#### A BILL

- 1 FOR AN ACT relating to postsecondary education; to adopt the In the
- 2 Line of Duty Dependent Education Act; and to declare an
- 3 emergency.
- 4 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1 Section 1. Sections 1 to 6 of this act shall be known and

- 2 may be cited as the In the Line of Duty Dependent Education Act.
- 3 Sec. 2. The Legislature finds and declares that:
- 4 (1) Nebraska's law enforcement officers and firefighters
- 5 place their lives at risk in the line of duty to protect the
- 6 citizens and property of this state;
- 7 (2) The services performed by Nebraska law enforcement
- 8 officers and firefighters are necessary for the protection of the
- 9 citizens and property of this state;
- 10 (3) Nebraska law enforcement officers and firefighters
- 11 have lost or may lose their lives in the performance of their
- 12 official duties; and
- 13 (4) Nebraska law enforcement officers and firefighters
- 14 perform dangerous and hazardous acts in order to protect the
- 15 citizens and property of this state.
- 16 It is the intent of the Legislature to recognize the
- 17 ultimate sacrifice made by Nebraska law enforcement officers and
- 18 firefighters who are killed in the line of duty on or after the
- 19 effective date of this act by providing a postsecondary educational
- 20 benefit for their surviving children to attend state universities,
- 21 state colleges, and community colleges located in Nebraska.
- 22 Sec. 3. For purposes of the In the Line of Duty Dependent
- 23 Education Act:
- 24 <u>(1) Associate degree program means a degree program at</u>
- 25 a community college, state college, or state university which

1 typically requires completion of an organized program of study of

- 2 at least sixty semester credit hours or an equivalent that can be
- 3 shown to accomplish the same goal. Associate degree program does
- 4 not include a baccalaureate degree program;
- 5 (2) Baccalaureate degree program means a degree program
- 6 at a community college, state college, or state university which
- 7 typically requires completion of an organized program of study of
- 8 at least one hundred twenty semester credit hours or an equivalent
- 9 that can be shown to accomplish the same goal;
- 10 (3) Child means a resident or nonresident of Nebraska who
- 11 is the child by birth or adoption of a Nebraska law enforcement
- 12 officer killed in the line of duty or a Nebraska firefighter killed
- 13 <u>in the line of duty;</u>
- 14 (4) Community college means a public postsecondary
- 15 educational institution which is part of the community college
- 16 system and includes all branches and campuses of such institution
- 17 <u>located within the State of Nebraska;</u>
- 18 (5) Education benefit means the In the Line of Duty
- 19 Dependent Education Benefit established under section 4 of this
- 20 <u>act;</u>
- 21 (6) Fatal injury means an event occurring in the line of
- 22 duty which is a proximate cause of the death of a law enforcement
- 23 officer or firefighter;
- 24 <u>(7) Firefighter means a member of a paid or volunteer</u>
- 25 fire department in Nebraska, including a member of a rescue squad

1 associated with a paid or volunteer fire department in Nebraska,

- 2 and a member of an emergency medical services ambulance squad;
- 3 (8) Law enforcement officer means any person who is
- 4 responsible for the prevention or detection of crime or the
- 5 enforcement of the penal, traffic, or highway laws of the State of
- 6 Nebraska or any political subdivision of the state for more than
- 7 one hundred hours per year and who is authorized by law to make
- 8 arrests;
- 9 (9) Line of duty means any action that a Nebraska law
- 10 enforcement officer or firefighter is authorized or obligated by
- 11 law, rule, or regulation to perform, related to or as a condition
- 12 of employment or service;
- 13 (10) State college means a public postsecondary
- 14 educational institution which is part of the Nebraska state college
- 15 system and includes all branches and campuses of such institution
- 16 <u>located within the State of Nebraska;</u>
- 17 (11) State university means a public postsecondary
- 18 educational institution which is part of the University of Nebraska
- 19 and includes all branches and campuses of such institution located
- 20 within the State of Nebraska;
- 21 (12) Tuition and fees means the charges and cost of
- 22 tuition and fees as set by the governing body of a state
- 23 university, state college, or community college; and
- 24 <u>(13) Volunteer fire department means a volunteer</u>
- 25 department as defined in section 35-1303 located in Nebraska which

