A BILL

- 1 FOR AN ACT relating to interior design; to adopt the Interior
- 2 Designers Certification Act; and to provide an operative
- 3 date.
- 4 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1 Section 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as

- 2 the Interior Designers Certification Act.
- 3 Sec. 2. For purposes of the Interior Designers
- 4 Certification Act:
- 5 (1) Board means the Board of Interior Designers;
- 6 (2) Interior design means the programming, study,
- 7 consultation, drawing, specification, and administration of a
- 8 <u>design construction contract relating to nonstructural interior</u>
- 9 elements of a building or structure. Interior design includes,
- 10 but is not limited to, space planning, selection of materials and
- 11 finishes, selection and specification of furniture, fixtures, and
- 12 equipment, and preparation of construction documents. Interior
- 13 design does not include the practice of architecture as defined
- 14 in section 81-3420 or the practice of engineering as defined in
- 15 section 81-3421; and
- 16 (3) Certified interior designer means an individual who
- is a design professional certified under the act and qualified by
- 18 education, examination, or experience as prescribed by the act.
- 19 Sec. 3. (1) The Board of Interior Designers is created
- 20 to administer the Interior Designers Certification Act. The board
- 21 may use any funds available to obtain suitable office space within
- 22 Lincoln, Nebraska. The board shall consist of:
- 23 (a) Five members who are certified interior designers
- 24 under subsection (1) of section 5 of this act, appointed by
- 25 the Governor, after consultation with professional associations or

- 1 societies composed of interior designers;
- 2 (b) One member who is an architect and a certified
- 3 interior designer under subsection (3) of section 5 of this act,
- 4 appointed by the Governor; and
- 5 (c) One public member appointed by the Governor.
- 6 (2) Of the initial members, two shall be appointed for
- 7 one-year terms, two for two-year terms, and three for three-year
- 8 terms. All members thereafter shall be appointed for three-year
- 9 terms. Each initial member appointed under subdivisions (1)(a)
- 10 and (b) of this section shall be eligible to become certified
- 11 under the act at the time of his or her appointment and shall
- 12 become certified within one year after his or her appointment. If
- 13 he or she fails to become certified, the Governor shall remove
- 14 such member and appoint a replacement for the unexpired term. All
- 15 members thereafter appointed under subdivisions (1)(a) and (b) of
- 16 this section shall be certified. Each member shall hold office
- 17 after the expiration of his or her term until his or her successor
- 18 is duly appointed and qualified. The Governor may remove any member
- 19 of the board for misconduct, incompetency, or neglect of duty.
- 20 Vacancies in the membership of the board, however created, shall be
- 21 <u>filled for the unexpired term by appointment of the Governor.</u>
- 22 (3) Each member of the board shall be reimbursed for
- 23 his or her actual and necessary expenses as provided in sections
- 24 <u>81-1174</u> to 81-1177.
- 25 Sec. 4. The duties of the board shall include, but are

1	not	limited	to,	the	following:
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- 2 (1) Administering and enforcing the Interior Designers
- 3 Certification Act;
- 4 (2) Adopting a code of ethics;
- 5 (3) Establishing requirements for the examination,
- 6 education, and practical training of applicants for certification;
- 7 (4) Adopting and promulgating rules and regulations to
- 8 carry out the act;
- 9 (5) Establishing fees for certification, renewal of
- 10 certification, and reinstatement of certification and for other
- 11 activities of the board pertaining to its duties. Such fees shall
- 12 be sufficient to defray the costs of administering the act and
- 13 shall be not less than one hundred nor more than three hundred
- 14 dollars for initial certification, renewal of certification, and
- 15 reinstatement of certification;
- 16 (6) Authorizing and approving any expenditure of the
- 17 funds in the Interior Designers Certification Cash Fund by the
- 18 Board of Engineers and Architects;
- 19 (7) Establishing standards and requirements of continuing
- 20 education as a prerequisite to renewal of certification;
- 21 (8) Maintaining a complete roster of all certified
- 22 interior designers. The roster shall be filed with the Secretary of
- 23 State; and
- 24 (9) Maintaining records of the board's proceedings which
- 25 are open to public inspection at all reasonable times relating

1 to the issuance, refusal, renewal, suspension, and revocation of

- 2 certification.
- 3 Sec. 5. (1) Each applicant for certification shall meet
- 4 the interior design education and practical training requirements
- 5 adopted by the board and shall pass an examination approved by
- 6 the board that is task-oriented, focused on public safety, and
- 7 validated by a recognized testing agency. The board shall certify
- 8 an individual as an interior designer if he or she submits an
- 9 application to the board on the form and in the manner prescribed
- 10 by the board and satisfies the following requirements:
- 11 (a) Submits written proof that he or she has successfully
- 12 passed the National Council for Interior Design Qualification
- 13 examination or its equivalent as determined by the board;
- 14 (b) Submits written proof of completion of four years
- 15 of interior design education from a Council for Interior Design
- 16 Accreditation accredited program or a substantially equivalent
- 17 program approved by the board;
- 18 (c) Submits written proof of a minimum of two years of
- 19 full-time work experience in interior design;
- 20 (d) Submits a copy of the code of ethics adopted by the
- 21 board and signed by the individual; and
- 22 (e) Submits the required certification fee to the board.
- 23 (2) The board shall grant certification by reciprocity.
- 24 An applicant applying to the board for certification by reciprocity
- 25 shall furnish satisfactory evidence that the applicant meets both

