#### A BILL

1	FOR AN ACT relating to wildlife management; to amend sections
2	37-448 and 37-559, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska,
3	and sections 37-201 and 37-523, Revised Statutes
4	Supplement, 2009; to authorize the extension of existing
5	deer hunting seasons as prescribed; to change certain
6	hunting and trapping restrictions; to provide for the
7	destruction of mountain lions and other predators as
8	prescribed; to define a term; to provide for permits and
9	the use of certain fees; to harmonize provisions; and to
10	repeal the original sections.
11	Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1 Section 1. Section 37-201, Revised Statutes Supplement,

- 2 2009, is amended to read:
- 3 37-201 Sections 37-201 to 37-811 and section 5 of this
- 4 act shall be known and may be cited as the Game Law.
- 5 Sec. 2. Section 37-448, Reissue Revised Statutes of
- 6 Nebraska, is amended to read:
- 7 37-448 (1) Subject to rules and regulations adopted and
- 8 promulgated by the commission, the secretary of the commission
- 9 may designate special deer depredation seasons or extensions of
- 10 existing deer hunting seasons by executive order. The secretary
- 11 may designate a depredation season or an extension of an existing
- 12 <u>deer hunting season</u> whenever he or she determines that deer are
- 13 causing excessive property damage. The secretary shall specify the
- 14 number of permits to be issued, the species of deer allowed to be
- 15 taken, the bag limit for such species, the beginning and ending
- 16 dates for the depredation season or hunting season extension,
- 17 shooting hours, the length of the depredation season or hunting
- 18 season extension, and the geographic area in which hunting will be
- 19 permitted. Each such permit shall give the holder the right to take
- 20 one deer. Hunting during a special depredation season or hunting
- 21 season extension shall be limited to residents, and the rules and
- 22 regulations shall be restricted to firearms which are allow use of
- 23 any weapon permissible for use during the regular deer season.
- 24 (2) The depredation season may commence not less than
- 25 five days after the first public announcement that the depredation

1 season has been established. Permits shall be issued beginning

- 2 not less than three days after the first public announcement of
- 3 the depredation season and shall be issued in an impartial manner
- 4 at a location determined by the secretary. The commission shall,
- 5 pursuant to section 37-327, establish and charge a fee of not more
- 6 than twenty-five dollars for a special depredation season permit.
- 7 Fifty percent of the fee shall be paid by the commission to a
- 8 landowner or operator within the designated area upon satisfactory
- 9 proof a deer was killed upon his or her farm or ranch during the
- 10 special depredation season. The commission shall use the income
- 11 from the sale of special depredation season permits for abatement
- 12 of damage caused by deer. The commission shall also provide for
- 13 an unlimited number of free permits for the taking of antlerless
- 14 deer upon request to any person owning or operating at least twenty
- 15 acres of farm or ranch land within the geographic area in which
- 16 hunting will be permitted and to any member of the immediate family
- 17 of any such person as defined in subdivision (2)(a) of section
- 18 37-455. A free permit shall be valid only within such area and
- 19 only during the designated deer depredation season. Receipt of a
- 20 depredation season permit shall not in any way affect a person's
- 21 eligibility for a regular season permit.
- 22 Sec. 3. Section 37-523, Revised Statutes Supplement,
- 23 2009, is amended to read:
- 24 37-523 (1) It shall be unlawful to hunt with a rifle
- 25 within a two-hundred-yard radius of an inhabited dwelling or

