1	FOR AN ACT relating to the Game Law; to amend sections 37-406,
2	37-414, 37-449, 37-4,111, 37-527, 37-548, 37-803, 37-811,
3	and 77-27,119.01, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska,
4	and sections 37-407, 37-426, 37-427, 37-431, 37-447,
5	37-450, 37-452, and 37-457, Revised Statutes Cumulative
6	Supplement, 2006; to change provisions relating to
7	licenses, permits, stamps, and fees; to provide for a
8	lifetime Nebraska migratory waterfowl stamp; to change
9	and eliminate provisions relating to hunting wild turkey;
10	to rename a fund; to harmonize provisions; and to repeal
11	the original sections.

12 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

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Section 1. Section 37-406, Reissue Revised Statutes of
 Nebraska, is amended to read:

3 37-406 (1) Licenses, permits, and stamps required under the Game Law shall be issued by the commission and may be procured 4 5 from the secretary of the commission. The commission may provide for the electronic issuance of any license, permit, or stamp 6 7 required under the Game Law and may enter into contracts to procure 8 necessary services and supplies for the electronic issuance of 9 licenses, permits, and stamps. Except for permits issued under 10 sections 37-462 and 37-463, the commission may provide for the 11 issuance of any license, permit, or stamp required under the Game 12 Law in the form of a number which identifies the holder in the 13 records of the commission. The commission may designate itself 14 and other persons, firms, and corporations as agents to issue 15 licenses, permits, and stamps and collect the prescribed fees. Any 16 The commission and any person, firm, or corporation, $\frac{1}{2}$ other than 17 the secretary of the commission or an employee of the commission, 18 authorized by the commission to issue licenses, permits, and stamps 19 shall be entitled to collect and retain an additional fee of not 20 less than fifty cents and not more than one dollar, as established 21 by the commission pursuant to section 37-327, two dollars, for each 22 license, permit, or stamp issued as reimbursement for the clerical work of issuing the license, permit, or stamp and collecting and 23 24 remitting the fees.

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(2) The commission shall adopt and promulgate rules and

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regulations regarding electronic issuance of licenses, permits, and stamps, including electronic issuance devices, deposits by agents, and remittance of fees. The commission may provide for the electronic issuance of a license, permit, or stamp by acknowledging the purchase of such license, permit, or stamp without requiring a physical license, permit, or stamp or facsimile of such.

7 (3) It shall be unlawful for any person to duplicate 8 any electronically issued license, permit, or stamp. Any person 9 violating this subsection shall be guilty of a Class III 10 misdemeanor and shall be fined at least seventy-five dollars, and 11 any license, permit, or stamp involved in such violation shall be 12 confiscated by the court.

Sec. 2. Section 37-407, Revised Statutes Cumulative
Supplement, 2006, is amended to read:

15 37-407 The commission may offer multiple-year permits or 16 combinations of permits at reduced rates and may establish fees pursuant to section 37-327 to be paid to the state for resident 17 18 and nonresident hunting permits, annual fishing permits, three-day 19 fishing permits, one-day fishing permits, combination hunting and 20 fishing permits, fur-harvesting permits, and nonresident special 21 two-day hunting permits issued for periods of two consecutive days 22 between the fourth Wednesday in November and December 31 of the 23 same calendar year and limited to one special two-day permit per 24 applicant per year, as follows:

25 (1) Resident fees shall be (a) not less than eleven

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dollars and not more than thirteen dollars for hunting, (b) not 1 2 less than fifteen dollars and not more than seventeen dollars and 3 fifty cents for fishing, (c) not less than ten dollars and not more than eleven dollars and fifty cents for a three-day fishing permit, 4 5 (d) not less than five dollars and not more than eight dollars for 6 a one-day fishing permit, (e) not less than twenty-five dollars and 7 not more than twenty-nine dollars for both fishing and hunting, and 8 (f) not less than fifteen dollars and not more than twenty dollars 9 for fur harvesting; and

