### A BILL

1	FOR AN ACT relating to the Convention Center Facility Financing
2	Assistance Act; to amend sections 13-2601, 13-2602,
3	13-2603, 13-2605, 13-2607, 13-2609, and 13-2610, Revised
4	Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2006; to provide for
5	sales tax revenue appropriations to the Convention
6	Center Support Fund and the Local Civic, Cultural, and
7	Convention Center Financing Fund; to change and eliminate
8	provisions relating to attributable revenue; to define
9	terms; to harmonize provisions; to repeal the original
10	sections; and to outright repeal sections 13-2608 and
11	13-2612, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2006.
12	Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1 Section 1. Section 13-2601, Revised Statutes Cumulative

- 2 Supplement, 2006, is amended to read:
- 3 13-2601 Sections 13-2601 to  $\frac{13-2612}{13-2611}$  13-2611 shall be
- 4 known and may be cited as the Convention Center Facility Financing
- 5 Assistance Act.
- 6 Sec. 2. Section 13-2602, Revised Statutes Cumulative
- 7 Supplement, 2006, is amended to read:
- 8 13-2602 (1) The Legislature finds that it will be
- 9 beneficial to the economic well-being of the people of this
- 10 state that there be convention and meeting center facilities,
- 11 sports arena facilities, and hotel facilities of appropriate size
- 12 and quality to host regional, national, or international events.
- 13 Regional refers to states that border Nebraska; national refers
- 14 to states other than those that border Nebraska; and international
- 15 refers to nations other than the United States.
- 16 (2) The Legislature further finds that such facilities
- 17 may (a) generate new economic activity as well as additional state
- 18 and local taxes from persons residing within and outside the state
- 19 and (b) create new economic opportunities for residents.
- 20 (3) In order that the state may receive any long-term
- 21 economic and fiscal benefits from such facilities, a need exists to
- 22 provide some state financial assistance to political subdivisions
- 23 endeavoring to construct, acquire, substantially reconstruct,
- 24 expand, operate, improve, or equip such facilities.
- 25 (4) Therefor, it is deemed to be in the best interest of

1 both the state and its political subdivisions that the state assist

- 2 political subdivisions in financing the construction, acquisition,
- 3 substantial reconstruction, expansion, operation, improvement, or
- 4 equipping of such facilities.
- 5 (5) The amount of state financial assistance shall be
- 6 limited to a designated portion of new state sales tax revenue
- 7 attributed to such facilities and defined events hosted collected
- 8 by retailers, as defined in section 77-2701.32, doing business at
- 9 such facilities.
- 10 Sec. 3. Section 13-2603, Revised Statutes Cumulative
- 11 Supplement, 2006, is amended to read:
- 12 13-2603 For purposes of the Convention Center Facility
- 13 Financing Assistance Act:
- 14 (1) Attributable revenue means new state tax revenue
- 15 generated due to the construction of the eligible facility,
- 16 employment at the eligible facility, and spending by participants,
- 17 increased by the applicable investment multiplier;
- 18 (2) (1) Board means a board consisting of the Governor,
- 19 the State Treasurer, the chairperson of the Nebraska Investment
- 20 Council, the chairperson of the Nebraska State Board of Public
- 21 Accountancy, and a professor of economics on the faculty of a
- 22 state postsecondary educational institution appointed to a two-year
- 23 term on the board by the Coordinating Commission for Postsecondary
- 24 Education. For administrative and budget purposes only, the board
- 25 shall be considered part of the Department of Revenue;

