| 1 | FOR AN ACT relating to public health and welfare; to provide |
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| 2 | documentation and recordkeeping requirements for the |
| 3 | Department of Health and Human Services regarding the |
| 4 | treatment, transfer, and discharge of sex offenders. |
| 5 | Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska, |

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| 1 | Section 1. (1) The personnel of the Department of |
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| 2 | Health and Human Services who work with sex offenders shall |
| 3 | develop, maintain, and adhere to written policies or administrative |
| 4 | rules and regulations governing the transfer and discharge of sex |
| 5 | offenders treated in a program of the department. At a minimum, the |
| 6 | policies or rules and regulations shall contain: |
| 7 | (a) Specific requirements regarding treatment that sex |
| 8 | offenders are required to meet in order to be transferred from one |
| 9 | sex offender treatment unit to another or to be discharged from |
| 10 | treatment; and |
| 11 | (b) A list of the personnel of the department who are |
| 12 | required to review and document their opinions regarding the |
| 13 | treatment progress of each sex offender prior to his or her |
| 14 | transfer or discharge. |
| 15 | (2) The department shall maintain complete treatment |
| 16 | records for sex offenders treated in a program of the department, |
| 17 | including documentation of the reason behind transfer and discharge |
| 18 | decisions, with the sex offender's permanent medical records. At a |
| 19 | minimum, each sex offender's records shall contain: |
| 20 | (a) Detailed documentation that the sex offender has or |
| 21 | has not met the requirements for transfer or discharge; and |
| 22 | (b) Signed comments from all personnel of the department |
| 23 | required to review the sex offender's treatment progress prior to |
| 24 | his or her transfer or discharge. |

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
