1	FOR	AN	ACT relating to funds; to amend section 77-3,111,
2			Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, sections 71-5714
3			and 72-1001, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,
4			2008, and sections 9-812 and 82-331, Revised Statutes
5			Supplement, 2009; to provide for and eliminate certain
6			fund transfers; to harmonize provisions; to repeal the
7			original sections; to outright repeal sections 90-513 and
8			90-514, Revised Statutes Supplement, 2009; and to declare
9			an emergency.

10 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

Section 1. Section 9-812, Revised Statutes Supplement,

- 2 2009, is amended to read:
- 3 9-812 (1) All money received from the operation of
- 4 lottery games conducted pursuant to the State Lottery Act in
- 5 Nebraska shall be credited to the State Lottery Operation Trust
- 6 Fund, which fund is hereby created. All payments of the costs
- 7 of establishing and maintaining the lottery games shall be made
- 8 from the State Lottery Operation Cash Fund. In accordance with
- 9 legislative appropriations, money for payments for expenses of the
- 10 division shall be transferred from the State Lottery Operation
- 11 Trust Fund to the State Lottery Operation Cash Fund, which fund
- 12 is hereby created. All money necessary for the payment of lottery
- 13 prizes shall be transferred from the State Lottery Operation Trust
- 14 Fund to the State Lottery Prize Trust Fund, which fund is hereby
- 15 created. The amount used for the payment of lottery prizes shall
- 16 not be less than forty percent of the dollar amount of the lottery
- 17 tickets which have been sold.
- 18 (2) Beginning October 1, 2003, a portion of the dollar
- 19 amount of the lottery tickets which have been sold on an annualized
- 20 basis shall be transferred from the State Lottery Operation Trust
- 21 Fund to the Education Innovation Fund, the Nebraska Scholarship
- 22 Fund, the Nebraska Environmental Trust Fund, the Nebraska State
- 23 Fair Board, and the Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund. The dollar
- 24 amount transferred pursuant to this subsection shall equal the
- 25 greater of (a) the dollar amount transferred to the funds in

1 fiscal year 2002-03 or (b) any amount which constitutes at least

- 2 twenty-two percent and no more than twenty-five percent of the
- 3 dollar amount of the lottery tickets which have been sold on an
- 4 annualized basis. To the extent that funds are available, the
- 5 Tax Commissioner and director may authorize a transfer exceeding
- 6 twenty-five percent of the dollar amount of the lottery tickets
- 7 sold on an annualized basis.
- 8 (3) Of the money available to be transferred to the
- 9 Education Innovation Fund, the Nebraska Scholarship Fund, the
- 10 Nebraska Environmental Trust Fund, the Nebraska State Fair Board,
- 11 and the Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund:
- 12 (a) The first five hundred thousand dollars shall be
- 13 transferred to the Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund to be used
- 14 as provided in section 71-817;
- 15 (b) Nineteen and three-fourths percent of the money
- 16 remaining after the payment of prizes and operating expenses and
- 17 the initial transfer to the Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund
- 18 shall be transferred to the Education Innovation Fund;
- 19 (c) Twenty-four and three-fourths percent of the money
- 20 remaining after the payment of prizes and operating expenses and
- 21 the initial transfer to the Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund
- 22 shall be transferred to the Nebraska Scholarship Fund;
- 23 (d) Forty-four and one-half percent of the money
- 24 remaining after the payment of prizes and operating expenses and
- 25 the initial transfer to the Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund

1 shall be transferred to the Nebraska Environmental Trust Fund to be

- 2 used as provided in the Nebraska Environmental Trust Act;
- 3 (e) Ten percent of the money remaining after the payment
- 4 of prizes and operating expenses and the initial transfer to
- 5 the Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund shall be transferred to
- 6 the Nebraska State Fair Board if the most populous city within
- 7 the county in which the fair is located provides matching funds
- 8 equivalent to ten percent of the funds available for transfer. Such
- 9 matching funds may be obtained from the city and any other private
- 10 or public entity, except that no portion of such matching funds
- 11 shall be provided by the state. If the Nebraska State Fair ceases
- 12 operations, ten percent of the money remaining after the payment
- 13 of prizes and operating expenses and the initial transfer to the
- 14 Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund shall be transferred to the
- 15 General Fund; and
- (f) One percent of the money remaining after the payment
- 17 of prizes and operating expenses and the initial transfer to the
- 18 Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund shall be transferred to the
- 19 Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund to be used as provided in
- 20 section 71-817.
- 21 (4)(a) The Education Innovation Fund is created. At least
- 22 seventy-five percent of the lottery proceeds allocated to the
- 23 Education Innovation Fund shall be available for disbursement.
- 24 (b) For fiscal year 2005-06, the Education Innovation
- 25 Fund shall be allocated as follows: The first one million dollars

1 shall be transferred to the School District Reorganization Fund,

- 2 and the remaining amount shall be allocated to the General Fund
- 3 after operating expenses for the Excellence in Education Council
- 4 are deducted.
- 5 (c) For fiscal year 2006-07, the Education Innovation
- 6 Fund shall be allocated as follows: The first two hundred fifty
- 7 thousand dollars shall be transferred to the Attracting Excellence
- 8 to Teaching Program Cash Fund to fund the Attracting Excellence
- 9 to Teaching Program Act, the next one million dollars shall
- 10 be transferred to the School District Reorganization Fund, and
- 11 the amount remaining in the Education Innovation Fund shall be
- 12 allocated, after administrative expenses, for distance education
- 13 equipment and incentives pursuant to sections 79-1336 and 79-1337.
- 14 (d) For fiscal year 2007-08, the Education Innovation
- 15 Fund shall be allocated as follows: The first five hundred thousand
- 16 dollars shall be transferred to the Attracting Excellence to
- 17 Teaching Program Cash Fund to fund the Attracting Excellence to
- 18 Teaching Program Act, and the amount remaining in the Education
- 19 Innovation Fund shall be allocated, after administrative expenses,
- 20 for distance education equipment and incentives pursuant to
- 21 sections 79-1336 and 79-1337.
- 22 (e) For fiscal year 2008-09, the Education Innovation
- 23 Fund shall be allocated as follows: The first seven hundred
- 24 fifty thousand dollars shall be transferred to the Attracting
- 25 Excellence to Teaching Program Cash Fund to fund the Attracting

1 Excellence to Teaching Program Act, and the amount remaining in the

- 2 Education Innovation Fund shall be allocated, after administrative
- 3 expenses, for distance education equipment and incentives pursuant
- 4 to sections 79-1336 and 79-1337.
- 5 (f) For fiscal year 2009-10, the Education Innovation
- 6 Fund shall be allocated as follows: Any amounts transferred to the
- 7 Education Innovation Fund from the School District Reorganization
- 8 Fund shall be returned to the School District Reorganization Fund
- 9 first, the next one million dollars shall be transferred to the
- 10 Excellence in Teaching Cash Fund to fund the Excellence in Teaching
- 11 Act, and the amount remaining in the Education Innovation Fund
- 12 shall be allocated, after administrative expenses, for distance
- 13 education equipment and incentives pursuant to sections 79-1336 and
- 14 79-1337.
- 15 (g) For fiscal years 2010-11 through 2015-16, the
- 16 Education Innovation Fund shall be allocated as follows: The first
- 17 one million dollars shall be transferred to the Excellence in
- 18 Teaching Cash Fund to fund the Excellence in Teaching Act, and
- 19 the amount remaining in the Education Innovation Fund shall be
- 20 allocated, after administrative expenses, for distance education
- 21 equipment and incentives pursuant to sections 79-1336 and 79-1337.
- 22 (h) For fiscal year 2016-17 and each fiscal year
- 23 thereafter, the Education Innovation Fund shall be allocated,
- 24 after administrative expenses, for education purposes as provided
- 25 by the Legislature.

