10		identification cards; to harmonize provisions; and to

Section 60-479.01, Revised Statutes Cumulative 13 Supplement, 2008, is amended to read: 60-479.01 (1) This section applies beginning on an 14 15 implementation date designated by the director pursuant to section 16 60-462.02. 17 (2) All persons handling source documents or engaged in 18 the issuance of new, renewed, or reissued operators' licenses or state identification cards shall have periodic fraudulent document 19 20 recognition training. 21 (3) This subsection applies beginning on an implementation date designated by the director on or before 22 23 January 1, 2010. All persons and agents of the department involved 24 in the recording of verified application information or verified 25 operator's license and state identification card information,

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1 involved in the manufacture or production of licenses or cards, 2 or who have the ability to affect information on such licenses or 3 cards shall be subject to a criminal history record information check, including a check of prior employment references, and a 4 lawful status check. The cost of any background check shall be 5 6 borne by the employer of the person or agent. Any person convicted 7 of any disqualifying offense as provided in 6 C.F.R. part 37, 8 as such part existed on January 1, 2009, shall not be involved 9 in the recording of verified application information or verified 10 operator's license and state identification card information, involved in the manufacture or production of licenses or cards, 11 12 or involved in any capacity in which such person would have 13 the ability to affect information on such licenses or cards. 14 Any employee or prospective employee of the department shall be 15 provided notice that he or she will undergo such criminal history record information check prior to employment or prior to any 16 17 involvement with the issuance of operators' licenses or state 18 identification cards.

3 (b) Application for an operator's license may be made in 4 a manner prescribed by the department. Such application may be made 5 to an examiner in any county. (e) The social security number shall not be printed on 4 5 the operator's license and shall be used only (i) to furnish driver record information to the United States Selective Service System 6 under section 60-483, (ii) with the permission of the director in 7 8 connection with the verification of the status of an individual's 9 driving record in this state or any other state, (iii) for purposes 10 of child support enforcement pursuant to section 42-358.08 or 11 43-512.06, or (iv) to furnish information regarding an applicant 12 for or holder of a commercial driver's license with a hazardous 13 materials endorsement to the Transportation Security Administration 14 of the United States Department of Homeland Security or its agent.

Such documents shall include, but not be 18 limited to, any valid Nebraska operator's license or Nebraska state 19 identification card, a valid operator's license or identification 20 card from another state or jurisdiction of the United States, a 21 certified birth certificate, a valid United States passport, or 22 any other United States-based identification as approved by the 23 director. be those provided in subsection (2) of section 6 of this 24 act.

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(ii) Any individual under the age of eighteen years

Sec. 9. Section 60-487, Reissue Revised Statutes of 24 25 Nebraska, is amended to read:

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1 60-487 (1) If any magistrate or judge finds in his or her 2 judgment of conviction that the application or examiner's issuance 3 certificate pursuant to which the director has issued an operator's license under the Motor Vehicle Operator's License Act contains 4 5 any false or fraudulent statement deliberately and knowingly made 6 to any officer as to any matter material to the issuance of such 7 license or does not contain required or correct information or 8 that the person to whom the license was issued was not eligible 9 to receive such license, then the license shall be absolutely void 10 from the date of issue and such motor vehicle operator shall be 11 deemed to be not licensed to operate a motor vehicle. Such license 12 shall be at once canceled of record in his or her office by the 13 director upon receipt of a copy of such judgment of conviction. 14 The director may, upon his or her own motion, summarily cancel 15 any license for any of the reasons set forth in this section if 16 such reason or reasons affirmatively appear on his or her official 17 records.

18 (2) If the director determines, in a check of an 19 applicant's license status and record prior to issuing a commercial 20 driver's license, or at any time after the commercial driver's 21 license is issued, that the applicant falsified information 22 contained in the application, the director may summarily cancel 23 the person's commercial driver's license or his or her pending application as provided in subsection (1) of this section and 24 25 disqualify the person from operating a commercial motor vehicle for

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1 sixty days.

Sec. 10. Section 60-4,114, Reissue Revised Statutes of
Nebraska, is amended to read:

4 60-4,114 (1) The county treasurer may employ such 5 additional clerical help as may be necessary to assist him or her 6 in the performance of the ministerial duties required of him or 7 her under the Motor Vehicle Operator's License Act and, for such 8 additional expense, shall be reimbursed as set out in section 9 60-4,115.

10 (2) The director may, in his or her discretion, appoint 11 one or more examining officers who shall personally department 12 personnel to examine all applicants who apply for an initial 13 license or whose licenses have been revoked or canceled to 14 ascertain such person's ability to operate a motor vehicle properly 15 and safely.

16 (3) Except as otherwise provided in section 60-4,122, the
17 application process, in addition to the other requisites of the
18 act, shall include the following:

(a) An inquiry into the medical condition and visual
ability of the applicant to operate a motor vehicle;

(b) An inquiry into the applicant's ability to drive and
maneuver a motor vehicle; and

(c) An inquiry touching upon the applicant's knowledge
of the motor vehicle laws of this state, which shall include
sufficient questions to indicate familiarity with the provisions

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1 thereof.; and

2 (d) An inquiry into the applicant's knowledge of the laws
3 for operating a motor vehicle to avoid arrest.