1 (3) Bond means a general obligation bond,

- 2 redevelopment bond, lease-purchase bond, revenue bond, or
- 3 combination of any such bonds;
- 4 (4) (3) Convention and meeting center facility means any
- 5 real or personal property necessary for a convention and meeting
- 6 center, including an auditorium, an exhibition hall, a facility for
- 7 onsite food preparation and serving, an onsite, directly connected
- 8 parking facility for the use of the convention and meeting center
- 9 facility, and an administrative office of the convention and
- 10 meeting center facility;
- 11 (5) (4) Eligible facility means any publicly owned
- 12 convention and meeting center facility, sports arena facility,
- 13 or hotel facility acquired, constructed, improved, or equipped
- 14 after January 1, 1999;
- 15 (6) (5) General obligation bond means any bond or
- 16 refunding bond issued by a political subdivision and which is
- 17 payable from the proceeds of an ad valorem tax;
- 18 (7) Investment multiplier means the number of times
- 19 spending induces additional spending on goods and services;
- 20 (6) Hotel facility means any facility located within two
- 21 hundred yards of a convention and meeting center facility or a
- 22 sports arena facility in which the public may, for a consideration,
- 23 obtain sleeping accommodations;
- 24 (8) New regional, national, or international event means
- 25 a convention, meeting, trade show, or other educational function

1 at which at least fifty percent of the participants are registered

- 2 from a location outside Nebraska and which was not held in Nebraska
- 3 during the three years prior to the completion of construction of
- 4 the convention and meeting center facilities;
- 5 (9) Participant means a person registered to attend and
- 6 shown to have attended a new regional, national, or international
- 7 event at a convention and meeting center facility financed under
- 8 the act;
- 9 (10) Political subdivision means any local
- 10 governmental body formed and organized under state law and any
- 11 joint entity or joint public agency created under state law to act
- 12 on behalf of political subdivisions which has statutory authority
- 13 to issue general obligation bonds;
- 14 (8) Revenue bond means any bond or refunding bond
- 15 issued by a political subdivision which is limited or special
- 16 rather than a general obligation bond of the political subdivision
- 17 and which is not payable from the proceeds of an ad valorem tax;
- 18 and
- 19 (9) Sports arena facility means any real or personal
- 20 property used for observing competitive sports including stadiums,
- 21 arenas, dressing and locker facilities, concession areas, parking
- 22 facilities, and administrative offices in connection with operating
- 23 the facilities. (12) State tax revenue means the Nebraska income
- 24 tax imposed pursuant to the Nebraska Revenue Act of 1967, the
- 25 Nebraska sales and use tax imposed pursuant to the Nebraska Revenue

- 1 Act of 1967, and the state tax imposed by section 81-1253.
- 2 Sec. 4. Section 13-2605, Revised Statutes Cumulative
- 3 Supplement, 2006, is amended to read:
- 4 13-2605 (1) All applications for state assistance under
- 5 the Convention Center Facility Financing Assistance Act shall be in
- 6 writing and shall include a certified copy of the approving action
- 7 of the governing body of the applicant describing the proposed
- 8 eligible facility and the anticipated financing.
- 9 (2) The application shall contain:
- 10 (a) A description of the <del>proposed</del> financing of the
- 11 eligible facility, including the estimated principal and interest
- 12 requirements for the bonds proposed to be issued in connection
- 13 with the eligible facility or the amounts necessary to repay the
- 14 original investment by the applicant in the eligible facility;
- 15 (b) The estimated number of participants and the
- 16 estimated amount of the spending impact of these participants on
- 17 attributable revenue;
- 18 (c) A specific listing of the investment multipliers
- 19 suggested for use in evaluating the application;
- 20 <del>(d)</del> Estimates of attributable revenue based on the
- 21 investment multipliers;
- 22 <del>(e)</del> (b) Documentation of local financial commitment to
- 23 support the project, including all public and private resources
- 24 pledged or committed to the project; and
- 25 (f) (c) Any other project information deemed appropriate

