A BILL

- 1 FOR AN ACT relating to highways; to amend sections 39-204,
 2 39-205, and 39-210, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska;
 3 to redefine terms; to change requirements for a
 4 specific information sign panel; to provide minimum
 5 requirements for farm wineries as prescribed; to change
 6 requirements for tourist-oriented directional sign
 7 panels; to harmonize provisions; and to repeal the
 8 original sections.
- 9 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1 Section 1. Section 39-204, Reissue Revised Statutes of

- 2 Nebraska, is amended to read:
- 3 39-204 (1) Signs, displays, and devices giving specific
- 4 information of interest to the traveling public shall be erected
- 5 by or at the direction of the Department of Roads and maintained
- 6 within the right-of-way at appropriate distances from interchanges
- 7 on the National System of Interstate and Defense Highways and from
- 8 roads of the state primary system as shall conform with the rules
- 9 and regulations adopted and promulgated by the department to carry
- 10 out this section and section 39-205. Such rules and regulations
- 11 shall be consistent with national standards promulgated from time
- 12 to time by the appropriate authority of the federal government
- 13 pursuant to 23 U.S.C. 131(f).
- 14 (2) For purposes of this section, specific information of
- 15 interest to the traveling public shall mean only information about
- 16 camping, lodging, food, attractions, and motor fuel and associated
- 17 services, including trade names.
- 18 (3) The minimum service that is required to be available
- 19 for each type of service shall include:
- 20 (a) Motor fuel services including:
- 21 (i) Vehicle services, which shall include fuel, oil, tire
- 22 repair, and water;
- 23 (ii) Restroom facilities and drinking water;
- 24 (iii) Continuous operation of such services for at least
- 25 sixteen hours per day, seven days per week, for freeways and

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1 expressways and continuous operation of such services for at least

- 2 twelve hours per day, seven days per week, for conventional roads;
- 3 and
- 4 (iv) Telephone services;
- 5 (b) Attraction services including:
- 6 (i) An attraction of regional significance with the
- 7 primary purpose of providing amusement, historical, cultural, or
- 8 <u>leisure activity to the public;</u>
- 9 (ii) Restroom facilities and drinking water; and
- 10 (iii) Adequate parking accommodations;
- 11 (b) (c) Food services including:
- 12 (i) Licensing or approval of such services, when
- 13 required;
- 14 (ii) Continuous operation of such services to serve three
- 15 at least two meals per day, seven six days per week; and
- 16 (iii) Modern sanitary facilities; and
- 17 (iv) Telephone services;
- 18 (c) (d) Lodging services including:
- 19 (i) Licensing or approval of such services, when
- 20 required;
- 21 (ii) Adequate sleeping accommodations; and
- 22 (iii) Telephone services; and
- 23 (d) (e) Camping services including:
- 24 (i) Licensing or approval of such services, when
- 25 required;

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- 1 (ii) Adequate parking accommodations; and
- 2 (iii) Modern sanitary facilities and drinking water.
- 3 Sec. 2. Section 39-205, Reissue Revised Statutes of
- 4 Nebraska, is amended to read:
- 5 39-205 (1) Applicants for business signs shall furnish
- 6 business signs to the Department of Roads and shall pay to the
- 7 department an annual fee for posting each business sign and the
- 8 actual cost of material for, fabrication of, and erecting the
- 9 specific information sign panels where specific information sign
- 10 panels have not been installed.
- 11 (2) Upon receipt of the business signs and the annual
- 12 fee, the department shall post or cause to be posted the business
- 13 signs where specific information sign panels have been installed.
- 14 The applicant shall not be required to remove any advertising
- 15 device to qualify for a business sign except any advertising device
- 16 which was unlawfully erected or in violation of section 39-202,
- 17 39-203, 39-204, 39-205, 39-206, 39-215, 39-216, or 39-220, any rule
- 18 or regulation of the department, or any federal rule or regulation
- 19 relating to informational signs. The specific information sign
- 20 panels and business signs shall conform to the requirements of
- 21 the Federal Beautification Act and the Manual on Uniform Traffic
- 22 Control Devices adopted pursuant to section 60-6,118.
- 23 (3) All revenue received for the posting or erecting
- 24 of business signs or specific information sign panels pursuant to
- 25 this section shall be deposited in the Highway Cash Fund, except

1 that any revenue received from the annual fee and for posting

- 2 or erecting such signs in excess of the state's costs shall be
- 3 deposited in the General Fund.
- 4 (4) For purposes of this section, unless the context
- 5 otherwise requires:
- 6 (a) Business sign shall mean means a sign displaying
- 7 a commercial brand, symbol, trademark, or name, or combination
- 8 thereof, designating a motorist service. Business signs shall be
- 9 mounted on a rectangular information panel; and
- 10 (b) Specific information sign panel shall mean means a
- 11 rectangular sign panel with:
- 12 (i) The word gas, food, attraction, lodging, or camping;
- 13 (ii) Directional information; and
- 14 (iii) One or more business signs.
- 15 (5) The department shall provide notice of space
- 16 available for business signs on any specific information sign panel
- 17 at least ninety days prior to accepting or approving the posting
- 18 of any business sign.
- 19 Sec. 3. Section 39-210, Reissue Revised Statutes of
- 20 Nebraska, is amended to read:
- 21 39-210 To qualify to appear on a tourist-oriented
- 22 directional sign panel, an activity shall be licensed and approved
- 23 by the state and local agencies if required by law and be open
- 24 to the public at least eight hours per day, five days per week,
- 25 including Saturdays or Sundays, during the normal season of the

1 activity, except that if the activity is a winery, the winery

- 2 shall be open at least twenty hours per week. The activity,
- 3 before qualifying to appear on a sign panel, shall provide to
- 4 the Department of Roads assurance of its conformity with all
- 5 applicable laws relating to discrimination based on race, creed,
- 6 color, sex, national origin, ancestry, political affiliation, or
- 7 religion. If the activity violates any of such laws, it shall
- 8 lose its eligibility to appear on a tourist-oriented directional
- 9 sign panel. In addition, the qualifying activity shall be required
- 10 to remove any advertising device which was unlawfully erected or
- 11 which is in violation of section 39-202, 39-203, 39-204, 39-205,
- 12 39-206, 39-215, 39-216, or 39-220, any rule or regulation of
- 13 the department, or any federal rule or regulation relating to
- 14 tourist-oriented directional sign panels. The tourist-oriented
- 15 directional sign panels shall conform to the requirements of the
- 16 Federal Beautification Act and the Manual on Uniform Traffic
- 17 Control Devices as adopted pursuant to section 60-6,118.
- 18 Sec. 4. Original sections 39-204, 39-205, and 39-210,
- 19 Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, are repealed.