10 (2) Nonresident fees shall be (a) not less than resident fees and not more than two hundred sixty dollars for a period of 11 12 time specified by the commission for fur harvesting one thousand 13 or less fur-bearing animals and not less than fifteen dollars 14 additional and not more than seventeen dollars and fifty cents 15 additional for each one hundred or part of one hundred fur-bearing animals harvested, (b)(i) for persons sixteen years of age and 16 17 older, not less than sixty-seven dollars and not more than eighty 18 dollars for hunting and (ii) for persons under sixteen years of 19 age, not less than the fee required pursuant to subdivision (1)(a) 20 of this section for hunting, (c) not less than twenty-five dollars 21 and not more than thirty-five dollars for a special two-day hunting 22 permit plus the cost of a habitat stamp, (d) not less than six 23 dollars and not more than nine dollars for a one-day fishing 24 permit, (e) not less than fourteen dollars and not more than 25 sixteen dollars and fifty cents for a three-day fishing permit,

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and (f) not less than forty dollars and not more than forty-nine
 dollars and fifty cents for an annual fishing permit.

3 Sec. 3. Section 37-414, Reissue Revised Statutes of
4 Nebraska, is amended to read:

5 37-414 (1) The commission shall establish and administer a bow hunter education program consisting of a minimum of (a) 6 7 ten hours of classroom instruction or (b) independent study on 8 the part of the student sufficient to pass an examination given 9 by the commission followed by such student's participation in a 10 minimum of four hours of practical instruction. The program shall 11 provide instruction in the safe use of bow hunting equipment, the 12 fundamentals of bow hunting, shooting and hunting techniques, game 13 identification, conservation management, and hunter ethics. When 14 establishing such a program, the commission shall train volunteers 15 as bow hunter education training instructors. The commission shall 16 issue a certificate of successful completion to any person who 17 satisfactorily completes a bow hunter education program established 18 by the commission and shall print, purchase, or otherwise acquire materials necessary for effective program operation. The commission 19 20 shall adopt and promulgate rules and regulations for carrying out 21 and administering such program.

(2) A person born on or after January 1, 1977, who is
hunting antelope, deer, elk, <u>or mountain sheep</u>, or wild turkey with
a bow and arrow pursuant to any provision of sections 37-447 to
37-453 and <u>37-457</u> shall have on his or her person a bow hunter

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education certificate of successful completion issued by his or her state or province of residence or a bow hunter education certificate issued by an accredited program recognized by the commission.

5 Sec. 4. Section 37-426, Revised Statutes Cumulative
6 Supplement, 2006, is amended to read:

7 37-426 (1) Except as provided in subsection (4) of this
8 section:

9 (a) No resident of Nebraska sixteen years of age or 10 older and no nonresident of Nebraska regardless of age shall 11 hunt, harvest, or possess any game bird, upland game bird, game 12 animal, or fur-bearing animal unless, at the time of such hunting, 13 harvesting, or possessing, such person has an unexpired habitat 14 stamp as prescribed by the rules and regulations of the commission 15 prior to the time of hunting, harvesting, or possessing such bird 16 or animal;

17 (b) No resident or nonresident of Nebraska shall take or 18 possess any aquatic organism requiring a Nebraska fishing permit, 19 including any fish, bullfrog, snapping turtle, tiger salamander, 20 or mussel, unless, at the time of such taking or possessing, such 21 person has an unexpired aquatic habitat stamp as prescribed by the 22 rules and regulations of the commission prior to the time of taking 23 or possessing a fish, bullfrog, snapping turtle, tiger salamander, or mussel; and 24

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(c) No resident of Nebraska sixteen years of age or

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older and no nonresident of Nebraska regardless of age shall hunt, harvest, or possess any migratory waterfowl unless, at the time of such hunting, harvesting, or possessing, such person has an unexpired Nebraska migratory waterfowl stamp as prescribed by the rules and regulations of the commission prior to the time of hunting, harvesting, or possessing such migratory waterfowl.

