A BILL

1 FOR AN ACT relating to funds; to amend section 77-3,111, 2 Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, sections 71-5714 3 and 72-1001, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2008, and sections 9-812 and 84-612, Revised Statutes 4 5 Supplement, 2009; to provide for, change, and eliminate certain fund transfers; to provide for a lapse of certain 6 7 funds to the General Fund; to harmonize provisions; to 8 repeal the original sections; to outright repeal section 90-505, Revised Statutes Supplement, 2009; and to declare 9 10 an emergency.

11 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

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Section 1. Section 9-812, Revised Statutes Supplement,
 2009, is amended to read:

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3 9-812 (1) All money received from the operation of lottery games conducted pursuant to the State Lottery Act in 4 5 Nebraska shall be credited to the State Lottery Operation Trust Fund, which fund is hereby created. All payments of the costs 6 7 of establishing and maintaining the lottery games shall be made 8 from the State Lottery Operation Cash Fund. In accordance with 9 legislative appropriations, money for payments for expenses of the 10 division shall be transferred from the State Lottery Operation 11 Trust Fund to the State Lottery Operation Cash Fund, which fund 12 is hereby created. All money necessary for the payment of lottery 13 prizes shall be transferred from the State Lottery Operation Trust 14 Fund to the State Lottery Prize Trust Fund, which fund is hereby 15 created. The amount used for the payment of lottery prizes shall 16 not be less than forty percent of the dollar amount of the lottery 17 tickets which have been sold.

18 (2) Beginning October 1, 2003, a portion of the dollar amount of the lottery tickets which have been sold on an annualized 19 20 basis shall be transferred from the State Lottery Operation Trust 21 Fund to the Education Innovation Fund, the Nebraska Scholarship 22 Fund, the Nebraska Environmental Trust Fund, the Nebraska State Fair Board, and the Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund. The dollar 23 amount transferred pursuant to this subsection shall equal the 24 25 greater of (a) the dollar amount transferred to the funds in

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1 fiscal year 2002-03 or (b) any amount which constitutes at least 2 twenty-two percent and no more than twenty-five percent of the 3 dollar amount of the lottery tickets which have been sold on an 4 annualized basis. To the extent that funds are available, the 5 Tax Commissioner and director may authorize a transfer exceeding 6 twenty-five percent of the dollar amount of the lottery tickets 7 sold on an annualized basis.

8 (3) Of the money available to be transferred to the 9 Education Innovation Fund, the Nebraska Scholarship Fund, the 10 Nebraska Environmental Trust Fund, the Nebraska State Fair Board, 11 and the Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund:

12 (a) The first five hundred thousand dollars shall be
13 transferred to the Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund to be used
14 as provided in section 71-817;

15 (b) Nineteen and three-fourths percent of the money 16 remaining after the payment of prizes and operating expenses and 17 the initial transfer to the Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund 18 shall be transferred to the Education Innovation Fund;

(c) Twenty-four and three-fourths percent of the money remaining after the payment of prizes and operating expenses and the initial transfer to the Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund shall be transferred to the Nebraska Scholarship Fund;

23 (d) Forty-four and one-half percent of the money
24 remaining after the payment of prizes and operating expenses and
25 the initial transfer to the Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund

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shall be transferred to the Nebraska Environmental Trust Fund to be
 used as provided in the Nebraska Environmental Trust Act;

3 (e) Ten percent of the money remaining after the payment of prizes and operating expenses and the initial transfer to 4 5 the Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund shall be transferred to 6 the Nebraska State Fair Board if the most populous city within 7 the county in which the fair is located provides matching funds 8 equivalent to ten percent of the funds available for transfer. Such 9 matching funds may be obtained from the city and any other private 10 or public entity, except that no portion of such matching funds 11 shall be provided by the state. If the Nebraska State Fair ceases 12 operations, ten percent of the money remaining after the payment 13 of prizes and operating expenses and the initial transfer to the Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund shall be transferred to the 14 15 General Fund; and

16 (f) One percent of the money remaining after the payment 17 of prizes and operating expenses and the initial transfer to the 18 Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund shall be transferred to the 19 Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund to be used as provided in 20 section 71-817.

(4) (a) The Education Innovation Fund is created. At least
seventy-five percent of the lottery proceeds allocated to the
Education Innovation Fund shall be available for disbursement.

(b) For fiscal year 2005-06, the Education Innovation
Fund shall be allocated as follows: The first one million dollars

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shall be transferred to the School District Reorganization Fund,
 and the remaining amount shall be allocated to the General Fund
 after operating expenses for the Excellence in Education Council
 are deducted.

