Section 1. Section 84-1413, Reissue Revised Statutes of
 Nebraska, is amended to read:

3 84-1413 (1) Each public body shall keep minutes of all
4 meetings showing the time, place, members present and absent, and
5 the substance of all matters discussed.

6 (2) Any action taken on any question or motion duly moved 7 and seconded shall be by roll call vote of the public body in open 8 session, and the record shall state how each member voted or if the 9 member was absent or not voting. The requirements of a roll call 10 or viva voce vote shall be satisfied by a municipality, a joint entity created pursuant to the Interlocal Cooperation Act, a joint 11 12 public agency created pursuant to the Joint Public Agency Act, 13 or an agency formed under the Municipal Cooperative Financing Act 14 which utilizes an electronic voting device which allows the yeas 15 and nays of each member of the such city council, or village board, 16 or governing body to be readily seen by the public.

17 (3) The vote to elect leadership within a public body may
18 be taken by secret ballot, but the total number of votes for each
19 candidate shall be recorded in the minutes.

20 (4) The minutes of all meetings and evidence and 21 documentation received or disclosed in open session shall be 22 public records and open to public inspection during normal business 23 hours.

(5) Minutes shall be written and available for inspectionwithin ten working days or prior to the next convened meeting,

1 whichever occurs earlier, except that cities of the second class 2 and villages may have an additional ten working days if the 3 employee responsible for writing the minutes is absent due to a 4 serious illness or emergency.
