A BILL

1	FOR AN ACT relating to physician assistants; to amend sections
2	38-2008, 38-2014, 38-2015, 38-2017, 38-2018, 38-2037,
3	38-2047, 38-2049, 38-2050, 38-2051, and 38-2055, Reissue
4	Revised Statutes of Nebraska; to change and repeal
5	definitions; to change provisions relating to supervision
6	and practice of physician assistants; to change powers
7	and duties of supervising physicians, the Board of
8	Medicine and Surgery, and the Department of Health
9	and Human Services; to harmonize provisions; to repeal
10	the original sections; and to outright repeal section
11	38-2009, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska.

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Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

Section 1. Section 38-2008, Reissue Revised Statutes of
 Nebraska, is amended to read:

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3 38-2008 Approved program means a program for the 4 education of physician assistants <u>which is approved by the</u> 5 <u>Commission on Accreditation of Allied Health Education Programs or</u> 6 <u>its predecessor or successor agency and which the board formally</u> 7 approves.

8 Sec. 2. Section 38-2014, Reissue Revised Statutes of
9 Nebraska, is amended to read:

10 38-2014 Physician assistant means any person who 11 graduates from a program approved by the Commission on 12 Accreditation of Allied Health Education Programs or its 13 predecessor or successor agency and the board, an approved program, 14 who satisfactorily completes has passed a proficiency examination, 15 and whom the board, with the concurrence of the department, with 16 the recommendation of the board, approves to perform medical 17 services under the supervision of a physician or group of 18 physicians. approved by the department, with the recommendation of the board, to supervise such assistant. 19

Sec. 3. Section 38-2015, Reissue Revised Statutes of
Nebraska, is amended to read:

22 38-2015 Proficiency examination means the initial 23 proficiency examination approved by the board for the licensure 24 of physician assistants, including, but not limited to, the 25 examination Physician Assistant National Certifying Examination

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administered by the National Commission on Certification of
 Physician Assistants. or other national organization established
 for such purpose that is recognized by the board.

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Sec. 4. Section 38-2017, Reissue Revised Statutes of
Nebraska, is amended to read:

38-2017 Supervising physician means (1) a board-approved
physician who utilizes a licensed physician who supervises a
physician assistant. or (2) a backup physician.

9 Sec. 5. Section 38-2018, Reissue Revised Statutes of
10 Nebraska, is amended to read:

11 38-2018 Supervision means the ready availability of 12 the supervising physician for consultation and direction of the 13 activities of the physician assistant. Contact with the supervising 14 physician by telecommunication shall be sufficient to show ready 15 availability. if the board finds that such contact is sufficient to 16 provide quality medical care. The level of supervision may vary by 17 geographic location as provided in section 38-2047.

18 Sec. 6. Section 38-2037, Reissue Revised Statutes of
19 Nebraska, is amended to read:

20 38-2037 In addition to the grounds for disciplinary 21 action found in sections 38-178 and 38-179, a license to practice 22 medicine and surgery or osteopathic medicine and surgery <u>and a</u> 23 <u>license to practice as a physician assistant may be denied, refused</u> 24 renewal, limited, revoked, or suspended or have other disciplinary 25 measures taken against it in accordance with section 38-196 when

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the applicant or licensee fails to comply with the provisions
 of section 71-603.01, 71-604, 71-605, or 71-606 relating to the
 signing of birth and death certificates.

Sec. 7. Section 38-2047, Reissue Revised Statutes of
Nebraska, is amended to read:

6 38-2047 (1) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, 7 a physician assistant may perform medical services when he or she 8 renders such services under the supervision of a licensed physician 9 or group of physicians. A physician assistant may perform those 10 duties and responsibilities that are delegated by the supervising physician. A physician assistant shall be considered an agent 11 12 of his or her supervising physician in the performance of all 13 practice-related activities delegated by the supervising physician, 14 including, but not limited to, ordering diagnostic, therapeutic, 15 and other medical services. approved by the department, with the 16 recommendation of the board, in the specialty area or areas for 17 which the physician assistant shall be trained or experienced. 18 Any physician assistant licensed under the Medicine and Surgery Practice Act to perform services may perform those services only: 19

20 <u>(2) Each team of supervising physician or physicians and</u> 21 physician assistant or physician assistants shall be responsible 22 to ensure that the scope of practice of each physician assistant 23 is identified, that the delegation of medical tasks is appropriate 24 to the level of competence of each physician assistant, that the 25 relationship of and access to the supervising physician is defined,

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and that a process for evaluation of the performance of the
 physician assistant is established.

