A BILL

FOR AN ACT relating to the Nebraska Rules of the Road; to amend
section 60-601, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,

2006; to regulate the movement of traffic approaching or
passing a stopped authorized emergency vehicle; to provide
penalties; to harmonize provisions; and to repeal the
original section.

Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

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1 Section 1. Section 60-601, Revised Statutes Cumulative 2 Supplement, 2006, is amended to read:

60-601. Sections 60-601 to 60-6,377 and section 2 of this 3 4 act shall be known and may be cited as the Nebraska Rules of the 5 Road.

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- Sec. 2. (1)(a) A driver in a vehicle on a controlled-access highway approaching or passing a stopped authorized emergency vehicle which makes use of proper audible or visual signals shall proceed with due care and caution as described in subsection (2) of this 10 section.
 - (b) On a controlled-access highway with at least two adjacent lanes of travel in the same direction on the same side of the highway where a stopped authorized emergency vehicle is using proper audible or visual signals, the driver of the vehicle shall proceed with due care and caution and yield the right-of-way by moving into a lane at least one moving lane apart from the stopped authorized emergency vehicle unless directed otherwise by a peace officer or other authorized emergency personnel. If moving into another lane is not possible because of weather conditions, road conditions, or the immediate presence of vehicular or pedestrian traffic or because the controlled-access highway does not have two available adjacent lanes of travel in the same direction on the same side of the highway where such a stopped authorized emergency vehicle is located, the driver of the approaching or passing vehicle shall reduce his or her speed, maintain a safe speed with regard to the location of the stopped authorized emergency vehicle, weather conditions, road conditions, and vehicular or pedestrian traffic, and proceed with due care and

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caution or proceed as directed by a peace officer or other authorized 1 2 emergency personnel. (c) Any person who violates this subsection is quilty of a 3 traffic infraction for a first offense and Class IIIA misdemeanor for 4 5 a second or subsequent offense. (2) The Department of Roads shall erect and maintain or 6 7 cause to be erected and maintained signs giving notice of subsection 8 (1) of this section along controlled-access highways. This section is 9 not effective for a controlled-access highway until such signs are erected and maintained along such highway. 10 11 (3) Enforcement of subsection (1) of this section shall not 12 be accomplished using simulated situations involving an authorized 13 emergency vehicle. 14 (4) This section does not relieve the driver of an 15 authorized emergency vehicle from the duty to drive with due regard 16 for the safety of all persons using the highway. 17 Sec. 3.