1 (i) The State Treasurer shall transfer ten million

- 2 dollars from the Education Innovation Fund to the University
- 3 Cash Fund on or before December 31, 2009, as directed by the budget
- 4 administrator of the Department of Administrative Services.
- 5 (5) Any money in the State Lottery Operation Trust
- 6 Fund, the State Lottery Operation Cash Fund, the State Lottery
- 7 Prize Trust Fund, or the Education Innovation Fund available
- 8 for investment shall be invested by the state investment officer
- 9 pursuant to the Nebraska Capital Expansion Act and the Nebraska
- 10 State Funds Investment Act.
- 11 (6) Unclaimed prize money on a winning lottery ticket
- 12 shall be retained for a period of time prescribed by rules and
- 13 regulations. If no claim is made within such period, the prize
- 14 money shall be used at the discretion of the Tax Commissioner for
- 15 any of the purposes prescribed in this section.
- 16 Sec. 2. Section 71-5714, Revised Statutes Cumulative
- 17 Supplement, 2008, is amended to read:
- 18 71-5714 The Tobacco Prevention and Control Cash
- 19 Fund is created. The fund shall be used for a comprehensive
- 20 statewide tobacco-related public health program administered by
- 21 the Department of Health and Human Services which includes, but
- 22 is not limited to (1) community programs to reduce tobacco use,
- 23 (2) chronic disease programs, (3) school programs, (4) statewide
- 24 programs, (5) enforcement, (6) counter marketing, (7) cessation
- 25 programs, (8) surveillance and evaluation, and (9) administration.

1 Any money in the Tobacco Prevention and Control Cash Fund available

- 2 for investment shall be invested by the state investment officer
- 3 pursuant to the Nebraska Capital Expansion Act and the Nebraska
- 4 State Funds Investment Act.
- 5 The State Treasurer shall transfer, on or before June
- 6 30, 2010, as directed by the budget administrator of the budget
- 7 division of the Department of Administrative Services, one million
- 8 three hundred thousand dollars from the Tobacco Prevention and
- 9 Control Cash Fund to the Health and Human Services Cash Fund.
- 10 Sec. 3. Section 72-1001, Revised Statutes Cumulative
- 11 Supplement, 2008, is amended to read:
- 12 72-1001 The Nebraska Capital Construction Fund is
- 13 created. The fund shall consist of revenue and transfers credited
- 14 to the fund as authorized by law. Money shall be appropriated
- 15 from the fund to state agencies for making payments on projects
- 16 as determined by the Legislature, including, but not limited to,
- 17 purchases of land, structural improvements to land, acquisition
- 18 of buildings, construction of buildings, including architectural
- 19 and engineering costs, replacement of or major repairs to
- 20 structural improvements to land or buildings, additions to existing
- 21 structures, remodeling of buildings, and acquisition of equipment
- 22 and furnishings of new or remodeled buildings. The fund shall
- 23 be administered by the State Treasurer as a multiple-agency-use
- 24 fund and appropriated to state agencies as determined by the
- 25 Legislature. Any money in the fund available for investment

1 shall be invested by the state investment officer pursuant to

- 2 the Nebraska Capital Expansion Act and the Nebraska State Funds
- 3 Investment Act.
- 4 The State Treasurer shall transfer one million dollars
- 5 from the Nebraska Capital Construction Fund to the General Fund
- 6 on or before June 30, 2010, on such date as directed by the
- 7 budget administrator of the budget division of the Department of
- 8 Administrative Services.
- 9 Sec. 4. Section 77-3,111, Reissue Revised Statutes of
- 10 Nebraska, is amended to read:
- 11 77-3,111 There is hereby created a fund to be known
- 12 as the Miscellaneous Services Revolving Fund to which shall
- 13 be credited all money received by the Department of Revenue
- 14 for services performed and billed to other agencies or persons.
- 15 All reimbursements to the department for such services shall be
- 16 credited to the fund and expenditures therefrom shall be made only
- 17 when such funds are available. The Department of Revenue shall only
- 18 bill for the actual amount expended in performing such services.
- 19 Any money in the fund shall be administered by the
- 20 Department of Revenue, and any money in the fund available for
- 21 investment shall be invested by the state investment officer
- 22 pursuant to the Nebraska Capital Expansion Act and the Nebraska
- 23 State Funds Investment Act.
- 24 The entire amount in the Miscellaneous Services Revolving
- 25 Fund shall lapse to the General Fund on December 15, 2009.