7 (2) (2) (a) The commission may issue a lifetime habitat 8 stamp upon application and payment of the appropriate fee. The fee 9 for a lifetime habitat stamp shall be twenty times the fee required 10 in subsection (5) of this section for an annual habitat stamps. 11 stamp. Payment of such fee shall be made in a lump sum at the time 12 of application. A replacement lifetime habitat stamp may be issued 13 if the original is lost or destroyed. The fee for a replacement 14 shall be not less than one dollar and fifty cents and not more than 15 five dollars, as established by the commission.

16 (b) The commission may issue a lifetime Nebraska 17 migratory waterfowl stamp upon application and payment of the 18 appropriate fee. The fee for a lifetime Nebraska migratory waterfowl stamp shall be twenty times the fee required in 19 20 subsection (5) of this section for an annual Nebraska migratory 21 waterfowl stamp. Payment of such fee shall be made in a lump sum at 22 the time of application. A replacement Nebraska lifetime migratory 23 waterfowl stamp may be issued if the original is lost or destroyed. 24 The fee for a replacement shall be not less than one dollar and 25 fifty cents and not more than five dollars, as established by the

1 <u>commission</u>.

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2 (3) The commission may issue a lifetime aquatic habitat 3 stamp upon application and payment of the appropriate fee. The fee for a lifetime aquatic habitat stamp shall be not less than 4 5 seventy-five dollars and not more than one hundred twenty-five 6 dollars as established by the commission pursuant to section 7 37-327. Payment of such fee shall be made in a lump sum at the time 8 of application. A lifetime aquatic habitat stamp shall not be made 9 invalid by reason of the holder subsequently residing outside the 10 state. A replacement lifetime aquatic habitat stamp may be issued 11 if the original is lost or destroyed. The fee for a replacement 12 shall not be less than one dollar and fifty cents and not more than 13 five dollars, as established by the commission.

(4) Habitat stamps are not required for holders of 14 15 limited permits issued under section 37-455. Aquatic habitat stamps 16 are not required (a) when a fishing permit is not required, (b) for holders of permits pursuant to section 37-424, or (c) 17 18 for holders of lifetime fishing permits or lifetime combination 19 hunting and fishing permits purchased prior to January 1, 2006. 20 Nebraska migratory waterfowl stamps are not required for hunting, 21 harvesting, or possessing any species other than ducks, geese, or 22 brant. For purposes of this section, a showing of proof of the 23 electronic issuance of a stamp by the commission shall fulfill the 24 requirements of this section.

(5) Any person to whom a stamp has been issued shall,

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immediately upon request, exhibit evidence of issuance of the 1 2 stamp to any officer. Any person hunting, fishing, harvesting, 3 or possessing any game bird, upland game bird, game animal, or fur-bearing animal or any aquatic organism requiring a fishing 4 5 permit in this state without evidence of issuance of the appropriate stamp shall be deemed to be without such stamp. A 6 7 habitat stamp shall be issued upon the payment of a fee of not 8 less than thirteen dollars and not more than sixteen dollars per 9 stamp. An aquatic habitat stamp shall be issued in conjunction 10 with each fishing permit for a fee of not less than five dollars 11 and not more than seven dollars and fifty cents per stamp for 12 annual fishing permits, three-day fishing permits, or combination 13 hunting and fishing permits and a fee of not less than seventy-five 14 dollars and not more than one hundred dollars for lifetime fishing 15 or combination hunting and fishing permits. The fee established 16 under section 37-407 for a one-day fishing permit shall include an 17 aquatic habitat stamp. One dollar from the sale of each one-day 18 fishing permit shall be remitted to the State Treasurer for 19 credit to the Nebraska Aquatic Habitat Fund. A Nebraska migratory 20 waterfowl stamp shall be issued upon the payment of a fee of not 21 less than five dollars and not more than ten dollars per stamp. The 22 commission shall establish the fees pursuant to section 37-327. 23 Sec. 5. Section 37-427, Revised Statutes Cumulative 24 Supplement, 2006, is amended to read:

25 37-427 The habitat stamp, aquatic habitat stamp, or

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Nebraska migratory waterfowl stamp required by section 37-426 is
 not transferable and, except for the lifetime habitat stamp, the
 lifetime aquatic habitat stamp, the lifetime Nebraska migratory
 waterfowl stamp, and a habitat stamp purchased for a permit which
 is valid into the next calendar year, expires at midnight on
 December 31 in the year for which the stamp is issued.