- 1 of the following requirements:
- 2 (a) He or she holds a valid certification, registration,
- 3 or license issued by another authority recognized by the board
- 4 where the qualifications for certification, registration, or
- 5 licensure are substantially equivalent to those prescribed in this
- 6 state on the date of application under this subsection; and
- 7 (b) He or she holds a valid certificate number issued by
- 8 the National Council for Interior Design Qualification.
- 9 (3) The board shall grant certification to an architect
- 10 licensed under the Engineers and Architects Regulation Act.
- 11 (4) When an applicant under subsection (1), (2), or
- 12 (3) of this section has complied with the qualifications for
- 13 certification to the satisfaction of a majority of the board
- 14 members and submitted the fees prescribed by the board, the
- 15 board shall record the applicant's name and address in the roster
- 16 of certified interior designers and issue to the applicant a
- 17 certificate signed by the members of the board and valid until
- 18 January 1 of the following year. The certificate shall entitle the
- 19 individual to use the title of certified interior designer in this
- 20 state.
- 21 Sec. 6. A certified interior designer shall submit
- 22 an application for renewal along with proof of completion of
- 23 continuing education requirements established by the board and the
- 24 renewal fee established by the board in section 4 of this act
- 25 before January 1 of each year. The board may send out a renewal

- 1 notice to all certified interior designers before such date.
- 2 Sec. 7. (1) The board may revoke, suspend, or refuse to
- 3 issue or renew a certificate of any individual upon a finding of
- 4 any of the following:
- 5 (a) Fraud in obtaining or renewing certification;
- 6 (b) Violation of the code of ethics adopted by the board
- 7 under the Interior Designers Certification Act;
- 8 (c) Violation of the Engineers and Architects Regulation
- 9 Act by engaging in the practice of architecture or the practice of
- 10 engineering when not licensed under the Engineers and Architects
- 11 Regulation Act;
- 12 (d) Conviction of a felony related to the profession or
- 13 occupation of the certified interior designer. A copy of the record
- 14 of conviction or plea of guilty shall be conclusive evidence of the
- 15 conviction;
- 16 (e) Unlawful use of the title of certified interior
- 17 designer; or
- 18 <u>(f) Violation of the Interior Designers Certification Act</u>
- 19 or a rule or regulation adopted and promulgated by the board under
- 20 the act.
- 21 (2) Any individual may appeal a finding of the board
- 22 within thirty days after the date of notification of the action.
- 23 Such appeal shall be in accordance with the Administrative
- 24 Procedure Act.
- 25 Sec. 8. (1) It shall be unlawful for any individual to

1 use the title of certified interior designer or any title or device

- 2 indicating that the individual is a certified interior designer
- 3 unless he or she has been issued a certificate under the act. This
- 4 subsection does not prohibit the use of the terms interior design
- 5 or interior designer or the performance of interior design services
- 6 by an individual who is not certified as an interior designer.
- 7 (2) Any individual who violates this section is guilty
- 8 of a Class V misdemeanor. In addition to any other remedies under
- 9 the Interior Designers Certification Act and on petition of the
- 10 board, any individual who violates this section may be permanently
- 11 enjoined from continuing such violation.
- 12 Sec. 9. (1) Beginning on the operative date of this act
- 13 and through December 31, 2012, the board may issue an interior
- 14 designer certificate to an individual residing in Nebraska who does
- 15 not meet the requirements listed in section 5 of this act if the
- 16 individual (a) submits the fee prescribed in subdivision (1)(e)
- of section 5 of this act and written proof of fifteen years of
- 18 work experience deemed satisfactory by the board or (b) submits
- 19 written proof to the board of successful completion of Section I of
- 20 the National Council for Interior Design Qualification examination
- 21 relating to life safety codes and barrier-free requirements and the
- 22 following:
- (i) An accredited baccalaureate degree, a diploma, or a
- 24 certificate from a program with a minimum of sixty credit hours in
- 25 <u>interior design coursework; and</u>

1 (ii) A combination of six years of education and work

- 2 experience deemed satisfactory by the board.
- 3 (2) An individual who is issued a certificate under this
- 4 section shall not be required to meet the requirements of section 5
- 5 of this act to obtain subsequent renewals of such certificate.
- 6 Sec. 10. Fees received pursuant to the act shall be
- 7 remitted by the Board of Interior Designers to the State Treasurer
- 8 for credit to the Interior Designers Certification Cash Fund
- 9 which is hereby created. Fees credited to the fund shall only be
- 10 used to defray the cost of administering the Interior Designers
- 11 Certification Act. The fund may receive gifts, bequests, grants, or
- 12 other contributions or donations from public or private entities
- 13 to be used for startup costs. The fund shall be administered by
- 14 the Board of Engineers and Architects subject to the powers of the
- 15 Board of Interior Designers enumerated in section 4 of this act.
- 16 Any money in the fund available for investment shall be invested
- 17 by the state investment officer pursuant to the Nebraska Capital
- 18 Expansion Act and the Nebraska State Funds Investment Act.
- 19 Sec. 11. This act becomes operative on January 1, 2010.
