1	FOR AN ACT relating to schools; to amend sections 79-248, 79-249,
2	79-250, and 79-252, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska;
3	to change provisions relating to health inspections; to
4	authorize the gathering, analysis, and sharing of school
5	health data; and to repeal the original sections.
6	Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

Section 1. Section 79-248, Reissue Revised Statutes of
 Nebraska, is amended to read:

LB 713

3 79-248 Every school district shall cause every child children under its jurisdiction to be separately and carefully 4 inspected, except as otherwise provided in this section, to 5 ascertain if such a child is suffering from (1) defective sight or 6 7 hearing, (2) dental defects, or (3) other conditions as prescribed 8 by the Department of Health and Human Services. Such inspections 9 shall be conducted on a schedule prescribed by the department and 10 shall be based on current medical and public health practice. If 11 such inspection determines that any child has such condition, the 12 school shall notify the parent of the child in writing of such 13 condition and explain to such parent the necessity of professional 14 attendance for such child. Whenever a child apparently shows 15 symptoms of any contagious or infectious disease, such child shall 16 be sent home immediately or as soon as safe and proper conveyance 17 can be found and the proper school authority, school board, or 18 board of education shall be at once notified. Such student may 19 be excluded from school as provided in section 79-264. No child 20 shall be compelled to submit to a physical examination other than 21 the inspection by the school over the written objection of his 22 or her parent or guardian delivered to the school authorities. 23 Such objection does not exempt the child from the quarantine laws of the state and does not prohibit an examination for infectious 24 25 or contagious diseases. A child shall not be required to submit

to an inspection required by this section if his or her parent 1 2 or guardian provides school authorities with a statement signed 3 by a physician, a physician assistant, or an advanced practice registered nurse practicing under and in accordance with his or 4 her respective credentialing act or other qualified provider as 5 identified by the department in rules and regulations adopted 6 pursuant to section 79-249, stating that such child has undergone 7 8 such required inspection within the past six months. A child shall 9 submit to any required inspection for which such a statement is not 10 received.

Sec. 2. Section 79-249, Reissue Revised Statutes of
Nebraska, is amended to read:

79-249 The Department of Health and Human Services shall 13 14 adopt and promulgate rules and regulations for conducting school 15 health inspections, the qualifications of the person or persons authorized to make such inspections, and the health conditions to 16 be observed and remedied and shall furnish to school authorities 17 18 the rules and regulations and other useful materials for carrying out the purposes of sections 79-248 to 79-253. The department may 19 20 make available to schools methods for the gathering, analysis, and 21 sharing of school health data that do not violate any privacy laws. 22 On and after July 1, 1999, no staff member of any school shall administer medication unless the school complies with the 23 24 applicable requirements of the Medication Aide Act. Notwithstanding 25 any other provision, nothing in the act shall be construed to

require any school to employ or use a school nurse or medication
 aide in order to be in compliance with the act.

3 Sec. 3. Section 79-250, Reissue Revised Statutes of
4 Nebraska, is amended to read:

5 79-250 During the first quarter of each school year the 6 school district shall provide the inspections required by section 7 79-248 for the children then in attendance. As children enter 8 school during the year, such inspections must be made immediately 9 shall be confirmed upon their entrance.

Sec. 4. Section 79-252, Reissue Revised Statutes of
Nebraska, is amended to read:

12 79-252 The In lieu of conducting the inspections required 13 by section 79-248, the board of education or school board of 14 any school district may employ regularly licensed physicians to 15 make physical examinations or inspections in lieu of school health 16 inspections required by section 79-248. such inspections.

Sec. 5. Original sections 79-248, 79-249, 79-250, and
79-252, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, are repealed.
