A BILL

- 1 FOR AN ACT relating to foster care placements; to provide rights
- 2 for foster parents; and to provide powers and duties for
- 3 the Department of Health and Human Services.
- 4 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1 Section 1. (1) The Department of Health and Human

- 2 Services shall extend the following rights to foster parents
- 3 with respect to the placement of any foster child with a foster
- 4 parent if the placement is contracted directly with the department
- 5 or through an agency which contracts with the department to place
- 6 <u>children in foster care:</u>
- 7 (a) The right to be treated with dignity, respect, trust,
- 8 value, and consideration as a primary provider of foster care and a
- 9 member of the professional team caring for foster children;
- 10 (b) The right to provide input to the department for
- 11 purposes of identifying the types of resources and services that
- 12 would meet the needs of children in their care and of their
- 13 families and advocate for the same without threat of reprisal;
- 14 (c) The right to training and support for the purpose of
- 15 improving skills in providing daily care and meeting the needs of
- 16 <u>the children in foster care;</u>
- 17 (d) The right to communicate with professionals who work
- 18 with a foster child, including, but not limited to, therapists,
- 19 physicians, and teachers who work directly with the child;
- 20 (e) When appropriate, the right to communicate with
- 21 the child's birth family, other foster parents of the child,
- 22 and prospective and finalized adoptive parents of the child
- 23 with individualized case plan approval and without the threat
- 24 of reprisal;
- 25 (f) The right to necessary information on an ongoing

1 basis which is relevant to the care of the child, including timely

- 2 information on changes in the case plan or termination of the
- 3 placement and reasons for the changes of termination of placement
- 4 to the foster parent except in instances of immediate response of
- 5 <u>child protective services;</u>
- 6 (g) The right to be considered, when appropriate, as a
- 7 preferential placement option when a child who was formerly placed
- 8 with the foster parents has reentered the foster care system;
- 9 (h) The right to receive, prior to a child being placed
- 10 in the foster home, information relating to the child's behavior,
- 11 family background, or health history that may jeopardize the health
- 12 or safety of any member of the foster family's household, including
- 13 other foster children, and similar information that may affect the
- 14 manner in which foster care services are provided. In an emergency
- 15 situation, the department shall provide information as soon as it
- 16 is available; and
- 17 <u>(i) The right to accept or refuse placement within their</u>
- 18 home or to request, upon reasonable notice to the department, the
- 19 removal of a child from their home for good cause without threat of
- 20 reprisal for acting on such good cause.
- 21 (2) The department shall encourage the development of
- 22 a working relationship between a foster family and the child's
- 23 family. The foster family shall cooperate with the department
- 24 and act appropriately to develop a positive relationship with the
- 25 child's family. The department and the foster family shall act in

1 the best interest of the child in foster care in developing and

- 2 encouraging a working relationship with the child's family.
- 3 (3) The department shall permit the foster parent or
- 4 parents a period of respite during which they are free from
- 5 placement of foster children in the family home.
