2		Assistance Act; to amend sections 13-2601, 13-2604,
3		13-2605, and 13-2706, Reissue Revised Statutes of
4		Nebraska, and sections 13-2603 and 13-2610, Revised
5		Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2008; to provide and
6		change provisions relating to terms, state assistance,
7		financing, and grant applications; to harmonize
8		provisions; and to repeal the original sections.

1 Section 1. Section 13-2601, Reissue Revised Statutes of

- 2 Nebraska, is amended to read:
- 3 13-2601 Sections 13-2601 to 13-2612 and section 6 of
- 4 this act shall be known and may be cited as the Convention Center
- 5 Facility Financing Assistance Act.
- 6 Sec. 2. Section 13-2603, Revised Statutes Cumulative
- 7 Supplement, 2008, is amended to read:
- 8 13-2603 For purposes of the Convention Center Facility
- 9 Financing Assistance Act:
- 10 (1) (a) Associated hotel means any publicly owned facility
- 11 in which the public may, for a consideration, obtain sleeping
- 12 accommodations and which is located within two hundred yards of an
- 13 eligible facility; and
- 14 (b) Beginning with applications for financial assistance
- 15 received on or after February 1, 2008, associated hotel means any
- 16 publicly or privately owned facility in which the public may, for a
- 17 consideration, obtain sleeping accommodations and which, (i) except
- 18 as provided in subdivision (1)(b)(ii) of this section, is located
- 19 within four hundred fifty yards of an eligible facility, measured
- 20 from the eligible facility but not from any parking facility or
- 21 other structure, or (ii) in a city of the first class, is located
- 22 within one mile of an eligible facility, measured from the eligible
- 23 facility but not from any parking facility or other structure;
- 24 (2) Board means a board consisting of the Governor,
- 25 the State Treasurer, the chairperson of the Nebraska Investment

1 Council, the chairperson of the Nebraska State Board of Public

- 2 Accountancy, and a professor of economics on the faculty of a
- 3 state postsecondary educational institution appointed to a two-year
- 4 term on the board by the Coordinating Commission for Postsecondary
- 5 Education. For administrative and budget purposes only, the board
- 6 shall be considered part of the Department of Revenue;
- 7 (3) Bond means a general obligation bond, redevelopment
- 8 bond, lease-purchase bond, revenue bond, or combination of any such
- 9 bonds;
- 10 (4) Convention and meeting center facility means a
- 11 temperature-controlled building and personal property primarily
- 12 used as a convention and meeting center, including an auditorium,
- 13 an exhibition hall, a facility for onsite food preparation and
- 14 serving, an onsite, directly connected parking facility for the
- 15 use of the convention and meeting center facility, and an
- 16 onsite administrative office of the convention and meeting center
- 17 facility;
- 18 (5)(a) Eligible facility means any publicly owned
- 19 convention and meeting center facility approved for state
- 20 assistance on or before June 1, 2007, any publicly owned sports
- 21 arena facility attached to such convention and meeting center
- 22 facility, or any publicly or privately owned convention and
- 23 meeting center facility or publicly or privately owned sports arena
- 24 facility acquired, constructed, improved, or equipped after June
- 25 1, 2007; and

1 (b) Beginning with applications for financial assistance

- 2 received on or after February 1, 2008, eligible facility does not
- 3 include any publicly or privately owned sports arena facility with
- 4 a seating capacity greater than sixteen thousand seats;
- 5 (6) General obligation bond means any bond or refunding
- 6 bond issued by a political subdivision and which is payable from
- 7 the proceeds of an ad valorem tax;
- 8 (7) Political subdivision means any local governmental
- 9 body formed and organized under state law and any joint entity
- 10 or joint public agency created under state law to act on behalf
- 11 of political subdivisions which has statutory authority to issue
- 12 general obligation bonds;
- 13 (8) Revenue bond means any bond or refunding bond issued
- 14 by a political subdivision which is limited or special rather than
- 15 a general obligation bond of the political subdivision and which is
- 16 not payable from the proceeds of an ad valorem tax; and
- 17 (9) Sports arena facility means any enclosed
- 18 temperature-controlled building primarily used for competitive
- 19 sports, including arenas, dressing and locker facilities,
- 20 concession areas, parking facilities, and onsite administrative
- 21 offices connected with operating the facilities.
- 22 Sec. 3. Section 13-2604, Reissue Revised Statutes of
- 23 Nebraska, is amended to read:
- 24 13-2604 Any political subdivision that has acquired,
- 25 constructed, improved, or equipped or has approved a general

