1 Section 1. Section 71-104.01, Revised Statutes Cumulative

- 2 Supplement, 2006, is amended to read:
- 3 71-104.01 (1) An applicant for an initial license to
- 4 practice a profession which is authorized to prescribe controlled
- 5 substances shall be subject to a criminal background check. The
- 6 Except as provided in subsection (3) of this section, the applicant
- 7 shall submit with the application a full set of fingerprints which
- 8 shall be forwarded to the Nebraska State Patrol to be submitted to
- 9 the Federal Bureau of Investigation for a national criminal history
- 10 record information check. The applicant shall authorize release of
- 11 the results of the national criminal history record information
- 12 check to the department. The applicant shall pay the actual cost of
- 13 the fingerprinting and criminal background check.
- 14 (2) This section shall not apply to dentists who are
- 15 applicants for temporary practice rights under subdivision (5) of
- 16 section 71-183.01 or to physicians and surgeons who are applicants
- 17 for temporary practice rights under subdivision (9) of section
- 18 71-1,103.
- 19 (3) An applicant for a temporary educational permit as
- 20 defined in section 71-1,107.01 shall have ninety days from the
- 21 issuance of the permit to comply with subsection (1) of this
- 22 section and shall have his or her permit suspended after such
- 23 ninety-day period if the criminal background check is not complete
- 24 or revoked if the criminal background check reveals that the
- 25 applicant was not qualified for the permit.
