# LEGISLATIVE BILL 558

### A BILL

FOR AN ACT relating to public schools; to amend section 79-2109,

Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2006; to change

provisions relating to the contents of the integration

plan developed for a learning community; and to repeal

the original section.

Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

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1 Section 1. Section 79-2109, Revised Statutes Cumulative

- 2 Supplement, 2006, is amended to read:
- 3 79-2109 (1) On or before January 1 immediately following
- 4 the establishment of a learning community, the learning community
- 5 coordinating council shall appoint an integration task force for
- 6 the learning community. In order to appoint the members of the task
- 7 force, the learning community coordinating council shall divide the
- 8 learning community into four quadrants along a north and south axis
- 9 and an east and west axis with each axis geographically centered
- 10 in the learning community. The task force shall consist of twelve
- 11 members who are not members of any school board and are not
- 12 employees of any school district as follows:
- 13 (a) Two of the members shall be employed in a planning
- 14 capacity for a city within the boundaries of the learning
- 15 community;
- 16 (b) Two members shall be members of organizations that
- 17 represent the interests of minority groups in the learning
- 18 community; and
- 19 (c) Two members from each of the four quadrants
- 20 established as described in this section.
- 21 (2) The purpose of the integration task force is to
- 22 develop an integration plan for the learning community and to
- 23 recommend such plan to the learning community coordinating council.
- 24 Such plan shall address the following:
- 25 (a) What the learning community hopes to accomplish for

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- 1 students through integration;
- 2 (b) How integration should be accomplished in the
- 3 learning community;
- 4 (c) How low-income and moderate-income housing patterns
- 5 impact integration throughout the learning community;
- 6 (e) (d) How the learning community will know if the
- 7 integration is successful; and
- 8 (d) (e) What the learning community should do if
- 9 integration is not successful.
- 10 (3) The integration task force shall meet once per month
- 11 for one year, may hold public hearings, shall be subject to the
- 12 Open Meetings Act, and shall report to the learning community
- 13 coordinating council at the council's monthly meetings in March,
- 14 June, September, and December. The task force shall also submit the
- 15 integration plan to the Education Committee of the Legislature in
- 16 December of such year.
- 17 (4) Members of the task force shall not receive
- 18 compensation but shall be reimbursed for their actual and necessary
- 19 expenses incurred in carrying out their duties as members of the
- 20 task force. If a vacancy occurs on the task force, the learning
- 21 community coordinating council shall appoint a person to fill the
- 22 vacancy who meets the requirements of the member being replaced.
