A BILL

FOR AN ACT relating to all-terrain vehicles; to amend section

60-6,356, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska; to provide

for operation of all-terrain vehicles on highways as

prescribed; and to repeal the original section.

Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

Section 1. Section 60-6,356, Reissue Revised Statutes of 1 Nebraska, is amended to read: 2 60-6,356. (1) Except as provided in subsections (2) through 3 4 (5) of this section, an An all-terrain vehicle shall not operated on any highway of this state. The controlled-access 5 6 highway, and the crossing of any controlled-access highway shall not 7 be permitted. 8 (2) The crossing of a highway shall be permitted only if: 9 (a) The crossing is made at an angle of approximately 10 ninety degrees to the direction of the highway and at a place where no 11 obstruction prevents a quick and safe crossing; 12 (b) The vehicle is brought to a complete stop before 13 crossing the shoulder or roadway of the highway; 14 (c) The operator yields the right-of-way to all oncoming traffic that constitutes an immediate potential hazard; 15 16 (d) In crossing a divided highway, the crossing is made 17 only at an intersection of such highway with another highway; and (e) Both the headlight and taillight of the vehicle are on 18 19 when the crossing is made. 20 (3) (2) An all-terrain vehicle may be operated on a highway, other than a controlled-access highway, when such operation 21 22 occurs only between the hours of sunrise and sunset.and such operation is incidental to the vehicle's use for agricultural 23 24 purposes. Any person operating an all-terrain vehicle on 25 highway, other than a controlled-access highway, shall have valid Class O operator's license or a farm permit as provided in 26 27 section 60-4,126 and shall not operate such vehicle at a speed in

thirty miles per hour. When operated operating an 1 all-terrain vehicle on a highway, other than a controlled-access 2 highway, the headlight and taillight of the vehicle shall be on and 3 the vehicle shall be equipped with a bicycle safety flag which 4 5 extends not less than five feet above ground attached to the rear of 6 such vehicle. The bicycle safety flag shall be triangular in shape 7 with an area of not less than thirty square inches and shall be 8 day-glow in color. 9 (4) (3) All-terrain vehicles may be operated without complying with subsection (2) of this section on highways in parades 10 11 which have been authorized by the State of Nebraska or 12 department, board, commission, or political subdivision of the state. 13 The crossing of a highway, other than a 14 controlled-access highway, shall be permitted by an all-terrain vehicle without complying with subsection (2) of this section only 15 16 <u>if:</u> (a) The crossing is made at an angle of approximately 17 ninety degrees to the direction of the highway and at a place where no 18 obstruction prevents a quick and safe crossing; 19 20 (b) The vehicle is brought to a complete stop before crossing the shoulder or roadway of the highway; 21 22 (c) The operator yields the right-of-way to all oncoming traffic that constitutes an immediate potential hazard; 23 24 (d) In crossing a divided highway, the crossing is made only at an intersection of such highway with another highway; and 25 (e) Both the headlight and taillight of the vehicle are on 26

when the crossing is made.

other than controlled-access highways, outside the corporate limits of any municipality by electric utility personnel within the course of their employment in accordance with the operation requirements of subsection (3) (2) of this section, except that the operation of the vehicle pursuant to this subsection need not be incidental to the use of the vehicle for agricultural purposes. limited to the hours between sunrise and sunset.
