A BILL

1	FOR AN A	ACT relating to nurse practitioners; to amend sections
2		38-206, 38-2301, 38-2315, and 38-2322, Reissue Revised
3		Statutes of Nebraska; to eliminate a requirement
4		for integrated practice agreements; to eliminate a
5		definition; to harmonize provisions; to provide an
6		operative date; to repeal the original sections; and to
7		outright repeal sections 38-2310 and 38-2323, Reissue
8		Revised Statutes of Nebraska.

9 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

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Section 1. Section 38-206, Reissue Revised Statutes of
 Nebraska, is amended to read:

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3 38-206 The board shall:

4 (1) Establish standards for integrated practice
5 agreements between collaborating physicians and certified nurse
6 midwives; 7 and nurse practitioners;

7 (2) Monitor the scope of practice by certified nurse
8 midwives, certified registered nurse anesthetists, clinical nurse
9 specialists, and nurse practitioners;

10 (3) Recommend disciplinary action relating to licenses 11 of advanced practice registered nurses, certified nurse 12 midwives, certified registered nurse anesthetists, clinical nurse 13 specialists, and nurse practitioners;

14 (4) Engage in other activities not inconsistent with the
15 Advanced Practice Registered Nurse Practice Act, the Certified
16 Nurse Midwifery Practice Act, the Certified Registered Nurse
17 Anesthetist Practice Act, the Clinical Nurse Specialist Practice
18 Act, and the Nurse Practitioner Practice Act; and

19 (5) Adopt rules and regulations to implement the Advanced 20 Practice Registered Nurse Practice Act, the Certified Nurse 21 Midwifery Practice Act, the Certified Registered Nurse Anesthetist 22 Practice Act, the Clinical Nurse Specialist Practice Act, and the 23 Nurse Practitioner Practice Act, for promulgation by the department 24 as provided in section 38-126. Such rules and regulations shall 25 also include: (a) Approved certification organizations and approved

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certification programs; and (b) professional liability insurance. 1 Sec. 2. Section 38-2301, Reissue Revised Statutes of 2 3 Nebraska, is amended to read: 38-2301 Sections 38-2301 to 38-2323 38-2322 shall be 4 5 known and may be cited as the Nurse Practitioner Practice Act. 6 Sec. 3. Section 38-2315, Reissue Revised Statutes of 7 Nebraska, is amended to read: 8 38-2315 (1) A nurse practitioner may provide health 9 care services within specialty areas. A nurse practitioner shall 10 function by establishing collaborative, consultative, and referral 11 networks as appropriate with other health care professionals. 12 Patients who require care beyond the scope of practice of a 13 nurse practitioner shall be referred to an appropriate health care 14 provider.

15 (2) Nurse practitioner practice means health promotion,
16 health supervision, illness prevention and diagnosis, treatment,
17 and management of common health problems and chronic conditions,
18 including:

(a) Assessing patients, ordering diagnostic tests and
therapeutic treatments, synthesizing and analyzing data, and
applying advanced nursing principles;

(b) Dispensing, incident to practice only, sample
medications which are provided by the manufacturer and are provided
at no charge to the patient; and

25 (c) Prescribing therapeutic measures and medications

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relating to health conditions within the scope of practice. Any
 limitation on the prescribing authority of the nurse practitioner
 for controlled substances listed in Schedule II of section 28-405
 shall be recorded in the integrated practice agreement established
 pursuant to section 38-2310.

6 (3) A nurse practitioner who has proof of a current 7 certification from an approved certification program in а 8 psychiatric or mental health specialty may manage the care of 9 patients committed under the Nebraska Mental Health Commitment 10 Act. Patients who require care beyond the scope of practice of a 11 nurse practitioner who has proof of a current certification from an 12 approved certification program in a psychiatric or mental health 13 specialty shall be referred to an appropriate health care provider. Sec. 4. Section 38-2322, Reissue Revised Statutes of 14 15 Nebraska, is amended to read:

16 38-2322 (1) Prior to commencing practice as a nurse practitioner, an individual (a) who has a master's degree or 17 18 doctorate degree in nursing and has completed an approved nurse practitioner program, (b) who can demonstrate separate course 19 20 work in pharmacotherapeutics, advanced health assessment, and 21 pathophysiology or psychopathology, and (c) who has completed a 22 minimum of two thousand hours of practice under the supervision 23 of a nurse practitioner practicing in the same specialty area 24 or, if a nurse practitioner practicing in the same specialty area 25 is not available, a physician, shall submit to the department an

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1 integrated practice agreement with a collaborating physician and 2 shall furnish to the department proof of professional liability 3 insurance required under section 38-2320.

(2) A nurse practitioner who needs to obtain the two 4 5 thousand hours of supervised practice required under subdivision (1) (c) of this section shall (a) submit to the department one or 6 7 more integrated practice agreements with a collaborating physician, 8 (b) furnish proof of jointly approved protocols with a nurse 9 practitioner practicing in the same specialty area or, if a 10 nurse practitioner practicing in the same specialty area is not 11 available, a collaborating physician which shall guide the nurse 12 practitioner's practice, and (c) (b) furnish proof of professional 13 liability insurance required under section 38-2320.

14 (3) If, after a diligent effort to obtain an integrated 15 practice agreement, a nurse practitioner is unable to obtain an 16 integrated practice agreement with one physician, the board may 17 waive the requirement of an integrated practice agreement upon a 18 showing that the applicant (a) meets the requirements of subsection 19 (1) of this section, (b) has made a diligent effort to obtain 20 an integrated practice agreement, and (c) will practice in a 21 geographic area where there is a shortage of health care services. 22 Sec. 5. This act becomes operative on January 1, 2010.
