LB 398 creates a collegiate spirit specialty license plate and directs additional fees to the Nebraska Scholarship Fund.

The bill authorizes the DMV to design a collegiate spirit license plate. Beginning January 1, 2010 a person may apply for the plates. The plates shall cost \$70. Forty-three percent of the fee will go to the DMV Cash Fund and fifty-seven percent will go to the Nebraska Scholarship Fund.

The DMV will design the plate for any qualifying private, non-profit college or university, and work in consultation with the college or university on the design. The plate will not be manufactured until 150 prepaid applications are received for that particular college or university.

In order to qualify for a collegiate spirit plate, a college or university will have to provide the DMV with copies of its articles of incorporation, 150 prepaid applications, and a form that certifies that the college or university is authorized to use any name, logo or graphic design suggested for the plate, no infringement or violation of any property right will result from such use, and the state will be held harmless for any liability which may result.

The DMV has rule and regulation authority to carry out this section.
