- 2 Volunteer Emergency Responders Job Protection Act.

LB 948

Section 1. Sections 1 to 8 of this act shall be known and 1 2 may be cited as the Volunteer Emergency Responders Job Protection 3 Act. Sec. 2. No employer shall terminate or take any other 4 5 disciplinary action against any employee who is a volunteer 6 emergency responder if such employee, when acting as a volunteer 7 emergency responder, is absent from or reports late to his or her 8 place of employment in order to respond to an emergency during or 9 prior to the time such employee is to report to his or her place 10 of employment. 11 Sec. 3. An employer may subtract from an employee's 12 earned wages any time such employee, acting as a volunteer 13 emergency responder, is away from his or her place of employment 14 because of such employee's response to an emergency. 15 Sec. 4. An employee acting as a volunteer emergency 16 responder shall make a reasonable effort to notify his or her 17 employer that he or she may be absent from or report late to his or 18 her place of employment in order to respond to an emergency. 19 Sec. 5. At an employer's request, an employee, acting 20 as a volunteer emergency responder, who is absent from or reports 21 late to his or her place of employment in order to respond to 22 an emergency shall provide his or her employer, within seven days 23 of such request, a written statement signed by the individual in 24 charge of the volunteer department or another individual authorized 25 to act for such individual that includes the following: The fact LB 948

1 that the employee responded to an emergency; the date and time of 2 the emergency; and the date and time such employee completed his or 3 her volunteer emergency activities.

4 Sec. 6. Prior to seeking protection pursuant to the 5 Volunteer Emergency Responders Job Protection Act, an employee 6 acting as a volunteer emergency responder shall provide his or 7 her employer with a written statement signed by the individual in 8 charge of the volunteer department or another individual authorized 9 to act for such individual notifying such employer that the 10 employee serves as a volunteer emergency responder. An employee 11 who is or who has served as a volunteer emergency responder 12 shall notify his or her employer when such employee's status as 13 a volunteer emergency responder changes, including termination of such status. 14

15 Sec. 7. An employee who is terminated or against whom 16 any disciplinary action is taken in violation of the Volunteer Emergency Responders Job Protection Act shall be immediately 17 reinstated to his or her former position, if wrongfully terminated, 18 19 without reduction of wages, seniority, or other benefits and shall 20 receive any lost wages or other benefits, if applicable, during 21 any period for which such termination or other disciplinary action 22 was in effect. An action to enforce the act may be brought by the 23 employee to recover any lost wages or other benefits, including 24 court costs and reasonable attorney's fees. An action to enforce 25 the act shall be commenced within one year after the date of LB 948

violation and shall be brought in the district court of the county in which the place of employment is located.

3 Sec. 8. For purposes of the Volunteer Emergency Responders Job Protection Act, volunteer emergency responder means 4 5 a person who has been approved by a governing body in Nebraska to serve any volunteer fire department or volunteer first-aid, 6 7 rescue, ambulance, or emergency squad, or volunteer fire company, 8 association, or organization serving any city, village, or rural 9 or suburban fire protection district by providing fire protection 10 or emergency response services for the purpose of protecting life, 11 health, or property.