3 (3) A physician assistant may provide any medical service 4 which is delegated by the supervising physician when the service 5 is within the skills of the physician assistant, forms a component 6 of the physician's scope of practice, and is provided with 7 supervision.

8 <u>(4) A physician assistant may pronounce death and may</u> 9 authenticate with his or her signature any form that may be 10 authenticated by a physician's signature.

11 (a) In the office of the supervising physician where such 12 physician maintains his or her primary practice;

13 (b) In any other office which is operated by the 14 supervising physician with the personal presence of the supervising 15 physician. The physician assistant may function without the 16 personal presence of the supervising physician in an office 17 other than where such physician maintains his or her primary 18 practice as provided in subsection (2) of this section and when 19 approved on an individual basis by the department, with the 20 recommendation of the board. Any such approval shall require site 21 visits by the supervising physician, regular reporting to the 22 supervising physician by the physician assistant, and arrangements 23 for supervision at all times by the supervising physician which are 24 sufficient to provide quality medical care;

25 (c) In a hospital, with the approval of the governing

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1 board of such hospital, where the supervising physician is a 2 member of the staff and the physician assistant is subject to the 3 rules and regulations of the hospital. Such rules and regulations may include, but need not be limited to, reasonable requirements 4 5 that physician assistants and the supervising physician maintain 6 professional liability insurance with such coverage and limits 7 as may be established by the hospital governing board, upon the 8 recommendation of the medical staff; or

9 (d) On calls outside such offices, when authorized by the
10 supervising physician and with the approval of the governing board
11 of any affected hospital.

12 (2) The department, with the recommendation of the board, 13 shall adopt and promulgate rules and regulations establishing 14 minimum requirements for the personal presence of the supervising 15 physician, stated in hours or percentage of practice time. The 16 board may provide different minimum requirements for the personal 17 presence of the supervising physician based on the geographic 18 location of the supervising physician's primary and other practice 19 sites and other factors the board deems relevant.

Sec. 8. Section 38-2049, Reissue Revised Statutes of
Nebraska, is amended to read:

22 38-2049 (1) The department, with the recommendation 23 <u>approval</u> of the board, shall issue licenses to persons who are 24 graduates of physician assistant programs approved by the board 25 an approved program and have satisfactorily completed passed a

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1 proficiency examination.

2 (2) The department, with the recommendation of the board, 3 shall issue temporary licenses to persons who have successfully completed an approved program for the education and training of 4 5 physician assistants but who have not yet passed a proficiency examination. Any temporary license issued pursuant to this 6 7 subsection shall be issued for a period not to exceed one year 8 and under such conditions as determined by the department, with 9 the recommendation of the board. Upon a showing of good cause, the 10 The temporary license may be extended by the department, with the 11 recommendation of the board.

12 (3) The board may recognize groups of specialty 13 classifications of training for physician assistants. These 14 classifications shall reflect the training and experience of the 15 physician assistant. The physician assistant may receive training 16 in one or more such classifications which shall be shown on the 17 license issued.

18 (4) (3) Physician assistants approved by the board
19 prior to April 16, 1985, shall not be required to complete
20 the proficiency examination.

Sec. 9. Section 38-2050, Reissue Revised Statutes of
Nebraska, is amended to read:

23 38-2050 (1) The department, with the recommendation of
24 the board, shall formulate guidelines for the consideration of
25 applications by a licensed physician or physicians to supervise

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1 physician assistants. Any application made by a physician or 2 physicians shall include all of the following:

3 (a) The qualifications, including related experience, of
4 the physician assistant intended to be employed;

5 (b) The professional background and specialty of the
6 physician or physicians; and

7 (c) A description by the physician of his or her, or 8 physicians of their, practice and the way in which the assistant or 9 assistants shall be utilized. The application shall provide for the 10 personal presence of the supervising physician in conformance with 11 requirements established by the department, with the recommendation 12 of the board, under section 38-2047.

13 (2) The department, with the recommendation of the board, 14 shall approve an application by a licensed physician to supervise a 15 physician assistant when the department, with the recommendation of 16 the board, is satisfied that the proposed assistant is a graduate 17 of an approved program, has satisfactorily completed a proficiency 18 examination, and is fully qualified to perform medical services 19 under the responsible supervision of a licensed physician. The 20 public shall be adequately protected by the arrangement proposed in 21 the application.