- 1 provides fire protection services within Nebraska.
- 2 Sec. 4. (1) The In the Line of Duty Dependent Education
- 3 Benefit is established for children of law enforcement officers
- 4 and firefighters killed in the line of duty. In order for a child
- 5 to be eligible for the benefit, the law enforcement officer or
- 6 firefighter must have incurred the fatal injury on or after the
- 7 effective date of this act.
- 8 (2) Notwithstanding the provisions of this section, a
- 9 death that occurs as the direct and proximate result of a
- 10 preexisting physical condition, disease, or illness shall be
- 11 excluded from eligibility under this section unless the aggravation
- 12 of such condition, disease, or illness caused by being in the line
- of duty was a direct and proximate cause of death.
- 14 (3) Any child who is the child of a law enforcement
- 15 officer killed in the line of duty as provided in subsection (1)
- 16 of this section or of a firefighter killed in the line of duty
- 17 <u>as provided in such subsection shall be eligible for the education</u>
- 18 benefit if the child is twenty-five years of age or younger. An
- 19 eligible child shall meet all admission requirements of the state
- 20 university, state college, or community college to which he or she
- 21 is applying.
- 22 (4) The education benefit shall be provided only for
- 23 full-time undergraduate students who are pursuing studies leading
- 24 to a degree from an associate degree program or a baccalaureate
- 25 degree program. The eligible child may receive the education

1 benefit for up to five years if he or she otherwise continues to be

- 2 eligible for participation. All education benefits received under
- 3 the In the Line of Duty Dependent Education Act shall cease when
- 4 the eligible child reaches twenty-six years of age.
- 5 (5) A child becomes eligible for the education benefit
- 6 after he or she has applied for federal financial aid grants and
- 7 state scholarships and grants to cover tuition and fees. The child
- 8 must provide a record of application for such financial aid to the
- 9 state university, state college, or community college to which he
- 10 or she is applying.
- 11 (6) The state university, state college, or community
- 12 college shall waive tuition and fees remaining due after
- 13 subtracting awarded federal financial aid grants and state
- 14 scholarships and grants for an eligible child during the time the
- 15 child is enrolled as a full-time student. To remain eligible,
- 16 the child must comply with all requirements of the institution
- 17 for continued attendance and award of an associate degree or a
- 18 baccalaureate degree.
- 19 (7) An application for an education benefit shall include
- 20 a certified copy of the eligible child's birth certificate or
- 21 applicable adoption record and verification of the death of the law
- 22 enforcement officer or firefighter who was the child's parent.
- 23 (8) Verification of the death of the law enforcement
- 24 officer or firefighter shall be made by obtaining a certificate
- 25 of eligibility from the following sources: (a) Certificates of

1 eligibility for the children of law enforcement officers shall

- 2 be obtained from the Superintendent of Law Enforcement and
- 3 Public Safety; (b) certificates of eligibility for the children
- 4 of firefighters, except as provided in subdivision (c) of this
- 5 subsection, shall be obtained from the State Fire Marshal; and
- 6 (c) certificates of eligibility for the children of members of
- 7 emergency medical services ambulance squads that are not associated
- 8 with a paid or volunteer fire department shall be obtained from the
- 9 Department of Health and Human Services.
- 10 (9) Within forty-five days after receipt of a completed
- 11 application, the state university, state college, or community
- 12 college shall send written notice of the applicant's eligibility or
- 13 ineligibility for the education benefit. If the child is determined
- 14 not to be eligible for the benefit, the notice shall include
- 15 the reason or reasons for such determination and an indication
- 16 that an appeal of the determination may be made pursuant to the
- 17 Administrative Procedure Act.
- 18 (10) Upon a determination of eligibility for the child to
- 19 obtain the education benefit, the state university, state college,
- 20 or community college is prohibited from charging the child, the
- 21 child's surviving parent, or the child's guardian any tuition or
- 22 fees as long as the child remains eligible.
- 23 Sec. 5. Each state university, state college, or
- 24 community college shall adopt the procedures, rules, and
- 25 regulations necessary to carry out the In the Line of Duty

- 1 Dependent Education Act.
- 2 Sec. 6. A finding that a student qualifies for an
- 3 education benefit pursuant to the In Line of Duty Dependent
- 4 Education Act shall not be admissible as evidence for any other
- 5 purpose.
- 6 Sec. 7. Since an emergency exists, this act takes effect
- 7 when passed and approved according to law.