Sec. 6. Section 37-431, Revised Statutes Cumulative
Supplement, 2006, is amended to read:

9 37-431 (1)(a) The Nebraska Habitat Fund is created. 10 The commission shall remit fees received for habitat stamps and 11 Nebraska migratory waterfowl stamps to the State Treasurer for 12 credit to the Nebraska Habitat Fund. Any money in the fund 13 available for investment shall be invested by the state investment 14 officer pursuant to the Nebraska Capital Expansion Act and the 15 Nebraska State Funds Investment Act. No expenditure shall be made 16 from the Nebraska Habitat Fund until the commission has presented a 17 habitat plan to the Committee on Appropriations of the Legislature 18 for its approval.

19 (b) Fees received for lifetime habitat stamps <u>and</u> 20 <u>lifetime Nebraska migratory waterfowl stamps</u> shall be credited to 21 the Nebraska Habitat Fund and shall not be expended but may be 22 invested by the state investment officer pursuant to the Nebraska 23 Capital Expansion Act and the Nebraska State Funds Investment Act. 24 Income from such investments may be expended by the commission 25 pursuant to section 37-432.

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1 (2) (a) The Nebraska Aquatic Habitat Fund is created. The 2 commission shall remit fees received for aquatic habitat stamps and 3 one dollar of the one-day fishing permit fee as provided in section 37-426 to the State Treasurer for credit to the Nebraska Aquatic 4 5 Habitat Fund. Any money in the fund available for investment shall be invested by the state investment officer pursuant to 6 the Nebraska Capital Expansion Act and the Nebraska State Funds 7 8 Investment Act. No expenditure shall be made from the Nebraska 9 Aquatic Habitat Fund until the commission has presented a habitat 10 plan to the Committee on Appropriations and the Committee on 11 Natural Resources of the Legislature for their approval.

(b) Fees received for lifetime aquatic habitat stamps shall be credited to the Nebraska Aquatic Habitat Fund and shall not be expended but may be invested by the state investment officer pursuant to the Nebraska Capital Expansion Act and the Nebraska State Funds Investment Act. Income from such investments may be expended by the commission pursuant to section 37-432.

18 (3) The secretary of the commission and any county clerk 19 or public official designated to sell habitat stamps, aquatic 20 habitat stamps, or Nebraska migratory waterfowl stamps shall be 21 liable upon their official bonds or equivalent commercial insurance 22 policy for failure to remit the money from the sale of the stamps, as required by sections 37-426 to 37-433, coming into their hands. 23 24 Any agent who receives stamp fees and who fails to remit the 25 fees to the commission within a reasonable time after demand by

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the commission shall be liable to the commission in damages for double the amount of the funds wrongfully withheld. Any agent who purposefully fails to remit such fees with the intention of converting them is guilty of theft. The penalty for such violation shall be determined by the amount converted as specified in section 28-518.

Sec. 7. Section 37-447, Revised Statutes Cumulative
Supplement, 2006, is amended to read:

9 37-447 (1) The commission may issue permits for the 10 hunting of deer and prescribe and establish regulations and 11 limitations for the hunting, transportation, and possession 12 of deer. The commission may offer multiple-year permits or 13 combinations of permits at reduced rates. The commission 14 may specify by regulation the information to be required on 15 applications for such permits. Regulations and limitations for the 16 hunting, transportation, and possession of deer may include, but not be limited to, regulations and limitations as to the type, 17 18 caliber, and other specifications of firearms and ammunition used 19 and specifications for bows and arrows used. Such regulations and 20 limitations may further specify and limit the method of hunting 21 deer and may provide for dividing the state into management units 22 or areas, and the commission may enact different deer hunting 23 regulations for the different management units pertaining to sex, 24 species, and age of the deer hunted.

