5	Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2006; to change
6	and eliminate provisions of the Competitive Livestock
7	Markets Act; to eliminate penalties and certain Attorney
8	General duties; to harmonize provisions; to repeal the
9	original sections; and to outright repeal sections
10	54-2608, 54-2609, 54-2617, 54-2618, 54-2619, 54-2620,
11	54-2621, 54-2622, 54-2623, 54-2624, 54-2625, and 54-2626,

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LB 633 LB 633 Section 1. Section 54-2602, Reissue Revised Statutes of 1 2 Nebraska, is amended to read: 3 54-2602 For purposes of the Competitive Livestock Markets 4 Act: 5 (1) Animal unit means one head of cattle, three calves 6 under four hundred fifty pounds, or five swine; 7 (2) Department means the Department of Agriculture; 8 (3) Director means the Director of Agriculture or his or 9 her designee; 10 (4) Livestock means live cattle or swine; 11 (5) Packer means a person, or agent of such person, 12 engaged in the business of slaughtering livestock in Nebraska in 13 excess of one hundred fifty thousand animal units per year; and (6) Person includes individuals, firms, associations, 14 15 limited liability companies, and corporations and officers or 16 limited liability company members thereof; and -17 (7) Swine contractor means a person engaged in the 18 business of obtaining live swine under a swine production or 19 marketing contract for the purpose of slaughtering the swine or 20 selling the swine for slaughter. 21 Sec. 2. Section 54-2606, Reissue Revised Statutes of 22 Nebraska, is amended to read: 23 54-2606 The proceeds from any livestock ordered to be sold pursuant to section 54-2605 shall not be distributed until all 24 25 fines and costs associated with such action have been paid. All

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money collected as a fine shall be remitted to the State Treasurer 1 2 for credit to the permanent school fund. distribution in accordance 3 with Article VII, section 5, of the Constitution of Nebraska. All fines levied under this section remaining unpaid shall constitute 4 5 a debt to the State of Nebraska which may be collected by lien foreclosure or sued for and recovered in any proper form of action, 6 7 in the name of the State of Nebraska, in the district court of the 8 county in which the violation occurred. Sec. 3. Section 54-2607, Reissue Revised Statutes of 9 10 Nebraska, is amended to read: 54-2607 (1) It is <u>unlawful for a packer or swine</u> 11 12 contractor, with respect to purchasing or soliciting the purchase 13 of live cattle or swine in this state, to: 14 (a) Engage in or use any unfair, unjustly discriminatory, 15 or deceptive practice or device; or 16 (b) Make or give any undue or unreasonable preference 17 or advantage to any particular person or locality or subject 18 any particular person or locality to any undue or unreasonable 19 prejudice or disadvantage. 20 (2) For purposes of this section, undue or unreasonable 21 preference or advantage includes any practice or device by a 22 packer, a swine contractor, or a packer's or swine contractor's agent or representative, including a single transaction, to 23 24 directly or indirectly procure livestock from a producer on terms 25 withheld from other producers unless such livestock is purchased

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within two weeks of slaughter in a public market or other 1 2 competitive bidding process. Price premiums based on established 3 and recognized standards for product quality, time of delivery, and production methods that enhance product value and can be reasonably 4 5 applied on a wide range of farm sizes shall not be considered an 6 unreasonable preference or advantage if such premiums are offered 7 in a manner that does not discriminate against any size or category 8 of producers. 9 Except as provided in sections 54-2608 and 54-2609, it 10 is unlawful for a packer purchasing or entering into a contract to 11 purchase swine to pay or enter into a contract to pay different 12 prices to the sellers of the swine. This section shall not be 13 construed to mean that a price or payment method must remain fixed 14 throughout any marketing period. 15 Sec. 4. Section 54-2610, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is amended to read: 16 17 54-2610 Any contract made by a packer or swine contractor 18 in violation of section 54-2607 is voidable by the seller. Sec. 5. Section 54-2611, Reissue Revised Statutes of 19 Nebraska, is amended to read: 20 21 54-2611 A seller may bring an action against any packer 22 or swine contractor violating section 54-2607 to recover damages 23 sustained by reason of such violation. Sec. 6. Section 54-2612, Reissue Revised Statutes of 24 25 Nebraska, is amended to read:

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1	54-2612 Any packer <u>or swine contractor acting</u> in
2	violation of section 54-2607 is guilty of a Class IV misdemeanor
3	and shall be fined five hundred dollars per violation.
4	Sec. 7. Section 54-2613, Reissue Revised Statutes of
5	Nebraska, is amended to read:
6	54-2613 (1) A packer shall, two times each day during
7	which cattle are purchased, report to the department and to
8	the United States Department of Agriculture, agricultural market
9	service livestock news branch, all cattle that are purchased in
10	the cash, spot, or direct market for slaughter in this state
11	since the last report. A packer shall, one time each day during
12	which cattle are purchased, report to the department and to
13	the United States Department of Agriculture, agricultural market
14	service livestock news branch, all cattle that are purchased by
15	contract for slaughter in this state that day. Such reports shall
16	be completed on forms prepared by the department, in consultation
17	with the United States Department of Agriculture, agricultural
18	market service livestock news branch, and shall include:
19	(a) The cash price paid and the number of cattle
20	purchased at price intervals representative of the day's trade;
21	(b) Quality characteristics, including sex of the cattle,
22	estimated percentage of the meat which will be graded choice or
23	better upon inspection based upon the United States Department
24	of Agriculture official grades, and estimated live weight, as
25	well as premium and discount factors that may apply to these

