5		Commission; to harmonize provisions; and to repeal the
6		original sections.

7 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

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Section 1. Section 77-5001, Revised Statutes Cumulative 1 2 Supplement, 2008, is amended to read: 3 77-5001 Sections 77-5001 to 77-5031 and section 3 of this act shall be known and may be cited as the Tax Equalization and 4 5 Review Commission Act. Sec. 2. Section 77-5005, Revised Statutes Cumulative 6 7 Supplement, 2008, is amended to read: 8 77-5005 (1) Within ten days after appointment, the 9 commissioners shall meet at their office in Lincoln, Nebraska, 10 and enter upon the duties of their office. 11 (2) A majority of the commission or, in cases when a 12 panel of three commissioners hears a case, a majority of the 13 panel shall at all times constitute a quorum to transact business, and one vacancy shall not impair the right of the remaining 14 15 commissioners to exercise all the powers of the commission. 16 (3) Any investigation, inquiry, or hearing held or undertaken by the commission may be held or undertaken by or 17 18 before a panel of three commissioners or by one commissioner in 19 those appeals designated for hearing pursuant to section 3 of this 20 act. 21 A11 investigations, inquiries, hearings, (4) and 22 decisions of a panel of commissioners and every order made by a 23 panel of commissioners or by a single commissioner pursuant to 24 section 3 of this act shall be deemed to be the order of the

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25 commission. The full commission, on an application made within

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thirty days after the date of an order, may grant a rehearing 1 2 and determine de novo any decisions of or orders made by a panel 3 of commissioners except an order dismissing an appeal or petition for failure of the appellant or petitioner to appear at a hearing 4 5 on the merits. The thirty-day filing period for appeals under subsection (2) of section 77-5019 shall be tolled while a motion 6 7 for rehearing is pending. 8 (5) Any order entered by a single commissioner may be 9 appealed to the commission for rehearing by the full commission or 10 a panel of the commission as provided in subsection (4) of this 11 section. 12 (5) (6) All hearings or proceedings of the commission 13 shall be open to the public. 14 (6) (7) The Open Meetings Act applies only to hearings 15 or proceedings of the commission held pursuant to the rulemaking 16 authority of the commission. 17 Sec. 3. (1) A single commissioner may hear an appeal and 18 appeals consolidated with it when: 19 (a) The taxable value of each parcel is one million 20 dollars or less as determined by the county board of equalization; 21 (b) Each parcel is used for single-family residential 22 purposes; and 23 (c) The appeal has been designated for hearing pursuant 24 to this section by the chairperson of the commission or in such 25 other manner as the commission may provide in its rules and

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1 2 (2) A proceeding held before a single commissioner shall 3 be informal. The usual common-law or statutory rules of evidence shall not apply, and the commissioner may consider and utilize 4 all matter presented at the proceeding in making his or her 5 6 determination. 7 (3) Any party to an appeal designated for hearing 8 pursuant to this section or the commission's rules and regulations 9 before a single commissioner may elect to have the appeal heard by 10 a panel of the commission. 11 (4) The case file shall constitute the record of a 12 proceeding by a single commissioner. No recording of the proceeding 13 shall be made of a hearing held before a single commissioner. 14 (5) A request for rehearing an appeal heard pursuant to 15 this section by a panel of the commission shall be made as provided 16 in section 77-5005. 17 (6) A county board of equalization may designate the 18 county assessor as an ex officio, nonvoting member of the county 19 board of equalization for purposes of a hearing pursuant to this 20 section. The county assessor may designate one or more persons to 21 act on his or her behalf as an ex officio, nonvoting member of the 22 county board of equalization for purposes of a hearing pursuant to 23 this section.