- 2 (3) Upon receiving an application for state assistance,
- 3 the board shall review the application and notify the applicant of
- 4 any additional information needed for a proper evaluation of the
- 5 application.
- 6 Sec. 5. Section 13-2607, Revised Statutes Cumulative
- 7 Supplement, 2006, is amended to read:
- 8 13-2607 (1) After consideration of the application and
- 9 the evidence, the board shall issue a finding of whether the
- 10 convention and meeting center facility, sports arena facility, or
- 11 <u>hotel facility</u> described in the application is eligible for state
- 12 assistance.
- 13 (2) If the board finds that the facility described in the
- 14 application is an eligible facility and that state assistance is in
- 15 the best interest of the state, the application shall be approved.
- 16 (3) In determining whether state assistance is in the
- 17 best interest of the state, the board shall consider the amount
- 18 of attributable revenue estimated to be derived by the state from
- 19 the eligible facility and the fiscal and economic capacity of the
- 20 applicant to finance the local share of the eligible facility.
- 21 (4) (3) A majority of the board members constitutes a
- 22 quorum for the purpose of conducting business. All actions of the
- 23 board shall be by a majority vote of all the board members, one of
- 24 whom must be the Governor.
- 25 Sec. 6. Section 13-2609, Revised Statutes Cumulative

- 1 Supplement, 2006, is amended to read:
- 2 13-2609 If an application is approved, the board shall
- 3 annually:
- 4 (1) Audit or review audits of the approved convention and
- 5 meeting center facility, sports arena facility, or hotel facility
- 6 to determine the state sales tax revenue collected by retailers
- 7 doing business at such facilities; and number of participants at
- 8 the facility that are registered from a location outside Nebraska
- 9 and to assure the number of conventions which were not held in
- 10 the state during the three years prior to the construction of the
- 11 facility;
- 12 (2) Determine the amount of attributable revenue with
- 13 regard to construction, improvement, or equipping of the eligible
- 14 facility, employment at the eligible facility, and participants
- 15 attending a new regional, national, or international event for
- 16 which at least one-half of the participants were registered from a
- 17 location outside Nebraska; and
- 18 (2) <del>(3)</del> Certify the amount of state sales tax revenue
- 19 collected by retailers doing business at such facilities
- 20 attributable revenue to the State Treasurer.
- 21 Sec. 7. Section 13-2610, Revised Statutes Cumulative
- 22 Supplement, 2006, is amended to read:
- 23 13-2610 (1) Upon the annual certification under section
- 24 13-2609, the State Treasurer shall transfer after the audit
- 25 the amount certified to the Convention Center Support Fund. The

1 Convention Center Support Fund is created. Any money in the fund

- 2 available for investment shall be invested by the state investment
- 3 officer pursuant to the Nebraska Capital Expansion Act and the
- 4 Nebraska State Funds Investment Act.
- 5 (2) It is the intent of the Legislature to appropriate
- 6 from the fund to any political subdivision for which an application
- 7 for state assistance under the Convention Center Facility Financing
- 8 Assistance Act has been approved an amount not to exceed
- 9 seventy percent of the attributable revenue, seventy-five million
- 10 dollars for any one approved project, or the cost of acquiring,
- 11 constructing, improving, or equipping the eligible facility. state
- 12 sales tax revenue collected by retailers doing business at such
- 13 <u>facilities.</u> The money shall not be used for an operating subsidy
- 14 or other ancillary facility.
- 15 (3) State assistance to the political subdivision shall
- 16 no longer be available upon the retirement of the bonds issued
- 17 to acquire, construct, improve, or equip the facility or any
- 18 subsequent bonds that refunded the original issue. or when the cost
- 19 of acquiring, constructing, improving, or equipping the eligible
- 20 facility exceeds seventy-five million dollars, whichever comes
- 21 first.
- 22 (4) It is the intent of the Legislature that the
- 23 remaining thirty percent of attributable revenue state sales tax
- 24 revenue collected by retailers doing business at such facilities be
- 25 appropriated by the Legislature to the Local Civic, Cultural, and

- 1 Convention Center Financing Fund.
- 2 Sec. 8. Original sections 13-2601, 13-2602, 13-2603,
- 3 13-2605, 13-2607, 13-2609, and 13-2610, Revised Statutes Cumulative
- 4 Supplement, 2006, are repealed.
- 5 Sec. 9. The following sections are outright repealed:
- 6 Sections 13-2608 and 13-2612, Revised Statutes Cumulative
