A BILL

- 1 FOR AN ACT relating to criminal procedure; to amend section 2 29-4004, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska; to clarify
- 3 references to the county sheriff; and to repeal the
- 4 original section.
- 5 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1 Section 1. Section 29-4004, Reissue Revised Statutes of

- 2 Nebraska, is amended to read:
- 3 29-4004 (1) Any person subject to the Sex Offender
- 4 Registration Act shall register with the sheriff of the county in
- 5 which the person resides or is temporarily domiciled within five
- 6 working days of becoming subject to the act.
- 7 (2) Any person required to register under the act shall
- 8 inform the sheriff of the county in which he or she resides,
- 9 in writing, if he or she has a new address within such county
- 10 within five working days after the address change. The sheriff
- 11 shall forward such information to the sex offender registration and
- 12 community notification division of the Nebraska State Patrol within
- 13 five working days after receipt of the new address.
- 14 (3) Any person required to register under the act shall
- 15 inform the sheriff of the county in which he or she resides, in
- 16 writing, if he or she has a new address in a different county
- 17 in this state within five working days after the address change.
- 18 The sheriff shall forward the new address to the sex offender
- 19 registration and community notification division of the Nebraska
- 20 State Patrol within five working days after receipt of the new
- 21 address. The division shall notify the sheriff of the county to
- 22 which the person is relocating of the new address. The person shall
- 23 report to the county sheriff of his or her new county of residence
- 24 and register with such county sheriff within five working days
- 25 after the address change.

1 (4) Any person required to register under the act shall 2 inform the sheriff of the county in which he or she resides, 3 in writing, if he or she moves to a new out-of-state address within five working days after the address change. The sheriff 5 shall forward the new out-of-state address to the sex offender registration and notification division of the Nebraska State Patrol 6 7 within five working days after receipt of the new out-of-state address. The division shall forward the new out-of-state address to 9 the other state's central repository for sex offender registration. 10 (5) Any person required to register under the act who 11 is residing in another state or is temporarily domiciled in 12 another state, and is employed, carries on a vocation, or attends 13 school in this state shall report and register with the sheriff 14 of the county in which he or she is employed, carries on a 15 vocation, or attends school in this state within five working 16 days after becoming employed, carrying on a vocation, or attending 17 school. The person shall also notify the sheriff of any changes in 18 employment, vocation, or school of attendance, in writing, within 19 five working days after the change. The sheriff shall forward 20 this information to the sex offender registration and community 21 notification division of the Nebraska State Patrol within five 22 working days after receipt of such information. For purposes of 23 this subsection:

24 (a) Attends school means enrollment in any educational
25 institution in this state on a full-time or part-time basis;

1 (b) Is employed or carries on a vocation means any

- 2 full-time or part-time employment, with or without compensation,
- 3 which lasts for a duration of more than fourteen days or for an
- 4 aggregate period exceeding thirty days in a calendar year; and
- 5 (c) Temporarily domiciled means a place at which the
- 6 person actually lives or stays on a temporary basis even though
- 7 he or she may plan to return to his or her permanent address
- 8 or to another temporary address. For purposes of this section, a
- 9 temporary domicile means any place at which the person actually
- 10 lives or stays for a period of at least five working days.
- 11 (6) Any person incarcerated for a registrable offense
- 12 under section 29-4003 in a jail, penal or correctional facility, or
- 13 other public or private institution who is not already registered
- 14 shall be registered by the jail, penal or correctional facility,
- 15 or public or private institution prior to his or her discharge,
- 16 parole, furlough, work release, or release. The person shall be
- 17 informed and information shall be obtained as required in section
- 18 29-4006.
- 19 (7) Any person required to register under the act shall
- 20 inform the sheriff of the county in which he or she resides, in
- 21 writing, of each postsecondary educational institution at which
- 22 he or she is employed, carries on a vocation, or attends school,
- 23 within five working days after such employment or attendance.
- 24 The person shall also notify the sheriff of any change in such
- 25 employment or attendance status at the postsecondary educational

1 institution, in writing, within five working days after such

- 2 change. The sheriff shall forward the information regarding such
- 3 employment or attendance to the sex offender registration and
- 4 community notification division of the Nebraska State Patrol within
- 5 five working days after receipt of the information.
- 6 (8) Any person required to register or who is registered
- 7 under the act, but is incarcerated for more than five days, whether
- 8 or not in his or her own county of residence or temporary domicile,
- 9 shall inform the sheriff of the county in which such person would
- 10 reside or would be temporarily domiciled if he or she was not
- 11 incarcerated, within five working days after incarceration, of his
- 12 or her incarceration and his or her expected release date, if any
- 13 such date is available. The sheriff shall forward the information
- 14 regarding incarceration to the sex offender registration and
- 15 community notification division of the Nebraska State Patrol within
- 16 five working days after receipt of the information.
- 17 (9) Any person required to register or who is registered
 18 under the act who no longer has a residence or temporary domicile
- 19 shall notify the county sheriff of the county in which he or she
- 20 is located, in writing, within five working days after such change
- 21 in residence or temporary domicile. Such person shall update his
- 22 or her registration, in writing, on a form approved by the sex
- 23 offender registration and community notification division of the
- 24 Nebraska State Patrol at least once every thirty calendar days
- 25 during the time he or she remains without residence or temporary

- 1 domicile.
- 2 (10) Each registering entity shall forward all written
- 3 information, photographs, and fingerprints obtained pursuant to the
- 4 act to the sex offender registration and community notification
- 5 division of the Nebraska State Patrol within five working days. The
- 6 information shall be forwarded on forms furnished by the division.
- 7 The division shall maintain a central registry of sex offenders
- 8 required to register under the act.