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1 characteristics; 2 (c) Base price and premium and discount factors for 3 cattle purchased using a formula or grid pricing mechanism; and (d) The delivery month, volume, and applicable basis 4 5 level for all cattle purchased under basis contract. 6 The report shall not include information regarding the 7 identity of a seller. 8 (2) A packer or swine contractor Beginning February 15, 9 2000, a packer shall, two times each day during which swine are 10 purchased, report to the department and to the United States 11 Department of Agriculture, agricultural market service livestock 12 news branch, all swine that are purchased in the cash, spot, or 13 direct market for slaughter in this state since the last report. A 14 packer shall, one time each day during which swine are purchased, 15 report to the department and to the United States Department of 16 Agriculture, agricultural market service livestock news branch, all swine that are purchased by contract for slaughter in this state 17 18 that day. Such reports shall be completed on forms prepared by the 19 department, in consultation with the United States Department of 20 Agriculture, agricultural market service livestock news branch, and 21 shall include: 22 (1) (a) The cash price paid and the number of swine

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payment adjustments for quality characteristics including grade,

4 swine purchased using a formula-based pricing system; and

5 (4) (d) The number of swine purchased under contract, in 6 which the date of delivery is set for more than fourteen days after 7 the making of the contract, and the base price to be paid or the 8 formula that will be used to determine the base price to be paid.

9 The report shall not include information regarding the 10 identity of a seller.

Sec. 8. Section 54-2615, Reissue Revised Statutes of
Nebraska, is amended to read:

13 54-2615 The failure of a packer <u>or swine contractor</u> to 14 report information to the department as required in section 54-2613 15 is punishable by a civil penalty not to exceed one thousand dollars 16 for each day that a complete report is not made available to the 17 department. The intentional reporting of false information by a 18 packer <u>or swine contractor</u> in the report to the department required 19 in section 54-2613 is a Class IV misdemeanor.

Sec. 9. Section 54-2616, Reissue Revised Statutes of
Nebraska, is amended to read:

54-2616 The Attorney General shall enforce the provisions of sections 54-2607 to 54-2615, Competitive Livestock Markets Act, and the director shall refer any violations of these provisions to the Attorney General. The Attorney General or any person

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injured by a violation of these provisions the act may bring an 1 2 action in district court to restrain a packer from violating these 3 provisions. the act. Sec. 10. Section 54-2627, Reissue Revised Statutes of 4 5 Nebraska, is amended to read: 6 54-2627 The department shall assess a fee not to exceed 7 two cents per animal unit reported under sections section 54-2613 8 and 54-2623 as direct-purchased or contract-purchased. 9 Sec. 11. Section 54-2627.01, Revised Statutes Cumulative 10 Supplement, 2006, is amended to read: 11 54-2627.01 (1) Sections 54-2607 to 54-2627 are Section 12 54-2613 is preempted by the federal Livestock Mandatory Reporting 13 Act of 1999, 7 U.S.C. 1635 to 1636h, when such federal act is in effect. 14 15 (2) (a) If Congress does not reauthorize the federal 16 Livestock Mandatory Reporting Act of 1999 before December 1, 2006, 17 the director shall, on December 1_7 2006, or as soon before or after 18 as practicable, prepare a budget and an appropriation request from 19 the General Fund, from the Competitive Livestock Markets Cash Fund, 20 or from other cash funds under the control of the director, for

21 submission to the Legislature in an amount sufficient to enable 22 the department to carry out its duties under sections 54-2607 to 23 54-2627, and such sections shall become applicable on October 1, 24 2007.

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(b) (2) If, on or after December 1, 2006, Congress does

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not reauthorize the federal Livestock Mandatory Reporting Act of 1 2 1999, the director shall prepare such budget and appropriation 3 request on or before a date that is twelve calendar months after the date such federal act expires or is terminated, and 4 5 sections 54-2607 to 54-2627 shall become applicable on the first day of the calendar quarter that is eighteen months after the 6 7 date such sections are not preempted by the federal act. No 8 General Funds shall be appropriated for implementation of sections 9 54-2607 to 54-2627 after the date of commencement provided for 10 in this section of reporting of price and other data regarding 11 livestock transactions pursuant to sections section 54-2613. and 12 54-2623. It is the intent of the Legislature that any General Funds appropriated for purposes of this section shall be reimbursed to 13 14 the General Fund.

54-2628 The Competitive Livestock Markets Cash Fund 17 18 is created. The fund shall be administered by the department. 19 The fund shall consist of investigative and enforcement expense 20 assessments against violators of the Competitive Livestock Markets 21 Act and fees paid by a packer or swine contractor pursuant 22 to section 54-2627. The money in the fund shall be used to defray the investigative, enforcement, and reporting expenses of 23 24 the department in administering the act. Any money in the fund 25 available for investment shall be invested by the state investment

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officer pursuant to the Nebraska Capital Expansion Act and the
 Nebraska State Funds Investment Act.