(c) For fiscal year 2006-07, the Education Innovation 5 Fund shall be allocated as follows: The first two hundred fifty 6 7 thousand dollars shall be transferred to the Attracting Excellence 8 to Teaching Program Cash Fund to fund the Attracting Excellence 9 to Teaching Program Act, the next one million dollars shall 10 be transferred to the School District Reorganization Fund, and 11 the amount remaining in the Education Innovation Fund shall be 12 allocated, after administrative expenses, for distance education 13 equipment and incentives pursuant to sections 79-1336 and 79-1337.

(d) For fiscal year 2007-08, the Education Innovation 14 15 Fund shall be allocated as follows: The first five hundred thousand 16 dollars shall be transferred to the Attracting Excellence to Teaching Program Cash Fund to fund the Attracting Excellence to 17 18 Teaching Program Act, and the amount remaining in the Education Innovation Fund shall be allocated, after administrative expenses, 19 20 for distance education equipment and incentives pursuant to 21 sections 79-1336 and 79-1337.

(e) For fiscal year 2008-09, the Education Innovation Fund shall be allocated as follows: The first seven hundred fifty thousand dollars shall be transferred to the Attracting Excellence to Teaching Program Cash Fund to fund the Attracting

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Excellence to Teaching Program Act, and the amount remaining in the
 Education Innovation Fund shall be allocated, after administrative
 expenses, for distance education equipment and incentives pursuant
 to sections 79-1336 and 79-1337.

(f) For fiscal year 2009-10, the Education Innovation 5 Fund shall be allocated as follows: Any amounts transferred to the 6 7 Education Innovation Fund from the School District Reorganization 8 Fund shall be returned to the School District Reorganization Fund 9 first, the next one million dollars shall be transferred to the 10 Excellence in Teaching Cash Fund to fund the Excellence in Teaching 11 Act, and the amount remaining in the Education Innovation Fund 12 shall be allocated, after administrative expenses, for distance 13 education equipment and incentives pursuant to sections 79-1336 and 79-1337. 14

15 (g) For fiscal years 2010-11 through 2015-16, the 16 Education Innovation Fund shall be allocated as follows: The first 17 one million dollars shall be transferred to the Excellence in 18 Teaching Cash Fund to fund the Excellence in Teaching Act, and 19 the amount remaining in the Education Innovation Fund shall be 20 allocated, after administrative expenses, for distance education 21 equipment and incentives pursuant to sections 79-1336 and 79-1337.

(h) For fiscal year 2016-17 and each fiscal year
thereafter, the Education Innovation Fund shall be allocated,
after administrative expenses, for education purposes as provided
by the Legislature.

1 <u>(i) The State Treasurer shall transfer ten million</u> 2 <u>dollars from the Education Innovation Fund to the University</u> 3 <u>Cash Fund on or before December 31, 2009, as directed by the</u> 4 <u>budget administrator of the budget division of the Department of</u> 5 Administrative Services.

6 (5) Any money in the State Lottery Operation Trust 7 Fund, the State Lottery Operation Cash Fund, the State Lottery 8 Prize Trust Fund, or the Education Innovation Fund available 9 for investment shall be invested by the state investment officer 10 pursuant to the Nebraska Capital Expansion Act and the Nebraska 11 State Funds Investment Act.

12 (6) Unclaimed prize money on a winning lottery ticket 13 shall be retained for a period of time prescribed by rules and 14 regulations. If no claim is made within such period, the prize 15 money shall be used at the discretion of the Tax Commissioner for 16 any of the purposes prescribed in this section.

Sec. 2. Section 71-5714, Revised Statutes Cumulative
Supplement, 2008, is amended to read:

71-5714 19 The Tobacco Prevention and Control Cash Fund is created. The fund shall be used for a comprehensive 20 21 statewide tobacco-related public health program administered by 22 the Department of Health and Human Services which includes, but 23 is not limited to (1) community programs to reduce tobacco use, 24 (2) chronic disease programs, (3) school programs, (4) statewide programs, (5) enforcement, (6) counter marketing, (7) cessation 25

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programs, (8) surveillance and evaluation, and (9) administration.
Any money in the Tobacco Prevention and Control Cash Fund available
for investment shall be invested by the state investment officer
pursuant to the Nebraska Capital Expansion Act and the Nebraska
State Funds Investment Act.

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6 <u>The State Treasurer shall transfer, on or before June</u> 7 <u>30, 2010, as directed by the budget administrator of the budget</u> 8 <u>division of the Department of Administrative Services, one million</u> 9 <u>three hundred thousand dollars from the Tobacco Prevention and</u> 10 Control Cash Fund to the Health and Human Services Cash Fund.

