received by law enforcement agencies and other public bodies charged with duties of investigation 3 or examination of persons, institutions, or businesses, when the 4 5 records constitute a part of the examination, investigation, 6 intelligence information, citizen complaints or inquiries, informant 7 identification, or strategic or tactical information used in law 8 enforcement training, except that this subdivision shall not apply to records so developed or received relating to the presence of and 9 amount or concentration of alcohol or drugs in any body fluid of any 10 11 person;

12 (6) Appraisals or appraisal information and negotiation 13 records concerning the purchase or sale, by a public body, of any 14 interest in real or personal property, prior to completion of the 15 purchase or sale;

16 (7) Personal information in records regarding personnel of public bodies other than salaries and routine directory information; 17 Information solely pertaining to protection of the 18 (8) 19 security of public property and persons on or within public property, 20 such as specific, unique vulnerability assessments or specific, unique 21 response plans, either of which is intended to prevent or mitigate 22 criminal acts the public disclosure of which would create a 23 substantial likelihood of endangering public safety or property; 24 computer or communications network schema, passwords, and user 25 identification names; guard schedules; or lock combinations; (9) The security standards, procedures, policies, plans, 26 specifications, diagrams, access lists, and other security-related 27

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records of the Lottery Division of the Department of Revenue and those 1 persons or entities with which the division has entered into 2 3 contractual relationships. Nothing in this subdivision shall allow the division to withhold from the public any information relating to 4 5 amounts paid persons or entities with which the division has entered 6 into contractual relationships, amounts of prizes paid, the name of 7 the prize winner, and the city, village, or county where the prize 8 winner resides;

9 (10) With respect to public utilities and except as provided 10 in sections 43-512.06 and 70-101, personally identified private 11 citizen account payment information, credit information on others 12 supplied in confidence, and customer lists;

13 (11) Records or portions of records kept by a publicly 14 funded library which, when examined with or without other records, 15 reveal the identity of any library patron using the library's 16 materials or services;

17 (12) Correspondence, memoranda, and records of telephone 18 calls related to the performance of duties by a member of the 19 Legislature in whatever form. The lawful custodian of the

20 correspondence, memoranda, and records of telephone calls, upon 21 approval of the Executive Board of the Legislative Council, shall 22 release the correspondence, memoranda, and records of telephone calls 23 which are not designated as sensitive or confidential in nature to any 24 person performing an audit of the Legislature. A member's

25 correspondence, memoranda, and records of confidential telephone calls 26 related to the performance of his or her legislative duties shall only 27 be released to any other person with the explicit approval of the

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1 member;

2 (13) Records or portions of records kept by public bodies which would reveal the location, character, or ownership of any known 3 4 archaeological, historical, or paleontological site in Nebraska when 5 necessary to protect the site from a reasonably held fear of theft, 6 vandalism, or trespass. This section shall not apply to the release of 7 information for the purpose of scholarly research, examination by 8 other public bodies for the protection of the resource or by recognized tribes, the Unmarked Human Burial Sites and Skeletal 9 Remains Protection Act, or the federal Native American Graves 10 11 Protection and Repatriation Act;

12 (14) Records or portions of records kept by public bodies 13 which maintain collections of archaeological, historical, or 14 paleontological significance which reveal the names and addresses of 15 donors of such articles of archaeological, historical, or

paleontological significance unless the donor approves disclosure, except as the records or portions thereof may be needed to carry out the purposes of the Unmarked Human Burial Sites and Skeletal Remains Protection Act or the federal Native American Graves Protection and Repatriation Act;

(15) Job application materials submitted by applicants, other than finalists, who have applied for employment by any public body as defined in section 84-1409. For purposes of this subdivision, job application materials means employment applications, resumes, reference letters, and school transcripts, and finalist means any applicant who is offered and who accepts an interview by a public body or its agents, representatives, or consultants for any public

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employment position; and

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2 (16) Social security numbers; credit card, charge card, or 3 debit card numbers and expiration dates; and financial account numbers 4 supplied to state and local governments by citizens; and -5 (17) Records of a public entity when disclosure of such records could reasonably be expected to jeopardize the security, 6 7 health, safety, or property of the public served by such entities. Such records include, but are not limited to: (a) Vulnerability 8 assessments and information included within such vulnerability 9 assessments; (b) architectural, engineering, or construction 10 11 diagrams; (c) drawings, plans, or records pertaining to security 12 measures such as security and response plans, security codes and 13 combinations, passwords, passes, keys, or security or response 14 procedures; (d) emergency response protocols; and (e) records disclosing the configuration of critical systems or infrastructures 15 16 of a public airport, municipal corporation, municipal utility, or rural water district. 17 Sec. 2.
