A BILL

FOR AN ACT relating to the Tax Equity and Educational Opportunities

Support Act; to amend sections 79-1001 and 79-1007.03,

Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2006; to provide

for summer school student units; to harmonize provisions;

and to repeal the original sections.

Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

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1 Section 1. Section 79-1001, Revised Statutes Cumulative

- 2 Supplement, 2006, is amended to read:
- 3 79-1001 Sections 79-1001 to 79-1033 and section 2 of
- 4 this act shall be known and may be cited as the Tax Equity and
- 5 Educational Opportunities Support Act.
- 6 Sec. 2. For purposes of this section and section
- 7 79-1007.03, summer school student unit means one student enrolled
- 8 in summer school in a school district, whether or not the student
- 9 is in the membership of the school district, for (1) at least three
- 10 hours but fewer than six hours per day and (2) at least twelve
- 11 days but fewer than twenty-four days. Each school district shall
- 12 receive a summer school student unit for each qualified time period
- 13 for which a student is enrolled, up to six units per student per
- 14 summer.
- 15 Each school district shall receive an additional summer
- 16 school student unit for each summer school student unit attributed
- 17 to remedial math or reading programs. Each school district shall
- 18 also receive an additional summer school student unit for each
- 19 summer school student unit attributed to a free lunch and free
- 20 milk student. This section does not prevent school districts from
- 21 requiring and collecting fees for summer school, except that summer
- 22 school student units shall not be calculated for summer school
- 23 programs for which fees are collected from students who qualify
- 24 for free or reduced-price lunches under United States Department of
- 25 Agriculture child nutrition programs.

- 3 79-1007.03 For state aid calculated for school fiscal
- 4 year 2008-09 and each school fiscal year thereafter:
- 5 (1) The adjusted formula students for each school
- 6 district shall be calculated by:
- 7 (a) Multiplying the formula students in each grade range
- 8 by the corresponding weighting factors to calculate the weighted
- 9 formula students for each grade range as follows:
- 10 (i) The weighting factor for early childhood education
- 11 programs is six-tenths;
- 12 (ii) The weighting factor for kindergarten is
- 13 five-tenths:
- 14 (iii) The weighting factor for grades one through six,
- 15 including full-day kindergarten, is one;
- 16 (iv) The weighting factor for grades seven and eight is
- 17 one and two-tenths; and
- 18 (v) The weighting factor for grades nine through twelve
- 19 is one and four-tenths;
- 20 (b) Adding the weighted formula students for each grade
- 21 range to calculate the weighted formula students for the local
- 22 system; and
- (c) Adjusting the weighted formula students by adding the
- 24 following demographic factors:
- 25 (i) The Indian-land factor shall equal 0.25 times the

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1 average daily attendance of students who reside on Indian land

- 2 as reported by the United States Department of Education in
- 3 calculating the local system's payment pursuant to 20 U.S.C. 7701
- 4 et seq., as such sections existed on January 1, 2006; and
- 5 (ii) The extreme remoteness factor shall equal 0.125
- 6 times the formula students in the school district for each school
- 7 district that has fewer than two hundred formula students, more
- 8 than six hundred square miles in the school district, less than
- 9 three-tenths formula student per square mile in the local system,
- 10 and more than twenty-five miles between the high school attendance
- 11 center and the next closest high school attendance center on paved
- 12 roads; and
- 13 <u>(iii) The summer school factor shall equal 0.025 times</u>
- 14 the number of summer school student units as defined in section 2
- 15 of this act; and
- 16 (2) The total adjusted formula students for each
- 17 school district shall equal the weighted formula students plus
- 18 the demographic factors, except that (a) for school districts
- 19 qualifying for the extreme remoteness factor, the total adjusted
- 20 formula students shall be greater than or equal to one hundred
- 21 fifty adjusted formula students, (b) the total adjusted formula
- 22 students for a school district shall not include the summer school
- 23 factor or the extreme remoteness factor or any adjustment to
- 24 the adjusted formula students resulting from qualification for
- 25 the extreme remoteness factor for the calculation of the average

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formula cost per student in each cost grouping pursuant to section

- 2 79-1007.02, and (c) the total adjusted formula students for a
- 3 school district shall include the summer school factor, the extreme
- 4 remoteness $factor_{L}$ and any adjustment to the adjusted formula
- 5 students resulting from qualification for the extreme remoteness
- 6 factor for the calculation of the school district's formula need
- 7 pursuant to section 79-1007.02.