Sec. 3. Section 72-1001, Revised Statutes Cumulative
Supplement, 2008, is amended to read:

13 72-1001 The Nebraska Capital Construction Fund is created. The fund shall consist of revenue and transfers credited 14 15 to the fund as authorized by law. Money shall be appropriated 16 from the fund to state agencies for making payments on projects as determined by the Legislature, including, but not limited to, 17 18 purchases of land, structural improvements to land, acquisition 19 of buildings, construction of buildings, including architectural and engineering costs, replacement of or major repairs to 20 21 structural improvements to land or buildings, additions to existing 22 structures, remodeling of buildings, and acquisition of equipment 23 and furnishings of new or remodeled buildings. The fund shall 24 be administered by the State Treasurer as a multiple-agency-use 25 fund and appropriated to state agencies as determined by the

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Legislature. Any money in the fund available for investment
 shall be invested by the state investment officer pursuant to
 the Nebraska Capital Expansion Act and the Nebraska State Funds
 Investment Act.

5 <u>The State Treasurer shall transfer four million five</u> 6 <u>hundred seventy-four thousand four hundred sixty-six dollars from</u> 7 <u>the Nebraska Capital Construction Fund to the General Fund on</u> 8 <u>or before June 30, 2010, on such date as directed by the</u> 9 <u>budget administrator of the budget division of the Department</u> 10 of Administrative Services.

Sec. 4. Section 77-3,111, Reissue Revised Statutes of
Nebraska, is amended to read:

13 77-3,111 There is hereby created a fund to be known 14 as the Miscellaneous Services Revolving Fund to which shall 15 be credited all money received by the Department of Revenue 16 for services performed and billed to other agencies or persons. All reimbursements to the department for such services shall be 17 18 credited to the fund and expenditures therefrom shall be made only 19 when such funds are available. The Department of Revenue shall only 20 bill for the actual amount expended in performing such services.

21 Any money in the fund shall be administered by the 22 Department of Revenue, and any money in the fund available for 23 investment shall be invested by the state investment officer 24 pursuant to the Nebraska Capital Expansion Act and the Nebraska 25 State Funds Investment Act.

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1 The entire amount in the Miscellaneous Services Revolving 2 Fund shall lapse to the General Fund on December 15, 2009. 3 Sec. 5. The State Treasurer shall transfer \$214,008 from the Agricultural Alcohol Fuel Tax Fund to the Ethanol Production 4 Incentive Cash Fund on or before June 30, 2010, on such date as 5 6 directed by the budget administrator of the budget division of the 7 Department of Administrative Services, pursuant to section 66-1334. 8 Sec. 6. The State Treasurer shall transfer \$28,016 from 9 the Agricultural Alcohol Fuel Tax Fund to the Ethanol Production 10 Incentive Cash Fund on or before June 30, 2011, on such date as 11 directed by the budget administrator of the budget division of the 12 Department of Administrative Services, pursuant to section 66-1334. 13 Sec. 7. Section 84-612, Revised Statutes Supplement, 14 2009, is amended to read: 15 84-612 (1) There is hereby created within the state 16 treasury a fund known as the Cash Reserve Fund which shall be under the direction of the State Treasurer. The fund shall only be used 17

18 pursuant to this section.

19 (2) The State Treasurer shall transfer funds from the 20 Cash Reserve Fund to the General Fund upon certification by the 21 Director of Administrative Services that the current cash balance 22 in the General Fund is inadequate to meet current obligations. Such 23 certification shall include the dollar amount to be transferred. 24 Any transfers made pursuant to this subsection shall be reversed 25 upon notification by the Director of Administrative Services that

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1 sufficient funds are available.

2 (3) The State Treasurer, at the direction of the 3 budget administrator of the budget division of the Department 4 of Administrative Services, shall transfer such amounts not to 5 exceed seven million seven hundred fifty-three thousand two hundred 6 sixty-three dollars in total from the Cash Reserve Fund to the 7 Nebraska Capital Construction Fund between July 1, 2003, and June 8 30, 2007.

9 (4) The State Treasurer, at the direction of the budget 10 administrator, shall transfer an amount equal to the total amount 11 transferred pursuant to subsection (3) of this section from the 12 General Fund to the Cash Reserve Fund on or before June 30, 2008.

(5) In addition to receiving transfers from other funds,
the Cash Reserve Fund shall receive federal funds received by the
State of Nebraska for undesignated general government purposes,
federal revenue sharing, or general fiscal relief of the state.

