## **LEGISLATIVE BILL 807**

Introduced by Aguilar, 35; Johnson, 37. Read first time January 10, 2008 Committee: Health and Human Services

A BILL

1	FOR AN ACT relating to the medical assistance program; to amend
2	section 68-901, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,
3	2006; to state findings; to require coverage of
4	tobacco-use cessation counseling and pharmaceuticals as
5	prescribed; to harmonize provisions; and to repeal the
6	original section.

7 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

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1	Section 1. The Legislature finds that:
2	(1) Annual health care costs in Nebraska directly caused
3	by tobacco use are five hundred thirty-seven million dollars, of
4	which one hundred thirty-four million dollars is paid for costs
5	associated with illnesses related to tobacco use by recipients of
6	medical assistance under the medical assistance program;
7	(2) The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention of the
8	Public Health Service of the United States Department of Health and
9	Human Services estimates that tobacco-use cessation counseling and
10	tobacco-use cessation pharmaceuticals double the successful rate of
11	quitting tobacco use and have achieved reported successful quitting
12	rates of twenty-five to thirty-three percent;
13	(3) The estimated thirty-three thousand five hundred
14	tobacco users covered by the medical assistance program suffer
15	from illnesses related to tobacco use but the cost of tobacco-use
16	cessation counseling or tobacco-use cessation pharmaceuticals which
17	otherwise meet the definition of a covered outpatient drug under
18	section 1927(k) of the federal Social Security Act are not covered
19	by the program;
20	(4) The medical assistance program is eligible to receive
21	in fiscal year 2008-09 up to fifty-eight percent in federal
22	matching funds for coverage provided for tobacco-use cessation
23	counseling and tobacco-use cessation pharmaceuticals, if the
24	program applies for such matching funds;
25	(5) The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention of the

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1	Public Health Service of the United States Department of Health and
2	Human Services, the United States Preventive Services Task Force,
3	and other federal public health agencies strongly recommend that
4	all states amend their medical assistance program to cover the
5	costs of tobacco-use cessation counseling and tobacco-use cessation
6	pharmaceuticals; and
7	(6) Nebraska is one of the eight states that provide
8	no coverage under the medical assistance program for the costs of
9	either tobacco-use cessation counseling or tobacco-use cessation
10	pharmaceuticals.
11	Sec. 2. The Department of Health and Human Services
12	shall:
13	(1) Submit a proposal within ninety days after the
14	effective date of this act, in compliance with Title XIX of
15	the federal Social Security Act, to the Centers for Medicare
16	and Medicaid Services of the United States Department of Health
17	and Human Services to amend the medicaid state plan to cover
18	the costs of tobacco-use cessation counseling and tobacco-use
19	cessation pharmaceuticals approved by the federal Food and Drug
20	Administration for such purposes, whether such counseling and
21	pharmaceuticals are provided together or separately; and
22	(2) Revise its rules, regulations, manuals, and other
23	regulatory documents relating to the medical assistance program and
24	medicaid state plan and its list of excluded drugs to reflect such
25	proposal.

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1 Sec. 3. The department shall report annually to the 2 Legislature on matters related to payments under the Medical 3 Assistance Act for tobacco-use cessation counseling and tobacco-use cessation pharmaceuticals. Such report shall include, but not be 4 limited to, the number of persons to whom such counseling or 5 6 pharmaceuticals were provided, the number of quit attempts, and the 7 total amount of such payments. 8 Sec. 4. Section 68-901, Revised Statutes Cumulative 9 Supplement, 2006, is amended to read: 68-901 Sections 68-901 to 68-949 and sections 1 to 3 of 10 11 this act shall be known and may be cited as the Medical Assistance 12 Act. 13 Sec. 5. Original section 68-901, Revised Statutes 14 Cumulative Supplement, 2006, is repealed.

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
