A BILL

FOR AN ACT relating to teachers and administrators; to amend 2 section 79-807, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska; to 3 permit the creation of a special authorization; to specify 4 requirements; to prescribe duties; to harmonize provisions; 5 and to repeal the original section. 6

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Τ	Section 1. (1) The department may designate a special
2	authorization upon submission of a proposal by at least one teacher
3	education program of a standard institution of higher education. In
4	proposing the special authorization to the department, the teacher
5	education program shall present evidence of public interest in the
6	special authorization that may be less than the level needed to
7	warrant the development of a full endorsement. The special
8	authorization shall not be deemed, in whole or in part, a certificate
9	or permit. The special authorization shall constitute a separate
10	document signed by the commissioner.
11	(2) The special authorization described in subsection (1)
12	of this section shall include:
13	(a) Fifteen to eighteen credit hours designed to address a
14	content area for which there is no endorsement;
15	(b) A practicum and a methods course that are in addition
16	to the credit hours described in subdivision (a) of this subsection;
17	(c) Documented course credits that may be applied toward a
18	related endorsement; and
19	(d) Relevant course work taken at an institution of higher
20	education that is in addition to the credit hours described in
21	subdivision (a) of this subsection.
22	Sec. 2. Section 79-807, Reissue Revised Statutes of
23	Nebraska, is amended to read:
24	79-807. For purposes of sections 79-806 to 79-815 <u>and</u>
25	section 1 of this act, unless the context otherwise requires:
26	(1) Basic skills competency means either (a) proficiency in
27	(i) the written use of the English language, (ii) reading,

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comprehending, and interpreting professional writing and other written materials, and (iii) working with fundamental mathematical computations as demonstrated by successful completion of an examination designated by the board taken by teacher education students at a standard institution of higher education or (b) successful employment experiences;

- (2) Board means the State Board of Education;
- (3) Certificate means an authorization issued by the commissioner to an individual who meets the qualifications to engage in teaching, providing special services, or administering in prekindergarten through grade twelve in the elementary and secondary schools in this state;
 - (4) Commissioner means the Commissioner of Education;
- (5) Department means the State Department of Education;
 - (6) Human relations training means course work or employment experiences that lead to (a) an awareness and understanding of the values, lifestyles, contributions, and history of a pluralistic society, (b) the ability to recognize and deal with dehumanizing biases, including, but not limited to, sexism, racism, prejudice, and discrimination, and an awareness of the impact such biases have on interpersonal relations, (c) the ability to translate knowledge of human relations into attitudes, skills, and techniques which result in favorable experiences for students, (d) the ability to recognize the ways in which dehumanizing biases may be reflected in instructional materials, (e) respect for human dignity and individual rights, and (f) the ability to relate effectively to other individuals and to groups in a pluralistic society other than the applicant's own;

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Special education training means course employment experiences that provide an individual with the knowledge of (a) the exceptional needs of the disabilities defined under the Special Education Act, (b) the major characteristics of disability in order to recognize its existence in children, (c) the various alternatives for providing the least restrictive environment for children with disabilities, (d) methods of teaching children with disabilities in the regular classroom, and (e) prereferral alternatives, referral systems, multidisciplinary responsibilities, the individualized education plan process, and the 10 11 placement process;

- (8) Special services means supportive services provided to students that do not primarily involve teaching, including, but not limited to, (a) audiology, psychology, and physical or occupational therapy, (b) the coaching of extracurricular activities, and (c) subject areas for which endorsement programs are not offered by a standard institution of higher education; and
- Standard institution of higher education means any 18 (9) college or university, the teacher education programs of which are 19 fully approved by the board or approved in another state pursuant to 20 standards which are comparable and equivalent to those set by the 21 22 board.
