1	FOR AN ACT relating to schools; to amend sections 79-703 and
2	79-757, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, and section
3	79-318, Revised Statutes Supplement, 2009; to change
4	duties of the State Board of Education; to provide for
5	performance measures and priority schools pursuant to
6	the Quality Education Accountability Act; to harmonize
7	provisions; and to repeal the original sections.
8	Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

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Section 1. Section 79-318, Revised Statutes Supplement,

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Section 1. Section 79-318, Revised Statutes Supplement
 2009, is amended to read:

79-318 The State Board of Education shall:

4 (1) Appoint and fix the compensation of the Commissioner5 of Education;

6 (2) Remove the commissioner from office at any time for 7 conviction of any crime involving moral turpitude or felonious act, 8 for inefficiency, or for willful and continuous disregard of his or 9 her duties as commissioner or of the directives of the board;

10 (3) Upon recommendation of the commissioner, appoint and
11 fix the compensation of a deputy commissioner and all professional
12 employees of the board;

(4) Organize the State Department of Education into such
divisions, branches, or sections as may be necessary or desirable
to perform all its proper functions and to render maximum service
to the board and to the state school system;

17 (5) Provide, through the commissioner and his or her 18 professional staff, enlightened professional leadership, guidance, 19 and supervision of the state school system, including educational 20 service units. In order that the commissioner and his or her 21 staff may carry out their duties, the board shall, through the 22 commissioner: (a) Provide supervisory and consultation services 23 to the schools of the state; (b) issue materials helpful in the development, maintenance, and improvement of educational facilities 24 25 and programs; (c) establish rules and regulations which govern

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standards and procedures for the approval and legal operation of 1 2 all schools in the state and for the accreditation of all schools 3 requesting state accreditation. All public, school districts shall comply with the accreditation requirements prescribed in the 4 Quality Education Accountability Act, this section, and section 5 79-703, and all private, denominational, or parochial schools shall 6 7 either comply with the accreditation or approval requirements 8 prescribed in this section and section 79-703 or, for those schools 9 which elect not to meet accreditation or approval requirements, the 10 requirements prescribed in subsections (2) through (6) of section 11 79-1601. Standards and procedures for approval and accreditation 12 shall be based upon the program of studies, guidance services, the 13 number and preparation of teachers in relation to the curriculum 14 and enrollment, instructional materials and equipment, science 15 facilities and equipment, library facilities and materials, and 16 health and safety factors in buildings and grounds. Rules and 17 regulations which govern standards and procedures for private, 18 denominational, and parochial schools which elect, pursuant to 19 the procedures prescribed in subsections (2) through (6) of 20 section 79-1601, not to meet state accreditation or approval 21 requirements shall be as described in such section; (d) institute 22 a statewide system of testing to determine the degree of 23 achievement and accomplishment of all the students within the 24 state's school systems if it determines such testing would be 25 advisable; as required by the Quality Education Accountability

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Act; (e) prescribe a uniform system of records and accounting for 1 2 keeping adequate educational and financial records, for gathering 3 and reporting necessary educational data, and for evaluating educational progress; (f) cause to be published laws, rules, and 4 5 regulations governing the schools and the school lands and funds 6 with explanatory notes for the quidance of those charged with the 7 administration of the schools of the state; (g) approve teacher 8 education programs conducted in Nebraska postsecondary educational 9 institutions designed for the purpose of certificating teachers 10 and administrators; (h) approve teacher certificated employee 11 evaluation policies and procedures developed by school districts 12 and educational service units; and (i) approve general plans and 13 adopt educational policies, standards, rules, and regulations for 14 carrying out the board's responsibilities and those assigned to the 15 State Department of Education by the Legislature;

16 (6) Adopt and promulgate rules and regulations for the guidance, supervision, accreditation, and coordination of 17 18 educational service units. Such rules and regulations for 19 accreditation shall include, but not be limited to, (a) a 20 requirement that programs and services offered to school districts 21 by each educational service unit shall be evaluated on a regular 22 basis, but not less than every seven years, to assure that 23 educational service units remain responsive to school district 24 needs and (b) guidelines for the use and management of funds 25 generated from the property tax levy and from other sources of

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1 revenue as may be available to the educational service units,
2 to assure that public funds are used to accomplish the purposes
3 and goals assigned to the educational service units by section
4 79-1204. The State Board of Education shall establish procedures to
5 encourage the coordination of activities among educational service
6 units and to encourage effective and efficient educational service
7 delivery on a statewide basis;

8 (7) Submit a biennial report to the Governor and the 9 Clerk of the Legislature covering the actions of the board, the 10 operations of the State Department of Education, and the progress 11 and needs of the schools and recommend such legislation as may be 12 necessary to satisfy these needs;

(8) Prepare and distribute reports designed to acquaint
school district officers, teachers, and patrons of the schools with
the conditions and needs of the schools;

16 (9) Provide for consultation with professional educators 17 and lay leaders for the purpose of securing advice deemed necessary 18 in the formulation of policies and in the effectual discharge of 19 its duties;

(10) Make studies, investigations, and reports and
assemble information as necessary for the formulation of policies,
for making plans, for evaluating the state school program, and for
making essential and adequate reports;

(11) Submit to the Governor and the Legislature abudget necessary to finance the state school program under its

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jurisdiction, including the internal operation and maintenance of
 the State Department of Education;

3 (12) Interpret its own policies, standards, rules, and
4 regulations and, upon reasonable request, hear complaints and
5 disputes arising therefrom;