25 (2) The number of such permits may be limited as provided

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by the rules and regulations of the commission, and except as 1 2 provided in section 37-454, the permits shall be disposed of in 3 an impartial manner. Whenever the commission deems it advisable to limit the number of permits issued for any or all management units, 4 5 the commission shall, by rules and regulations, determine who shall be eligible to obtain such permits. In establishing eligibility, 6 7 the commission may give preference to persons who did not receive a 8 permit during the previous year or years.

9 (3) Such permits may be issued to allow deer hunting in 10 the Nebraska National Forest and other game reserves and such other 11 areas as the commission may designate whenever the commission deems 12 that permitting such hunting will not be detrimental to the proper 13 preservation of wildlife in Nebraska in such forest, reserves, or 14 areas.

(4) The commission shall, pursuant to section 37-327, establish and charge a fee of not more than twenty-nine dollars for residents and not more than two hundred fourteen dollars for nonresidents for each permit issued under this section, except that the fee for a statewide buck-only permit shall be two and one-half times the amount of a regular deer permit.

(5) The commission may issue nonresident permits after preference has been given for the issuance of resident permits as provided in rules and regulations adopted and promulgated by the commission. The commission may require a predetermined application period for permit applications in specified management units. Such

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permits shall be issued after a reasonable period for making 1 2 application, as established by the commission, has expired. When 3 more valid applications are received for a designated management unit than there are permits available, such permits shall be 4 5 allocated on the basis of a random drawing. All valid applications received during the predetermined application period shall be 6 7 considered equally in any such random drawing without regard to 8 time of receipt of such applications by the commission.

9 Sec. 8. Section 37-449, Reissue Revised Statutes of
10 Nebraska, is amended to read:

11 37-449 The commission may issue permits for hunting 12 antelope and may establish separate and, when necessary, different 13 regulations therefor within the limitations prescribed in sections 14 37-447 and 37-452 for hunting deer. The commission may offer 15 multiple-year permits or combinations of permits at reduced rates. 16 The commission may, pursuant to section 37-327, establish and 17 charge a nonrefundable application fee of not less than five 18 dollars and not more than seven dollars. The commission shall, pursuant to section 37-327, establish and charge a fee of not 19 20 less than twenty-five dollars and not more than twenty-nine dollars 21 for residents and not less than one hundred thirty dollars and 22 not more than one hundred forty-nine dollars and fifty cents 23 for nonresidents for each permit issued under this section. The 24 provisions for the distribution of deer permits and the authority 25 of the commission to determine eligibility of applicants for

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permits as described in sections 37-447 and 37-452 shall also apply
 to the distribution of antelope permits.

3 Sec. 9. Section 37-450, Revised Statutes Cumulative
4 Supplement, 2006, is amended to read:

5 37-450 The commission may issue permits for hunting elk and may establish separate and, when necessary, different 6 7 regulations therefor within the limitations prescribed in sections 8 37-447 and 37-452 for hunting deer. Permits to hunt elk issued 9 pursuant to this section shall not be issued to nonresidents. The 10 commission shall, pursuant to section 37-327, establish and charge 11 a nonrefundable application fee of not less than seven dollars 12 and not more than eight dollars and fifty cents and a fee of 13 not less than one hundred thirty dollars and not more than one hundred forty-nine dollars and fifty cents for each elk permit 14 15 issued. A person may obtain only one antlered-elk permit in his or 16 her lifetime except for a limited permit to hunt elk pursuant to 17 section 37-455. The provisions for the distribution of deer permits 18 and the authority of the commission to determine eligibility of 19 applicants for permits as described in sections 37-447 and 37-452 20 shall also apply to the distribution of elk permits.

Sec. 10. Section 37-452, Revised Statutes Cumulative
Supplement, 2006, is amended to read:

37-452 No person shall be issued a permit to hunt deer,
antelope, elk, wild turkey, or mountain sheep unless such person
is at least twelve years of age, except that any person who is

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twelve through fifteen years of age shall only hunt deer, antelope,
 elk, wild turkey, or mountain sheep when accompanied by a person
 twenty-one years of age or over having a valid hunting permit.

