 43-2101, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska; to provide
 for authority for certain persons who are eighteen years
 of age to consent to health care and medical treatment
 and enter into contracts and leases; to repeal the
 original sections; and to declare an emergency.

- 3 30-2604 A parent or a guardian of a minor or
- 4 incapacitated person, by a properly executed power of attorney, may
- 5 delegate to another person, for a period not exceeding six months,
- 6 any of his or her powers regarding care, custody, or property of
- 7 the minor child or ward, except his or her power to consent to
- 8 marriage or adoption of a minor ward. A parent or guardian of
- 9 a minor who is at least eighteen years of age and who is not a
- 10 ward of the state, by a properly executed power of attorney, may
- 11 delegate to such minor, for a period not exceeding one year, the
- 12 parent's or guardian's power to consent to such minor's own health
- 13 care and medical treatment.

- 15 Nebraska, is amended to read:
- 16 43-2101 All persons under nineteen years of age are
- 17 declared to be minors, but in case any person marries under the
- 18 age of nineteen years, his or her minority ends. Upon becoming the
- 19 age of majority, a person is considered an adult and acquires all
- 20 rights and responsibilities granted or imposed by statute or common
- 21 law, except that a person eighteen years of age or older and who
- 22 is not a ward of the state may enter into a binding contract or
- 23 lease of whatever kind or nature and shall be legally responsible