6 (13) With the advice of the Department of Motor Vehicles, 7 adopt and promulgate rules and regulations containing reasonable 8 standards, not inconsistent with existing statutes, governing: (a) 9 The general design, equipment, color, operation, and maintenance 10 of any vehicle with a manufacturer's rated seating capacity of 11 eleven or more passengers used for the transportation of public, 12 private, denominational, or parochial school students; and (b) 13 the equipment, operation, and maintenance of any vehicle with a 14 capacity of ten or less passengers used for the transportation of 15 public, private, denominational, or parochial school students, when 16 such vehicles are owned, operated, or owned and operated by any public, private, denominational, or parochial school or privately 17 18 owned or operated under contract with any such school in this 19 state, except for vehicles owned by individuals operating a school 20 which elects pursuant to section 79-1601 not to meet accreditation 21 or approval requirements. Similar rules and regulations shall be 22 adopted and promulgated for operators of such vehicles as provided 23 in section 79-607;

24 (14) Accept, on behalf of the Nebraska Center for the
25 Education of Children who are Blind or Visually Impaired, devises

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1 of real property or donations or bequests of other property, or 2 both, if in its judgment any such devise, donation, or bequest 3 is for the best interest of the center or the students receiving 4 services from the center, or both, and irrigate or otherwise 5 improve any such real estate when in the board's judgment it would 6 be advisable to do so; and

7 (15) Upon acceptance of any devise, donation, or bequest 8 as provided in this section, administer and carry out such devise, 9 donation, or bequest in accordance with the terms and conditions 10 thereof. If not prohibited by the terms and conditions of any such 11 devise, donation, or bequest, the board may sell, convey, exchange, 12 or lease property so devised, donated, or bequeathed upon such 13 terms and conditions as it deems best and remit all money derived from any such sale or lease to the State Treasurer for credit to 14 15 the State Department of Education Trust Fund.

16 Each member of the Legislature shall receive a copy of 17 the report required by subdivision (7) of this section by making a 18 request for it to the commissioner.

19 None of the duties prescribed in this section shall 20 prevent the board from exercising such other duties as in its 21 judgment may be necessary for the proper and legal exercise of its 22 obligations.

23 Sec. 2. Section 79-703, Reissue Revised Statutes of
24 Nebraska, is amended to read:

25 79-703 (1) To ensure both equality of opportunity

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and quality of programs offered, all public schools school 1 2 districts in the state shall be required to meet quality and 3 performance-based approval or accreditation standards as prescribed by the State Board of Education and shall comply with the 4 5 requirements of the Quality Education Accountability Act. The board shall establish a core curriculum standard, which shall include 6 7 multicultural education and vocational education courses, for all 8 public schools in the state. Accreditation and approval standards 9 shall be designed to assure effective schooling and quality of 10 instructional programs regardless of school size, wealth, or 11 geographic location. The board shall recognize and encourage the 12 maximum use of cooperative programs and may provide for approval 13 or accreditation of programs on a cooperative basis, including the 14 sharing of administrative and instructional staff, between school 15 districts for the purpose of meeting the approval and accreditation requirements established pursuant to this section and section 16 17 79-318.

18 (2) The Commissioner of Education shall appoint an
19 accreditation committee which shall be representative of the
20 educational institutions and agencies of the state and shall
21 include as a member the director of admissions of the University of
22 Nebraska.

(3) The accreditation committee shall be responsible
for: (a) Recommending appropriate standards and policies with
respect to the accreditation and classification of schools; and (b)

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making recommendations annually to the commissioner relative to the 1 2 accreditation and classification of individual schools. No school 3 shall be considered for accreditation status which has not first fulfilled all requirements for an approved school. 4 5 (4) By school year 1993-94 all public schools in the 6 state shall be accredited. 7 (5) It is the intent of the Legislature that all (4) 8 All public school students shall have access to all educational 9 services required of accredited schools. Such services may be 10 provided through cooperative programs or alternative methods of 11 delivery. 12 Sec. 3. Section 79-757, Reissue Revised Statutes of 13 Nebraska, is amended to read: 79-757 Sections 79-757 to 79-762 and section 4 of this 14 15 act shall be known and may be cited as the Quality Education 16 Accountability Act. Sec. 4. (1) On or before December 1, 2010, the State 17 18 Board of Education shall establish an index to be used to 19 measure the performance of individual public schools beginning with 20 school year 2012-13. The index shall combine multiple measures, 21 including, but not limited to, graduation rates, student growth and 22 performance on the assessments as provided in section 79-760.03, and other school performance indicators as established by the 23 24 board. The measures selected by the board for the index shall be 25 combined into a school performance score and district performance

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1 score.

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2	(2) The board shall establish levels for the index in
3	order to classify school performance, and the Commissioner of
4	Education shall establish an intervention team. Any school that
5	does not meet the minimum level of performance established by the
6	board shall be designated as a priority school. The school board
7	of a school district containing a priority school shall permit
8	the intervention team full access to the priority school, school
9	personnel of the priority school, the school district, school
10	district personnel, academic information, financial information,
11	and any other requested information. The intervention team, in
12	collaboration with the priority school and the district, shall
13	develop a progress plan for approval by the State Board of
14	Education. The progress plan shall include specific actions
15	required by the school and the district in order to remove its
16	classification as a priority school. Compliance with progress plans
17	shall be a requirement to maintain accreditation for any school
18	district that has at least one priority school.
19	(3) A progress plan is required for a school for each
20	year that it is classified as a priority school. The State
21	Board of Education shall annually review any progress plans and

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1 (4) The Commissioner of Education shall annually report 2 to the Governor, the Clerk of the Legislature, and the chairperson 3 of the Education Committee of the Legislature on all schools designated as priority schools. The report shall include the 4 name of the school, the grades included in the priority school 5 6 designation, the name of the school district, the years for which 7 the school was designated a priority school, a summary of the 8 progress plan, and the measurement of progress. 9 Sec. 5.