17 (6) On June 15, 2009, the State Treasurer shall transfer
18 four million nine hundred ninety thousand five hundred five dollars
19 from the Cash Reserve Fund to the General Fund.

20 (7) On or before June 16, 2009, the State Treasurer, at 21 the direction of the budget administrator, shall transfer fifty 22 million dollars from the Cash Reserve Fund to the General Fund.

(8) The State Treasurer, at the direction of the budget
administrator, shall transfer such amounts, as certified by the
Director of Administrative Services, for employee health insurance

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claims and expenses, not to exceed twelve million dollars in total

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2 from the Cash Reserve Fund to the State Employees Insurance Fund 3 between May 1, 2007, and June 30, 2011. (9) On July 9, 2007, the State Treasurer shall transfer 4 5 five million dollars from the Cash Reserve Fund to the Job Training Cash Fund. The State Treasurer shall transfer from the Job Training 6 7 Cash Fund to the Cash Reserve Fund such amounts as directed in 8 section 81-1201.21. 9 (10) On July 7, 2008, the State Treasurer shall transfer 10 five million dollars from the Cash Reserve Fund to the Job Training 11 Cash Fund. The State Treasurer shall transfer from the Job Training 12 Cash Fund to the Cash Reserve Fund such amounts as directed in 13 section 81-1201.21.

14 (11) On or before June 30, 2009, the State Treasurer
15 shall transfer nine million five hundred ninety thousand dollars
16 from the Cash Reserve Fund to the Nebraska Capital Construction
17 Fund.

18 (12) The State Treasurer, at the direction of the budget 19 administrator, shall transfer an amount equal to the total amount 20 transferred pursuant to subsection (8) of this section from the 21 appropriate health insurance accounts of the State Employees 22 Insurance Fund in such amounts as certified by the Director of 23 Administrative Services to the Cash Reserve Fund on or before June 24 30, 2011.

25 (13) On July 7, 2009, the State Treasurer shall transfer

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1 five million dollars from the Cash Reserve Fund to the Roads
2 Operations Cash Fund. The Department of Roads shall use such
3 funds to provide the required state match for federal funding made
4 available to the state through congressional earmarks.

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5 (14) On July 7, 2010, the State Treasurer shall transfer 6 five million dollars from the Cash Reserve Fund to the Roads 7 Operations Cash Fund. The Department of Roads shall use such 8 funds to provide the required state match for federal funding made 9 available to the state through congressional earmarks.

10 (15) On July 7, 2011, the State Treasurer shall transfer 11 five million dollars from the Cash Reserve Fund to the Roads 12 Operations Cash Fund. The Department of Roads shall use such 13 funds to provide the required state match for federal funding made 14 available to the state through congressional earmarks.

15 (16) (14) Within five days after the budget division 16 of the Department of Administrative Services notifies the State 17 Treasurer that matching fund requirements under section 82-331 have 18 been met, the State Treasurer shall transfer one million dollars 19 from the Cash Reserve Fund to the Nebraska Cultural Preservation 20 Endowment Fund.

21 (17) (15) On or before June 15, 2010, the State
22 Treasurer, at the direction of the budget administrator, shall
23 transfer ninety-five one hundred five million dollars from the Cash
24 Reserve Fund to the General Fund.

25 (18) (16) On or before June 15, 2011, the State

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Treasurer, at the direction of the budget administrator, shall
 transfer one hundred fifty-one million dollars from the Cash
 Reserve Fund to the General Fund.

4 (19) (17) On June 15, 2009, the State Treasurer shall
5 transfer seven million five hundred thousand dollars from the Cash
6 Reserve Fund to the Governor's Emergency Cash Fund.

7 (20) (18) On July 7, 2009, the State Treasurer shall 8 transfer one million dollars from the Cash Reserve Fund to the 9 State Visitors Promotion Cash Fund. The Department of Economic 10 Development shall use such funds to provide funding for the 11 promotion and support of the hosting of a Special Olympics national 12 event by a city of the primary class.

13 Sec. 8. Original section 77-3,111, Reissue Revised 14 Statutes of Nebraska, sections 71-5714 and 72-1001, Revised 15 Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2008, and sections 9-812 and 16 84-612, Revised Statutes Supplement, 2009, are repealed.

Sec. 9. The following section is outright repealed:
Section 90-505, Revised Statutes Supplement, 2009.

Sec. 10. Since an emergency exists, this act takes effectwhen passed and approved according to law.