1 obligation bond issue to acquire, construct, improve, or equip

- 2 eligible facilities may apply to the board for state assistance.
- 3 The state assistance may be used to pay back amounts expended
- 4 or borrowed by the political subdivision or expended or borrowed
- 5 through one or more issues of bonds to be expended by the political
- 6 subdivision to acquire, construct, improve, and equip eligible
- 7 facilities until repayment in full of the amounts expended or
- 8 borrowed by the political subdivision, including the principal
- 9 of and interest on bonds, for eligible facilities. The political
- 10 subdivision may continue to apply to the board for continuing state
- 11 assistance in reimbursing the costs of financing the acquisition,
- 12 construction, improvement, and equipping of the eligible facility.
- Sec. 4. Section 13-2605, Reissue Revised Statutes of
- 14 Nebraska, is amended to read:
- 15 13-2605 (1) All applications for state assistance under
- 16 the Convention Center Facility Financing Assistance Act shall be in
- 17 writing and shall include a certified copy of the approving action
- 18 of the governing body of the applicant describing the proposed
- 19 eligible facility and the anticipated financing.
- 20 (2) The application shall contain:
- 21 (a) A description of the proposed financing of the
- 22 eligible facility, including (i) the estimated principal and
- 23 interest requirements for the bonds proposed to be issued in
- 24 connection with the eligible facility or (ii) the amounts necessary
- 25 to repay the original investment by the applicant in the eligible

- 1 facility_financed as provided in section 6 of this act;
- 2 (b) Documentation of local financial commitment to
- 3 support the project, including all public and private resources
- 4 pledged or committed to the project; and
- 5 (c) Any other project information deemed appropriate by
- 6 the board.
- 7 (3) Upon receiving an application for state assistance,
- 8 the board shall review the application and notify the applicant of
- 9 any additional information needed for a proper evaluation of the
- 10 application.
- 11 (4) Any state assistance received pursuant to the act
- 12 shall be used only for public purposes.
- Sec. 5. Section 13-2610, Revised Statutes Cumulative
- 14 Supplement, 2008, is amended to read:
- 15 13-2610 (1) Upon the annual certification under section
- 16 13-2609, the State Treasurer shall transfer after the audit
- 17 the amount certified to the Convention Center Support Fund. The
- 18 Convention Center Support Fund is created. Any money in the fund
- 19 available for investment shall be invested by the state investment
- 20 officer pursuant to the Nebraska Capital Expansion Act and the
- 21 Nebraska State Funds Investment Act.
- 22 (2)(a) It is the intent of the Legislature to appropriate
- 23 from the fund to any political subdivision for which an application
- 24 for state assistance under the Convention Center Facility Financing
- 25 Assistance Act has been approved an amount not to exceed (i)

1 seventy percent of the state sales tax revenue collected by

- 2 retailers and operators doing business at such facilities on sales
- 3 at such facilities, state sales tax revenue collected on primary
- 4 and secondary box office sales of admissions to such facilities,
- 5 and state sales tax revenue collected by associated hotels, (ii)
- 6 seventy-five million dollars for any one approved project, or (iii)
- 7 the total cost of acquiring, constructing, improving, or equipping
- 8 the eligible facility. State assistance shall not be used for an
- 9 operating subsidy or other ancillary facility.
- 10 (b) Ten percent of such funds appropriated to a city
- 11 of the metropolitan class under this subsection shall be equally
- 12 distributed to areas with a high concentration of poverty to
- 13 showcase important historical aspects of such areas.
- 14 (c) Each area with a high concentration of poverty that
- 15 has been distributed funds under subdivision (b) of this subsection
- 16 shall establish a development fund and form a committee which
- 17 shall identify and research potential projects and make final
- 18 determinations on the use of state sales tax revenue received for
- 19 such projects.
- 20 (d) A committee formed in subdivision (c) of this
- 21 subsection shall include the following three members:
- 22 (i) The member of the city council whose district
- 23 includes a majority of the census tracts which each contain a
- 24 percentage of persons below the poverty line of greater than thirty
- 25 percent, as determined by the most recent federal decennial census,