Sec. 11. Section 37-457, Revised Statutes Cumulative
Supplement, 2006, is amended to read:

6 37-457 (1) The commission may issue permits for hunting 7 wild turkey and prescribe and establish regulations and limitations 8 for the hunting, transportation, and possession of wild turkey. 9 The commission may offer multiple-year permits or combinations of 10 permits at reduced rates. The number of such permits may be limited 11 as provided by the regulations of the commission, but the permits 12 shall be disposed of in an impartial manner. Such permits may be 13 issued to allow wild turkey hunting in the Nebraska National Forest 14 and other game reserves and such other areas as the commission 15 may designate whenever the commission deems that permitting such 16 hunting would not be detrimental to the proper preservation of wildlife in such forest, reserves, or areas. 17

(2) The commission shall, pursuant to section 37-327,
establish and charge a fee of not less than twenty dollars and
not more than twenty-three dollars for residents and not less
than eighty-five dollars and not more than ninety-five dollars for
nonresidents for each permit issued under this section.

(3) The commission may issue nonresident permits after
preference has been given for the issuance of resident permits as
provided in rules and regulations adopted and promulgated by the

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commission. The commission may require a predetermined application
 period for permit applications in specified management units.

3 (4) The provisions of section 37-447 for the distribution 4 of deer permits also shall <u>may</u> apply to the distribution of wild 5 turkey permits. No permit to hunt wild turkey shall be issued 6 without payment of the fee required by this section.

7 Sec. 12. Section 37-4,111, Reissue Revised Statutes of
8 Nebraska, is amended to read:

9 37-4,111 The commission may adopt and promulgate rules 10 and regulations to permit provide for the issuance of permits for 11 the taking of paddlefish. The commission may, pursuant to section 12 37-327, establish and charge a nonrefundable application fee of not 13 less than five dollars and not more than ten dollars. Permits, as 14 authorized by the commission, shall be awarded by random drawing to 15 eligible applicants. No permit fee shall be charged in addition to 16 the nonrefundable application fee. fee of not more than thirty-five dollars. All fees collected under this subsection shall be remitted 17

18 to the State Treasurer for credit to the State Game Fund.

Sec. 13. Section 37-527, Reissue Revised Statutes of
Nebraska, is amended to read:

21 37-527 (1) For purposes of this section, hunter orange 22 means a daylight fluorescent orange color with a dominant wave 23 length between five hundred ninety-five and six hundred five 24 nanometers, an excitation purity of not less than eighty-five 25 percent, and a luminance factor of not less than forty percent.

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1 (2) Any person hunting deer, antelope, wild turkey, elk, 2 or mountain sheep during an authorized firearm season in this state 3 shall display on his or her head, chest, and back a total of not less than four hundred square inches of hunter orange material 4 5 except as exempted by rules and regulations of the commission. 6 (3) Any person who violates this section shall be quilty 7 of a Class V misdemeanor. 8 (4) This section shall not apply to archery hunters 9 hunting during a non-center-fire firearm season or in a management 10 unit where a current center-fire firearm season is not open. The 11 commission may adopt and promulgate rules and regulations allowing 12 additional exceptions. 13 Sec. 14. Section 37-548, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is amended to read: 14 15 37-548 (1) It shall be unlawful for any person to import 16 into the state or release to the wild any live wildlife including 17 the viable gametes, eggs or sperm, except those which are approved 18 by rules and regulations of the commission or as otherwise provided 19 in the Game Law. It shall be unlawful to commercially exploit or 20 export from the state any dead or live wildlife taken from the wild 21 except those which are exempted by rules and regulations of the 22 commission. Any person violating this subsection shall be guilty of 23 a Class III misdemeanor.

24 (2) The commission shall adopt and promulgate rules25 and regulations to carry out subsection (1) of this section.