1 Sec. 5. Section 82-331, Revised Statutes Supplement,

- 2 2009, is amended to read:
- 3 82-331 (1) There is hereby established in the state
- 4 treasury a trust fund to be known as the Nebraska Cultural
- 5 Preservation Endowment Fund. The fund shall consist of funds
- 6 appropriated or transferred by the Legislature, and only the
- 7 earnings of the fund may be used as provided in this section.
- 8 (2) On August 1, 1998, the State Treasurer shall transfer
- 9 five million dollars from the General Fund to the Nebraska Cultural
- 10 Preservation Endowment Fund.
- 11 (3) Except as provided in subsection (4) of this section,
- 12 it is the intent of the Legislature that the State Treasurer
- 13 shall transfer (a) an amount not to exceed five hundred thousand
- 14 dollars from the General Fund to the Nebraska Cultural Preservation
- 15 Endowment Fund on December 31 of 2009 and 2010 and (b) an amount
- 16 not to exceed one million five hundred thousand dollars from the
- 17 General Fund to the Nebraska Cultural Preservation Endowment Fund
- 18 on December 31 of 2011 and 2012.
- 19 (4) Prior to the transfer of funds from any state
- 20 account into the Nebraska Cultural Preservation Endowment Fund,
- 21 the Nebraska Arts Council shall provide documentation to the
- 22 budget division of the Department of Administrative Services that
- 23 qualified endowments have generated a dollar-for-dollar match
- 24 of new money, up to the amount of state funds authorized
- 25 by the Legislature to be transferred to the Nebraska Cultural

1 Preservation Endowment Fund. The budget division of the Department

- 2 of Administrative Services shall notify the State Treasurer to
- 3 execute a transfer of state funds up to the amount specified by the
- 4 Legislature, but only to the extent that the Nebraska Arts Council
- 5 has provided documentation of a dollar-for-dollar match. Funds not
- 6 transferred shall be carried forward to the succeeding year and be
- 7 added to the funds authorized for a dollar-for-dollar match during
- 8 that year.
- 9 (5) The Legislature shall not appropriate or transfer
- 10 money from the Nebraska Cultural Preservation Endowment Fund for
- 11 any purpose other than the purposes stated in sections 82-330 to
- 12 82-333, except that the Legislature may appropriate or transfer
- 13 money from the fund upon a finding that the purposes of such
- 14 sections are not being accomplished by the fund.
- 15 (6) Any money in the Nebraska Cultural Preservation
- 16 Endowment Fund available for investment shall be invested by the
- 17 state investment officer pursuant to the Nebraska Capital Expansion
- 18 Act and the Nebraska State Funds Investment Act.
- 19 (7) All investment earnings from the Nebraska Cultural
- 20 Preservation Endowment Fund shall be credited to the Nebraska Arts
- 21 and Humanities Cash Fund.
- 22 Sec. 6. The State Treasurer shall transfer \$214,008 from
- 23 the Agricultural Alcohol Fuel Tax Fund to the Ethanol Production
- 24 Incentive Cash Fund on or before June 30, 2010, on such date as
- 25 directed by the budget administrator of the budget division of the

- 1 Department of Administrative Services, pursuant to section 66-1334.
- 2 Sec. 7. The State Treasurer shall transfer \$28,016 from
- 3 the Agricultural Alcohol Fuel Tax Fund to the Ethanol Production
- 4 Incentive Cash Fund on or before June 30, 2011, on such date as
- 5 directed by the budget administrator of the budget division of the
- 6 Department of Administrative Services, pursuant to section 66-1334.
- 7 Sec. 8. Original section 77-3,111, Reissue Revised
- 8 Statutes of Nebraska, sections 71-5714 and 72-1001, Revised
- 9 Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2008, and sections 9-812 and
- 10 82-331, Revised Statutes Supplement, 2009, are repealed.
- 11 Sec. 9. The following sections are outright repealed:
- 12 Sections 90-513 and 90-514, Revised Statutes Supplement, 2009.