22 (3) The department, with the recommendation of the board,
23 shall approve no more than two physician assistants for any
24 practicing physician, except that this limitation may be waived
25 by the department, with the recommendation of the board, upon a

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1 showing of good cause by the practicing physician. 2 (1) To be a supervising physician, a person shall: 3 (a) Be licensed to practice medicine and surgery under 4 the Uniform Credentialing Act; 5 (b) Be free from any restriction on his or her ability 6 to supervise a physician assistant which has been imposed as 7 disciplinary action by the board; and 8 (c) Maintain an agreement with the physician assistant 9 which meets the requirements of subsection (2) of this section. 10 (2) An agreement between a supervising physician and a 11 physician assistant shall state that the physician will exercise 12 supervision over the physician assistant in accordance with the 13 Medicine and Surgery Practice Act and the rules and regulations 14 adopted and promulgated under the act relating to such agreements. 15 The agreement shall also state the scope of practice of the 16 physician assistant and that the physician will retain professional and legal responsibility for the care rendered by the physician 17 18 assistant. The agreement shall be signed by the physician and 19 the physician assistant. The supervising physician shall keep the 20 agreement on file at his or her primary practice site, shall keep 21 a copy of the agreement on file at each practice site where the 22 physician assistant provides medical services, and shall make the 23 agreement available to the board and the department upon request. 24 (3) Supervision of a physician assistant shall be 25 continuous but shall not require the physical presence of the

1 supervising physician at the time and place that the services are
2 rendered.

3 <u>(4) A supervising physician may supervise no more than</u> 4 <u>four physician assistants at any one time. The board may consider</u> 5 <u>an application for waiver of this limit and may grant such waiver</u> 6 <u>if it determines that there will be appropriate supervision in</u> 7 <u>the clinical setting described by the supervising physician in the</u> 8 application.

9 Sec. 10. Section 38-2051, Reissue Revised Statutes of
10 Nebraska, is amended to read:

11 38-2051 If the supervision of a physician assistant is 12 terminated by the physician or physician assistant, the physician 13 shall notify the department of such termination. A physician who 14 thereafter assumes the responsibility for such supervision shall 15 obtain a certificate to supervise a physician assistant from the 16 department prior to the use of the physician assistant in the 17 practice of medicine.

18 A physician assistant may render services in a setting 19 geographically remote from the supervising physician, except that 20 a physician assistant with less than two years of experience 21 shall comply with standards of supervision set by rules and 22 regulations under the Medicine and Surgery Practice Act. The board 23 may consider an application for waiver of the standards and may 24 waive the standards upon a showing of good cause by the supervising 25 physician.

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1	In order for a physician assistant to practice in
2	a hospital, the supervising physician shall be a member of
3	the medical staff of the hospital, the physician assistant
4	shall be approved by the governing board of the hospital, and
5	the physician assistant shall comply with applicable hospital
6	policies, including, but not limited to, reasonable requirements
7	that the physician assistant and the supervising physician maintain
8	professional liability insurance with such coverage and limits as
9	established by the governing board.
10	Sec. 11. Section 38-2055, Reissue Revised Statutes of
11	Nebraska, is amended to read:
12	38-2055 A physician assistant may prescribe drugs and
13	devices as delegated to do so by a supervising physician. Any
14	limitation placed by the supervising physician on the prescribing
15	authority of the physician assistant shall be recorded on the
16	physician assistant's scope of practice agreement established
17	pursuant to rules and regulations adopted and promulgated
18	under the Medicine and Surgery Practice Act. All prescriptions

19 and prescription container labels shall bear the name of the 20 supervising physician and the physician assistant. A physician 21 assistant to whom has been delegated the authority to prescribe 22 controlled substances shall obtain a federal Drug Enforcement 23 Administration registration number. When prescribing Schedule II 24 controlled substances, the prescription container label shall bear 25 all information required by the federal Controlled Substances Act

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1 of 1970.

Sec. 12. Original sections 38-2008, 38-2014, 38-2015,
38-2017, 38-2018, 38-2037, 38-2047, 38-2049, 38-2050, 38-2051, and
38-2055, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, are repealed.
