A BILL

1 FOR AN ACT relating to postsecondary education; to amend section 85-1412, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2006; to 2 adopt the Access College Early Scholarship Program Act; to 3 4 eliminate the Community Scholarship Foundation Program Act; to harmonize provisions; to repeal the original section; and 5 to outright repeal sections 85-2001, 85-2002, 85-2003, 6 7 85-2004, 85-2005, 85-2006, 85-2007, 85-2008, 85-2009, and 8 85-2010, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2006. Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska, 9

Section 1. Section 85-1412, Revised Statutes Cumulative

Supplement, 2006, is amended to read:

3 85-1412. The commission shall have the following additional 4 powers and duties:

- (1) Conduct surveys and studies as may be necessary to undertake the coordination function of the commission pursuant to section 85-1403 and request information from governing boards and appropriate administrators of public institutions and other governmental agencies for research projects. All public institutions and governmental agencies receiving state funds shall comply with reasonable requests for information under this subdivision. Public institutions may comply with such requests pursuant to section 85-1417;
 - (2) Recommend to the Legislature and the Governor legislation it deems necessary or appropriate to improve postsecondary education in Nebraska and any other legislation it deems appropriate to change the role and mission provisions in sections 85-917 to 85-966.01;
 - (3) Establish any advisory committees as may be necessary to undertake the coordination function of the commission pursuant to section 85-1403 or to solicit input from affected parties such as students, faculty, governing boards, administrators of the public institutions, administrators of the private nonprofit institutions of postsecondary education and proprietary institutions in the state, and community and business leaders regarding the coordination function of the commission;
- (4) Participate in or designate an employee or employees to

participate in any committee which may be created to prepare a coordinated plan for the delivery of educational programs and services in Nebraska through the telecommunications system;

- (5) Seek a close liaison with the State Board of Education and the State Department of Education in recognition of the need for close coordination of activities between elementary and secondary education and postsecondary education;
- System or other information system or systems to provide the commission with timely, comprehensive, and meaningful information pertinent to the exercise of its duties. The information system shall be designed to provide comparable data on each public institution. The commission shall also administer the uniform information system prescribed in sections 85-1421 to 85-1427 known as the Nebraska Educational Data System. Public institutions shall supply the appropriate data for the information system or systems required by the commission;

 - (8) Accept and administer loans, grants, and programs from the federal or state government and from other sources, public and private, for carrying out any of its functions, including the administration of privately endowed scholarship programs. Such loans and grants shall not be expended for any other purposes than those for which the loans and grants were provided. The commission shall determine eligibility for such loans, grants, and programs, and such

loans and grants shall not be expended unless approved by the

- 3 (9) Consistent with section 85-1620, approve, in a timely
- 4 manner, new baccalaureate degree programs to be offered at private
- 5 postsecondary career schools as defined in section 85-1603. The
- 6 commission may charge a reasonable fee based on its administrative
- 7 costs for authorizations pursuant to this subdivision and section
- 8 85-1620. The commission shall report such action to the Commissioner
- 9 of Education;
- 10 (10) Pursuant to sections 85-1101 to 85-1104, authorize
- 11 out-of-state institutions of higher or postsecondary education to
- offer courses or degree programs in this state;
- 13 (11) Pursuant to sections 85-1105 to 85-1111, approve or
- disapprove petitions to establish new private colleges in this state;
- 15 (12) On or before December 1, 2000, and on or before
- 16 December 1 every two years thereafter, submit to the Legislature and
- 17 the Governor a report of its objectives and activities and any new
- 18 private colleges in Nebraska and the implementation of any

- 21 (13) Provide staff support for interstate compacts on

- 23 (14) Request inclusion of the commission in any existing
- grant review process and information system.
- 25 Sec. 2. <u>Sections 2 to 7 of this act shall be known and may</u>
- 26 be cited as the Access College Early Scholarship Program Act.

2	(1) Commission means the Coordinating Commission for
3	Postsecondary Education;
4	(2) Extreme hardship means any event including fire,
5	illness, accident, or job loss that has recently resulted in a
6	significant financial difficulty for a high school student and his or
7	her family;
8	(3) Postsecondary educational institution means a two-year
9	or four-year college or university in Nebraska which is a member
10	institution of an accrediting body recognized by the United States
11	Department of Education; and
12	(4) Resident means a person meeting the residency
13	requirements of section 85-502.
14	Sec. 4. The Access College Early Scholarship Program is
15	established. The purpose of the program is to provide financial
16	assistance to low-income high school students who are taking courses
17	for credit at a postsecondary educational institution while still
18	enrolled in high school. The program shall be administered by the
19	commission.
20	Sec. 5. (1) A high school student is eligible for the
21	Access College Early Scholarship Program if such student or a member
22	of his or her immediate family is eligible to receive:
23	(a) Supplemental Security Income;
24	(b) Food stamps;
25	(c) Free or reduced-price lunches under United States
26	Department of Agriculture child nutrition programs;
27	(d) Aid to families with dependent children; or

(e) Assistance under the Special Supplemental Nutrition 1 Program for Women, Infants, and Children; or 2 (2) The student or family member has experienced an extreme 3 hardship as defined in section 3 of this act. 4 5 Sec. 6. (1) An applicant for the Access College Early 6 Scholarship Program shall complete an application form provided by the 7 commission and attach a billing statement from the postsecondary 8 educational institution and shall forward the form and statement to his or her quidance counselor. The quidance counselor shall verify 9 the student's eligibility under the Access College Early Scholarship 10 11 Program Act and shall forward the information to the commission for 12 review. (2) The commission shall review the application and verify 13 14 the student's eligibility under the act. The scholarship award shall equal the tuition and fees accrued by the student from the 15 16 postsecondary educational institution. The commission shall forward 17 such amount directly to the postsecondary educational institution as payment of such student's tuition and fees. 18 (3) The commission shall make such payments in the order 19 the applications are received by the commission until funds are 20 inadequate to fulfill any remaining scholarships. 21 22 (4) There is no limit on the number of scholarships a student may receive under the act. 23 Sec. 7. The commission may adopt and promulgate rules and 24 25 regulations to carry out the Access College Early Scholarship Program 26 Act. 27 Sec. 8. Original section 85-1412, Revised Statutes