1 <u>livestock feedlot</u>, to hunt without a rifle or trap any form of

- 2 wild mammal or wild bird within a two-hundred-yard one-hundred-yard
- 3 radius of an inhabited dwelling or livestock feedlot, or to trap
- 4 within a two-hundred-yard radius of any passage used by livestock
- 5 to pass under any highway, road, or bridge.
- 6 (2) This section shall not prohibit any owner, tenant, or
- 7 operator or his or her guests from hunting or trapping any form of
- 8 wild mammal or wild bird within such radius if the area is under
- 9 his or her ownership or control. This section shall not prohibit
- 10 duly authorized personnel of any county, city, or village health or
- 11 animal control department from trapping with a humane live box trap
- 12 or pursuing any form of wild mammal or wild bird, when conducting
- 13 such activities within the scope of the authorization, within such
- 14 radius if the area is under the jurisdiction of the county, city,
- 15 or village.
- 16 (3) Any person violating this section shall be guilty of
- 17 a Class III misdemeanor and shall be fined at least one hundred
- 18 dollars upon conviction.
- 19 Sec. 4. Section 37-559, Reissue Revised Statutes of
- 20 Nebraska, is amended to read:
- 21 37-559 (1) Any farmer or rancher owning or operating a
- 22 farm or ranch may destroy or have destroyed any predator preying
- 23 on livestock or poultry or causing other agricultural depredation
- 24 on land owned or controlled by him or her without a permit issued
- 25 by the commission. For purposes of this subsection, predator means

1 a badger, bobcat, coyote, gray fox, long-tailed weasel, mink,

- 2 opossum, raccoon, red fox, or skunk.
- 3 (2) Any farmer or rancher owning or operating a farm or
- 4 ranch, or his or her agent, may kill a mountain lion immediately
- 5 without prior notice to or permission from the commission if he
- 6 or she encounters a mountain lion and the mountain lion is in
- 7 the process of stalking, killing, or consuming livestock on the
- 8 farmer's or rancher's property. The farmer or rancher or his or her
- 9 agent shall be responsible for immediately notifying the commission
- 10 and arranging with the commission to transfer the mountain lion to
- 11 the commission.
- 12 (3) Any person shall be entitled to defend himself or
- 13 herself or another person without penalty if, in the presence of
- 14 such person, a mountain lion stalks, attacks, or shows unprovoked
- 15 aggression toward such person or another person.
- 16 (2) (4) This section shall not be construed to allow
- 17 such a farmer or rancher or his or her agent to destroy or have
- 18 destroyed species which are protected by the provisions of sections
- 19 37-314 and 37-501 to 37-503, the Nongame and Endangered Species
- 20 Conservation Act or rules and regulations adopted and promulgated
- 21 under the act, the federal Endangered Species Act of 1973, as
- 22 amended, 16 U.S.C. 1531 et seq., the federal Fish and Wildlife
- 23 Coordination Act, as amended, 16 U.S.C. 661 et seq., the federal
- 24 Bald and Golden Eagle Protection Act, as amended, 16 U.S.C. 668 et
- 25 seq., the federal Migratory Bird Treaty Act, as amended, 16 U.S.C.

1 703 et seq., or rules and regulations adopted and promulgated

- 2 pursuant to such provisions. federal regulations under such federal
- 3 acts.
- 4 Sec. 5. (1) The commission may issue a permit for
- 5 the killing of one or more mountain lions which are preying on
- 6 livestock or poultry. The permit shall be valid for up to thirty
- 7 days and shall require the commission to be notified immediately
- 8 by the permitholder after the killing of a mountain lion and shall
- 9 require the carcass to be transferred to the commission.
- 10 (2) To be eligible for a permit under this section, a
- 11 farmer or rancher owning or operating a farm or ranch shall contact
- 12 the commission to confirm that livestock or poultry on his or her
- 13 property or property under his or her control has been subject
- 14 to depredation by a mountain lion. The commission shall confirm
- 15 that the damage was caused by a mountain lion prior to issuing
- 16 the permit. The farmer or rancher shall be allowed up to thirty
- 17 days, as designated by the commission, to kill the mountain lion
- 18 on such property and shall notify the commission immediately after
- 19 the killing of a mountain lion and arrange with the commission to
- 20 transfer the mountain lion to the commission.
- 21 (3) The commission may adopt and promulgate rules and
- 22 regulations to carry out this section.
