(5) Sexual predator means an individual who is required to register under the Sex Offender Registration Act, who has a high risk of recidivism as determined by the Nebraska State Patrol under section 29-4013, and who has victimized a person eighteen years of

Sec. 3. Section 29-4017, Reissue Revised Statutes of
Nebraska, is amended to read:

4 29-4017 (1) A political subdivision may enact an 5 ordinance, resolution, or other legal restriction prescribing where 6 sex offenders may reside <u>or be employed</u> only if the restrictions 7 are limited to sexual predators, extend no more than five 8 hundred feet from a school or child care facility, and meet the 9 requirements of subsection (2) of this section.

10 (2) An ordinance, resolution, or other legal restriction
11 enacted by a political subdivision shall not apply to a sexual
12 predator who:

13 (a) Resides within a prison or a correctional or 14 treatment facility operated by the state or a political 15 subdivision;

(b) Established a residence before July 1, 2006, and has
not moved from that residence, or has begun employment before the
effective date of this act and has not changed the location of that
employment; or

(c) Established a residence after July 1, 2006, or began
employment before the effective date of this act, and the school
or child care facility triggering the restriction was established
after the initial date of the sexual predator's residence or
employment_at that location.
