## A BILL

- FOR AN ACT relating to coroners; to amend section 23-1824,

  Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska; to require a

  second coroner's opinion as prescribed; and to repeal

  the original section.
- 5 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

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1 Section 1. Section 23-1824, Reissue Revised Statutes of

- 2 Nebraska, is amended to read:
- 3 23-1824 (1) The county coroner or coroner's physician
- 4 shall perform, at county expense, an autopsy on any person less
- 5 than nineteen years of age who dies a sudden death, except that
- 6 no autopsy needs to be performed if (a) the death was caused
- 7 by a readily recognizable disease or the death occurred due to
- 8 trauma resulting from an accident and (b) the death did not occur
- 9 under suspicious circumstances. The Attorney General shall create.
- 10 by July 1, 2007, quidelines for county coroners or coroner's
- 11 physicians regarding autopsies on persons less than nineteen years
- 12 of age.
- 13 (2) The county coroner or coroner's physician shall
- 14 attempt to establish, by a reasonable degree of medical certainty,
- 15 the cause or causes of the death, and shall thereafter certify
- 16 the cause or causes of death to the county attorney. No cause of
- 17 death shall be certified as sudden infant death syndrome unless an
- 18 autopsy, a death scene investigation, and a review of the child's
- 19 medical history reveal no other possible cause. If the initial
- 20 autopsy establishes, by a reasonable degree of medical certainty,
- 21 that the death occurred under suspicious circumstances while such
- 22 person was in the care of a child care provider, a second opinion
- 23 regarding the cause or causes of death shall be required, at county
- 24 expense, by a qualified coroner or coroner's physician from a
- 25 <u>different county.</u>

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1 (3) A county may request reimbursement of up to fifty

- 2 percent of the cost of an autopsy from the Attorney General.
- 3 Reimbursement requests may include, but not be limited to, costs
- 4 for expert witnesses and complete autopsies, including toxicology
- 5 screens and tissue sample tests. The Attorney General shall place
- 6 an emphasis on autopsies of children five years of age and younger.
