A BILL

- FOR AN ACT relating to campaign finance; to amend section

 32-1603, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, and

 section 49-1455, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,

 2008; to redefine election period; and to repeal the original sections.
- 6 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1 Section 1. Section 32-1603, Reissue Revised Statutes of

- 2 Nebraska, is amended to read:
- 3 32-1603 For purposes of the Campaign Finance Limitation
- 4 Act, the definitions found in sections 49-1404 to 49-1444 shall be
- 5 used, except that:
- 6 (1) Covered elective office means (a) the Legislature
- 7 in any election period and (b) the Governor, State Treasurer,
- 8 Secretary of State, Attorney General, Auditor of Public Accounts,
- 9 the Public Service Commission, the Board of Regents of the
- 10 University of Nebraska, and the State Board of Education if
- 11 designated as covered for a given election period pursuant to
- 12 section 32-1611;
- 13 (2) Election period means (a) the period beginning
- 14 January 1 of the calendar year prior to following the year of
- 15 the last general election in which the candidate is seeking office
- 16 was on the ballot through the end of the calendar year of such
- 17 the following election; for covered elective offices listed in
- 18 subdivision (1)(a) of this section and (b) the period beginning
- 19 July 1 of the calendar year prior to the year of the election
- 20 in which the candidate is seeking office through the end of the
- 21 calendar year of such election for covered elective offices listed
- 22 in subdivision (1)(b) of this section;
- 23 (3) Expenditure, as it relates to the expenditure of
- 24 public funds, means (a) the purchase for campaign activities of (i)
- 25 services from a communications medium, including production costs,

1 (ii) printing, photography, graphic arts, or advertising services,

- 2 (iii) office supplies, (iv) postage and other commercial delivery
- 3 services, (v) meals, lodging, and travel expenses, and (vi) staff
- 4 salaries and (b) repayment of loans to the candidate committee made
- 5 in accordance with subsection (2) of section 32-1608.03 for any of
- 6 the purposes listed in subdivision (a) of this subdivision;
- 7 (4) General election period means the period beginning
- 8 with the day following the end of the primary election period
- 9 through the end of the election period;
- 10 (5) Primary election period means the period beginning
- 11 with the first day of the election period through the thirty-fifth
- 12 day following the primary election; and
- 13 (6) Unrestricted spending means expenditures or transfers
- 14 of funds authorized under subdivision (6), (8), or (9) of section
- 15 49-1446.03.
- 16 Sec. 2. Section 49-1455, Revised Statutes Cumulative
- 17 Supplement, 2008, is amended to read:
- 18 49-1455 (1) The campaign statement of a committee, other
- 19 than a political party committee, shall contain the following
- 20 information:
- 21 (a) The filing committee's name, address, and telephone
- 22 number and the full name, residential and business addresses, and
- 23 telephone numbers of its committee treasurer;
- 24 (b) Under the heading RECEIPTS, the total amount of
- 25 contributions received during the period covered by the campaign

1 statement; under the heading EXPENDITURES, the total amount of

- 2 expenditures made during the period covered by the campaign
- 3 statement; and the cumulative amount of those totals for the
- 4 election period. If a loan was repaid during the period covered
- 5 by the campaign statement, the amount of the repayment shall
- 6 be subtracted from the total amount of contributions received.
- 7 Forgiveness of a loan shall not be included in the totals. Payment
- 8 of a loan by a third party shall be recorded and reported as a
- 9 contribution by the third party but shall not be included in the
- 10 totals. In-kind contributions or expenditures shall be listed at
- 11 fair market value and shall be reported as both contributions and
- 12 expenditures;
- 13 (c) The balance of cash and cash equivalents on hand at
- 14 the beginning and the end of the period covered by the campaign
- 15 statement;
- 16 (d) The full name of each individual from whom
- 17 contributions totaling more than two hundred fifty dollars are
- 18 received during the period covered by the report, together with
- 19 the individual's street address, the amount contributed, the date
- 20 on which each contribution was received, and the cumulative amount
- 21 contributed by that individual for the election period;
- 22 (e) The full name of each person, except those
- 23 individuals reported under subdivision (1)(d) of this section,
- 24 which contributed a total of more than two hundred fifty dollars
- 25 during the period covered by the report together with the person's

1 street address, the amount contributed, the date on which each

- 2 contribution was received, and the cumulative amount contributed by
- 3 the person for the election period;
- 4 (f) The name of each committee which is listed as
- 5 a contributor shall include the full name of the committee's
- 6 treasurer;
- 7 (g) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (3) of
- 8 this section: The full name and street address of each person
- 9 to whom expenditures totaling more than two hundred fifty dollars
- 10 were made, together with the date and amount of each separate
- 11 expenditure to each such person during the period covered by the
- 12 campaign statement; the purpose of the expenditure; and the full
- 13 name and street address of the person providing the consideration
- 14 for which any expenditure was made if different from the payee;
- 15 (h) The amount and the date of expenditures for or
- 16 against a candidate or ballot question during the period covered
- 17 by the campaign statement and the cumulative amount of expenditures
- 18 for or against that candidate or ballot question for the election
- 19 period. An expenditure made in support of more than one candidate
- 20 or ballot question, or both, shall be apportioned reasonably among
- 21 the candidates or ballot questions, or both; and
- 22 (i) The total amount of funds disbursed by a separate
- 23 segregated political fund, by state, for the purpose of supporting
- 24 or opposing candidates and committees in elections in states
- 25 other than Nebraska and candidates for federal office, including

- 1 independent expenditures made in such elections.
- 2 (2) For purposes of this section, election period means
- 3 (a) the period beginning January 1 of the calendar year prior
- 4 to following the year of the last general election in which
- 5 the candidate is seeking office was on the ballot through the
- 6 end of the calendar year of such the following election for
- 7 candidate committees of candidates seeking covered elective offices
- 8 as defined in subdivision (1)(a) of section 32-1603, (b) the period
- 9 beginning July 1 of the calendar year prior to the year of the
- 10 election in which the candidate is seeking office through the end
- 11 of the calendar year of such election for candidate committees
- 12 of candidates seeking covered elective offices so defined in
- 13 subdivision or (1) (b) of section 32-1603, and (c) (b) the calendar
- 14 year of the election for all other committees.
- 15 (3) A campaign statement shall include the total amount
- 16 paid to individual petition circulators during the reporting
- 17 period, if any, but shall not include the name, address, or
- 18 telephone number of any individual petition circulator if the only
- 19 payment made to such individual was for services as a petition
- 20 circulator.
