A BILL

- FOR AN ACT relating to license plates; to amend sections 60-3,122,
 60-3,123, 60-3,124, and 60-3,125, Revised Statutes
 Cumulative Supplement, 2008; to provide for issuance
 of certain license plates to spouses of veterans as
 prescribed; and to repeal the original sections.
- 6 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1 Section 1. Section 60-3,122, Revised Statutes Cumulative

- 2 Supplement, 2008, is amended to read:
- 3 60-3,122 (1) Any person may, in addition to the
- 4 application required by section 60-385, apply to the department
- 5 for license plates designed by the department to indicate that he
- 6 or she is a survivor of the Japanese attack on Pearl Harbor if he
- 7 or she:
- 8 (a) Was a member of the United States Armed Forces on
- 9 December 7, 1941;
- 10 (b) Was on station on December 7, 1941, during the hours
- 11 of 7:55 a.m. to 9:45 a.m. Hawaii time at Pearl Harbor, the island
- 12 of Oahu, or offshore at a distance not to exceed three miles;
- 13 (c) Was discharged or otherwise separated with a
- 14 characterization of honorable from the United States Armed Forces;
- 15 and
- 16 (d) Holds a current membership in a Nebraska Chapter of
- 17 the Pearl Harbor Survivors Association.
- 18 (2) The license plates shall be issued upon the applicant
- 19 paying the regular license fee and an additional fee of five
- 20 dollars and furnishing proof satisfactory to the department that
- 21 the applicant fulfills the requirements provided by subsection (1)
- 22 of this section. The additional fee shall be remitted to the
- 23 State Treasurer for credit to the Highway Trust Fund. Only one
- 24 motor vehicle, trailer, semitrailer, or cabin trailer owned by the
- 25 applicant shall be so licensed at any one time. Motor vehicles

1 and trailers registered under section 60-3,198 shall not be so

- 2 licensed.
- 3 (3) The surviving spouse of a person who was issued
- 4 plates under this section may continue to use or apply for and
- 5 use the plates subject to registration of the vehicle in the
- 6 surviving spouse's name and upon payment of the appropriate fee. If
- 7 the surviving spouse remarries, the surviving spouse shall return
- 8 the plates to the department and the department, at no additional
- 9 charge, shall issue regular license plates to the surviving spouse.
- 10 (4) If the license plates issued pursuant to this
- 11 section are lost, stolen, or mutilated, the recipient of the plates
- 12 shall be issued replacement license plates upon request and without
- 13 charge.

- 15 Supplement, 2008, is amended to read:
- 16 60-3,123 (1) Any person who was captured and incarcerated
- 17 by an enemy of the United States during a period of conflict with
- 18 such enemy and who was discharged or otherwise separated with a
- 19 characterization of honorable from or is currently serving in the
- 20 United States Armed Forces may, in addition to the application
- 21 required in section 60-385, apply to the department for license
- 22 plates designed to indicate that he or she is a former prisoner of
- 23 war.
- 24 (2) The license plates shall be issued upon the applicant
- 25 paying the regular license fee and an additional fee of five

1 dollars and furnishing proof satisfactory to the department that

- 2 the applicant was formerly a prisoner of war. The additional fee
- 3 shall be remitted to the State Treasurer for credit to the Highway
- 4 Trust Fund. Only one motor vehicle, trailer, semitrailer, or cabin
- 5 trailer Any number of motor vehicles, trailers, semitrailers, or
- 6 cabin trailers owned by an applicant shall be so licensed at any
- 7 one time. Motor vehicles and trailers registered under section
- 8 60-3,198 shall not be so licensed.
- 9 (3) The surviving spouse of a person who was issued
- 10 plates under this section may continue to use or apply for and
- 11 <u>use the plates subject to registration of the vehicle in the</u>
- 12 surviving spouse's name and upon payment of the appropriate fee. If
- 13 the surviving spouse remarries, the surviving spouse shall return
- 14 the plates to the department and the department, at no additional
- 15 charge, shall issue regular license plates to the surviving spouse.
- 16 (4) If the license plates issued under this section
- 17 are lost, stolen, or mutilated, the recipient of the license plates
- 18 shall be issued replacement license plates upon request and without
- 19 charge.
- Sec. 3. Section 60-3,124, Revised Statutes Cumulative
- 21 Supplement, 2008, is amended to read:
- 22 60-3,124 (1) Any person who is a veteran of the United
- 23 States Armed Forces, who was discharged or otherwise separated
- 24 with a characterization of honorable or general (under honorable
- 25 conditions), and who is classified by the United States Department

