### A BILL

- FOR AN ACT relating to the Wholesale Drug Distributor Licensing

  Act; to amend section 71-7427, Revised Statutes

  Cumulative Supplement, 2006; to provide for sale or

  delivery of prescription drugs to persons responsible for

  the control of an animal; to harmonize provisions; and to

  repeal the original section.
- Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

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1 Section 1. Section 71-7427, Revised Statutes Cumulative

- 2 Supplement, 2006, is amended to read:
- 3 71-7427 Sections 71-7427 to 71-7463 and section 2 of
- 4 this act shall be known and may be cited as the Wholesale Drug
- 5 Distributor Licensing Act.
- 6 Sec. 2. A wholesale drug distributor may sell or
- 7 deliver, to a person responsible for the control of an animal,
- 8 a prescription drug labeled for veterinary use if:
- 9 (1) A licensed veterinarian has issued, prior to such
- 10 sale or delivery, a written prescription order for the drug
- 11 <u>in the course of an existing, valid veterinarian-client-patient</u>
- 12 <u>relationship;</u>
- 13 (2) The original order is retained on the premises of the
- 14 wholesale drug distributor for two years after the date of the last
- 15 transaction affecting the order;
- 16 (3) The drugs, prior to distribution, are not repackaged
- or dispensed by the wholesale drug distributor;
- 18 (4) The drugs, once distributed, are not returned to the
- 19 wholesale drug distributor for resale or redistribution;
- 20 (5) The prescription order issued by the veterinarian
- 21 becomes void after six months from date of issue if the order is
- 22 for a drug which is not a prescription drug or for a controlled
- 23 substance listed in Schedule II of section 28-405, unless the
- 24 <u>veterinarian specifies a shorter expiration date. The wholesale</u>
- 25 drug distributor may not distribute larger quantities than the

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- 1 <u>order authorizes;</u>
- 2 (6) The prescription order issued by the veterinarian
- 3 becomes void after six months after date of issue if the order
- 4 is for a controlled substance listed in Schedule III, IV, or V
- 5 of section 28-405, unless the veterinarian specifies a shorter
- 6 expiration date;
- 7 (7) The original order is retained on the premises of the
- 8 wholesale drug distributor and filed by client name. The invoices
- 9 for each distribution authorized by the order shall be attached to
- 10 the order; and
- 11 (8) A drug distribution log is retained on the premises
- 12 of the wholesale drug distributor. The log shall include the
- 13 following information:
- 14 (a) Date sold or delivered;
- 15 (b) Client name;
- 16 (c) Veterinarian name;
- 17 (d) Veterinarian's Drug Enforcement Administration number
- 18 if a controlled substance;
- 19 (e) Drug sold or delivered;
- 20 (f) Quantity of drug;
- 21 (g) Date of issue of order;
- 22 (h) Expiration of order; and
- 23 (i) Invoice number.
