A BILL

1 FOR AN ACT relating to counties; to authorize counties to enact

ordinances as prescribed; and to provide powers and duties.

3 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

LB 212

Section 1. (1) A county may make all such ordinances and resolutions not inconsistent with the general laws of the state as may be necessary or expedient, in addition to the special powers otherwise granted by law, to address control of dogs and cats, to address sidewalk obstructions, and to address towing. A county may impose fines, forfeitures, and penalties and provide for the recovery, collection, and enforcement of such fines, forfeitures, or penalties, and, in default of payment, provide for confinement in the county jail as may be provided by ordinance.

10 (2) Ordinances adopted by counties may not be imposed

11 within the boundaries of incorporated municipalities.

shall cause notice of the proposed ordinance to be published once a week for three consecutive weeks in a newspaper of general circulation in the county. Final action shall not be taken on the ordinance by the county board until after at least one public hearing has been held thereon by the board. The county board shall arrange for and hold such hearing. A copy of the proposed ordinance shall be available at the office of the county clerk for public inspection.

Ordinances passed by counties shall be published in book or pamphlet form and shall be available at the office of the county clerk.