4 (4) If an applicant is denied or refused a certificate 5 for license, by the examiners, such applicant shall have the right 6 to an immediate appeal to the director from the decision. of such 7 examiners. It shall be the duty of the director to review the 8 appeal and issue a final order, to be made not later than ten days 9 after the receipt of the appeal by the director, except that if the 10 director requests the advice of the Health Advisory Board on the 11 matter, the director shall have up to forty-five days after the day 12 a medical or vision problem is referred to him or her to consult 13 with members of the board to obtain the medical opinion necessary 14 to make a decision and shall issue a final order not later than ten 15 days following receipt of the medical opinion. After consideration 16 of the advice of the board, the director shall make a determination of the applicant's physical or mental ability to operate a motor 17 18 vehicle and shall issue a final order. The order shall be in 19 writing, shall be accompanied by findings of fact and conclusions 20 of law, and shall be sent by registered or certified mail to 21 the applicant's last-known address. The order may be appealed as 22 provided in section 60-4,105.

23 Sec. 11. Section 60-4,120, Revised Statutes Cumulative
24 Supplement, 2008, is amended to read:

25 60-4,120 (1) Except as provided in subsection (4) of

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1 this section for persons temporarily out of the state, any person duly licensed or holding a valid state identification card issued 2 3 under the Motor Vehicle Operator's License Act who loses his or her operator's license or card may obtain a duplicate upon filing 4 5 with the county treasurer or the Department of Motor Vehicles department an application showing such loss and furnishing proof 6 7 of identification in accordance with section 60-484. If satisfied 8 that the loss is genuine, the issuer shall cause to be issued, upon 9 the payment of the fee prescribed in section 60-4,115, a duplicate 10 license or card. No more than two duplicates of a license or card 11 may be issued in this manner. Upon the issuance of any duplicate 12 or replacement license or card, the license or card from which the 13 duplicate or replacement is issued shall be void.

14 (2) If any person changes his or her name because 15 of marriage or divorce or by court order or a common-law name 16 change, he or she shall apply to the county treasurer for a 17 replacement operator's license or state identification card and 18 furnish proof of identification in accordance with section 60-484. 19 If any person changes his or her address, the person shall apply 20 to the county treasurer for a replacement operator's license or 21 state identification card and furnish satisfactory evidence of such 22 change. The application shall be made within sixty days after the 23 change of name or address. The license or card shall be issued upon 24 payment of the fee prescribed in section 60-4,115.

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(3) In the event a mutilated and unreadable operator's

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license is held by any person duly licensed under the act or a 1 2 mutilated and unreadable state identification card which was issued 3 under the act is held by a person, such person may obtain a replacement license or card upon showing the original mutilated or 4 5 unreadable license or card to the county treasurer. A replacement license or card may be issued, without a photograph, to any 6 7 person who is out of the state at the time of application for 8 the replacement license or card. Such license or card shall state 9 on its face that it shall become invalid thirty days after such 10 person resumes residence in the state. If the county treasurer is 11 satisfied that the license or card is mutilated or unreadable, the 12 county treasurer shall cause to be issued, upon the payment of the 13 fee prescribed in section 60-4,115, a replacement license or card.

(4) If any person duly licensed under the act loses 14 15 his or her operator's license or if any holder of a state 16 identification card loses his or her card while temporarily out of 17 the state, he or she may apply for a duplicate operator's license 18 or card without a photograph by filing with the county treasurer an 19 application and affidavit showing such loss. Upon the officer being 20 satisfied that the loss is genuine, the officer shall cause to be 21 issued, upon the payment of the fee prescribed in section 60-4,115, 22 a duplicate operator's license or card without a photograph. Upon 23 the issuance of the duplicate, the original license or card shall 24 be void.

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(5) Any person holding a valid operator's license or

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state identification card without a photograph shall surrender 1 2 such license or card to the treasurer of his or her county of 3 residence within thirty days after resuming residency in this state. After the thirty-day period, such license or card shall be 4 5 considered invalid. Upon the timely surrender of the license or 6 card and payment of the fee prescribed in section 60-4,115, such person shall be issued an operator's license or card with a color 7 8 photograph or digital image of the licensee included.

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9 (6) An application form for a replacement or duplicate 10 operator's license or state identification card shall include a 11 voter registration portion pursuant to section 32-308 and the 12 following specific question: Do you wish to register to vote as 13 part of this application process?

14 (7) An applicant may obtain a replacement or duplicate 15 operator's license or state identification card pursuant to 16 subsection (1), (3), or (4) of this section by electronic means 17 in a manner prescribed by the department. If the applicant has 18 a digital image and digital signature preserved in the digital 19 system, the replacement or duplicate shall be issued with the 20 preserved digital image and digital signature.

Sec. 12. Section 60-4,121, Reissue Revised Statutes of
Nebraska, is amended to read:

60-4,121 (1) The operator's license of any person serving
on active duty, other than members of the National Guard or
reserves activated for training purposes only, outside the State

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of Nebraska as a member of the United States Armed Forces, or 1 the spouse of any such person or a dependent of such member of 2 3 the armed forces, shall be valid during such person's period of active duty and for not more than sixty days immediately following 4 5 such person's date of separation from service. and shall be 6 renewed after the expiration date without examination upon written application to the county treasurer who issued the license. No 7 8 person shall be permitted to renew a license in such manner more 9 than twice.

10 (2) The county treasurer also shall issue a renewal 11 license, without examination, to any person who is serving in the 12 armed forces of the United States, or the spouse of any such person 13 or a dependent of such member of the armed forces, and who makes 14 application for renewal within ninety days prior to the expiration date of his or her license while the member is still on active duty 15 16 upon proof that such member is still on active duty. If such person 17 is twenty years of age, he or she may be issued a renewal license 18 in such manner within ten days prior to his or her twenty-first 19 birthday.

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Nebraska to reside, whichever is later, or (b) return to the State 1 2 of Nebraska while the member is still on active duty upon proof 3 that such member is still on active duty. (4) (2) Each individual who is applying for renewal 4 of his or her operator's license shall submit his or her 5 previous license to the examiner or, when the previous license 6 7 is unavailable, furnish proof of identification in accordance with 8 section 60-484.