1 of Veterans Affairs as one hundred percent service-connected

- 2 disabled may, in addition to the application required in section
- 3 60-385, apply to the Department of Motor Vehicles for license
- 4 plates designed by the department to indicate that the applicant is
- 5 a disabled veteran. The inscription on the license plates shall be
- 6 D.A.V. immediately below the license plate number to indicate that
- 7 the holder of the license plates is a disabled veteran.
- 8 (2) The plates shall be issued upon the applicant paying
- 9 the regular license fee and an additional fee of five dollars and
- 10 furnishing proof satisfactory to the department that the applicant
- 11 is a disabled veteran. The additional fee shall be remitted to
- 12 the State Treasurer for credit to the Highway Trust Fund. Only one
- 13 motor vehicle, trailer, semitrailer, or cabin trailer Any number of
- 14 motor vehicles, trailers, semitrailers, or cabin trailers owned by
- 15 the applicant shall be so licensed at any one time. Motor vehicles
- 16 and trailers registered under section 60-3,198 shall not be so
- 17 licensed.
- 18 (3) The surviving spouse of a person who was issued
- 19 plates under this section may continue to use or apply for and
- 20 use the plates subject to registration of the vehicle in the
- 21 surviving spouse's name and upon payment of the appropriate fee. If
- 22 the surviving spouse remarries, the surviving spouse shall return
- 23 the plates to the department and the department, at no additional
- 24 charge, shall issue regular license plates to the surviving spouse.
- 25 (4) If the license plates issued under this section

1 are lost, stolen, or mutilated, the recipient of the plates

- 5 Supplement, 2008, is amended to read:
- 6 60-3,125 (1) Any person may, in addition to the
- 7 application required by section 60-385, apply to the department
- 8 for license plates designed by the department to indicate that the
- 9 applicant has received from the federal government an award of a
- 10 Purple Heart. The inscription of the plates shall be designed so
- 11 as to include a facsimile of the award and beneath any numerical
- 12 designation upon the plates pursuant to section 60-370 the words
- 13 Purple Heart separately on one line and the words Combat Wounded
- 14 on the line below.
- 15 (2) The license plates shall be issued upon payment of
- 16 the regular license fee and an additional fee of five dollars and
- 17 furnishing proof satisfactory to the department that the applicant
- 18 was awarded the Purple Heart. The additional fee shall be remitted
- 19 to the State Treasurer for credit to the Highway Trust Fund. Any
- 20 number of motor vehicles, trailers, semitrailers, or cabin trailers
- 21 owned by the applicant may be so licensed at any one time. Motor
- 22 vehicles and trailers registered under section 60-3,198 shall not
- 23 be so licensed.
- 24 (3) The surviving spouse of a person who was issued
- 25 plates under this section may continue to use or apply for and

1 use the plates subject to registration of the vehicle in the

- 2 <u>surviving spouse's name and upon payment of the appropriate fee. If</u>
- 3 the surviving spouse remarries, the surviving spouse shall return
- 4 the plates to the department and the department, at no additional
- 5 charge, shall issue regular license plates to the surviving spouse.
- 6 (3) (4) If license plates issued pursuant to this section
- 7 are lost, stolen, or mutilated, the recipient of the plates shall
- 8 be issued replacement license plates upon request and without
- 9 charge.