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In adopting such rules and regulations, the commission shall 1 be governed by the Administrative Procedure Act. Such rules and 2 3 regulations shall include a listing of (a) the wildlife which may be released or imported into the state and (b) the wildlife taken 4 5 from the wild which may be commercially exploited or exported from 6 the state. The rules and regulations for release, importation, commercial exploitation, and exportation of species other than 7 8 commercial fish and bait fish shall include, but not be limited to, 9 requirements for annual permits for release or importation or for 10 commercial exploitation or exportation, permit fees, the number of 11 individual animals of a particular species that may be released, 12 imported, collected, or exported under a permit, and the manner 13 and location of release or collection of a particular species. 14 The rules and regulations may be amended, modified, or repealed 15 from time to time, based upon investigation and the best available 16 scientific, commercial, or other reliable data.

17 (3) The commission shall establish permit fees as 18 required by subsection (2) of this section to cover the cost of 19 permit processing and enforcement of the permits and research into 20 and management of the ecological effects of release, importation, 21 commercial exploitation, and exportation. The commission shall 22 remit the fees to the State Treasurer for credit to the Nongame and 23 Endangered Species Wildlife Conservation Fund.

24 (4) The commission may determine that the release,25 importation, commercial exploitation, or exportation of wildlife

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causes economic or ecologic harm by utilizing the best available
 scientific, commercial, and other reliable data after consultation,

5 (5) The commission shall, upon its own recommendation or upon the petition of any person who presents to the commission 6 7 substantial evidence as to whether such additional species will or 8 will not cause ecologic or economic harm, conduct a review of any 9 listed or unlisted species proposed to be removed from or added to 10 the list published pursuant to subdivision (2) (a) of this section. 11 The review shall be conducted pursuant to subsection (4) of this 12 section.

13 (6) The commission shall, upon its own recommendation or 14 upon the petition of any person who presents to the commission 15 substantial evidence that commercial exploitation or exportation 16 will cause ecologic or economic harm or significant impact to a 17 wildlife population, conduct a review of any listed or unlisted species proposed to be added to or removed from the list published 18 19 pursuant to subdivision (2) (b) of this section. The review shall be 20 conducted pursuant to subsection (4) of this section.

23 37-803 The Legislature finds and declares:

(1) That it is the policy of this state to conservespecies of wildlife for human enjoyment, for scientific purposes,

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1 and to insure their perpetuation as viable components of their 2 ecosystems;

3 (2) That species of wildlife and wild plants normally 4 occurring within this state which may be found to be threatened or 5 endangered within this state shall be accorded such protection as 6 is necessary to maintain and enhance their numbers;

7 (3) That this state shall assist in the protection of 8 species of wildlife and wild plants which are determined to be 9 threatened or endangered elsewhere pursuant to the Endangered 10 Species Act by prohibiting the taking, possession, transportation, 11 exportation from this state, processing, sale or offer for sale, 12 or shipment within this state of such endangered species and by 13 carefully regulating such activities with regard to such threatened species. Exceptions to such prohibitions, for the purpose of 14 15 enhancing the conservation of such species, may be permitted as set 16 forth in the Nongame and Endangered Species Conservation Act; and

17 (4) That any funding for the conservation of nongame,
18 threatened, and endangered species shall be made available to
19 the commission from General Fund appropriations, the Nongame and
20 Endangered Species Wildlife Conservation Fund, or other sources of
21 revenue not deposited in the State Game Fund.

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to assist in carrying out the Nongame and Endangered Species 1 2 Conservation Act, to pay for research into and management of 3 the ecological effects of the release, importation, commercial exploitation, and exportation of wildlife species pursuant to 4 5 section 37-548, and to pay any expenses incurred by the Department of Revenue or any other agency in the administration of the 6 income tax designation program required by section 77-27,119.01. 7 8 Money shall be transferred into such fund from the General Fund 9 by the State Treasurer in an amount to be determined by the 10 Tax Commissioner which shall be equal to the total amount of 11 contributions designated pursuant to section 77-27,119.01. Any 12 money in the Nongame and Endangered Species Wildlife Conservation 13 Fund available for investment shall be invested by the state 14 investment officer pursuant to the Nebraska Capital Expansion Act 15 and the Nebraska State Funds Investment Act. Money remaining in the 16 Nongame and Endangered Species Conservation Fund on the effective 17 date of this act shall be transferred to the Wildlife Conservation 18 Fund on such date.