- 1 within the area with a high concentration of poverty;
- 2 (ii) The commissioner of the county whose district
- 3 includes a majority of the census tracts which each contain a
- 4 percentage of persons below the poverty line of greater than thirty
- 5 percent, as determined by the most recent federal decennial census,
- 6 within the area with a high concentration of poverty; and
- 7 (iii) A resident of the area with a high concentration of
- 8 poverty, appointed by the other two members of the committee.
- 9 (e) A committee formed in subdivision (c) of this
- 10 subsection shall solicit project ideas from the public and shall
- 11 hold a public hearing in the area with a high concentration
- 12 of poverty. Notice of a proposed hearing shall be provided in
- 13 accordance with the procedures for notice of a public hearing
- 14 pursuant to section 18-2115. The committee shall research potential
- 15 projects in its area and make the final determination regarding the
- 16 annual distribution of funding to such projects.
- 17 (f) For purposes of this subsection, an area with a high
- 18 concentration of poverty means an area within the corporate limits
- 19 of a city of the metropolitan class consisting of one or more
- 20 contiguous census tracts, as determined by the most recent federal
- 21 decennial census, which contain a percentage of persons below the
- 22 poverty line of greater than thirty percent, and all census tracts
- 23 contiguous to such tract or tracts, as determined by the most
- 24 recent federal decennial census.
- 25 (3) State assistance to the political subdivision shall

1 no longer be available upon the retirement of the bonds issued

- 2 to acquire, construct, improve, or equip the facility or any
- 3 subsequent bonds that refunded the original issue, upon the
- 4 completion of the term of years for which the political subdivision
- 5 sought state assistance under section 6 of this act, or when state
- 6 assistance reaches the amount determined under subdivision (2)(a)
- 7 of this section, whichever comes first.
- 8 (4) The remaining thirty percent of state sales tax
- 9 revenue collected by retailers and operators doing business at such
- 10 facilities on sales at such facilities, state sales tax revenue
- 11 collected on primary and secondary box office sales of admissions
- 12 to such facilities, and state sales tax revenue collected by
- 13 associated hotels, shall be appropriated by the Legislature to the
- 14 Local Civic, Cultural, and Convention Center Financing Fund.
- 15 (5) Any municipality city of the metropolitan or primary
- 16 class that has applied for and received a grant of assistance under
- 17 the Local Civic, Cultural, and Convention Center Financing Act may
- 18 not receive state assistance under the Convention Center Facility
- 19 Financing Assistance Act.
- 20 Sec. 6. In lieu of financing an eligible facility
- 21 through the issuance of bonds, a political subdivision seeking
- 22 to construct, acquire, substantially reconstruct, expand, operate,
- 23 improve, or equip an eligible facility may file an application
- 24 for state assistance under the Convention Center Facility Financing
- 25 Assistance Act without requiring the issuance of bonds. Such

1 application shall be in writing and shall include a certified copy

- 2 of the approving action of the governing body of the applicant
- 3 describing the proposed eligible facility and the anticipated
- 4 financing. The application shall contain the information required
- 5 in section 13-2605, including the term of years the political
- 6 subdivision will seek state assistance under the act.
- 7 Sec. 7. Section 13-2706, Reissue Revised Statutes of
- 8 Nebraska, is amended to read:
- 9 13-2706 Any municipality, except a city of the
- 10 metropolitan or primary class that has received funding under the
- 11 Convention Center Facility Financing Assistance Act, may apply for
- 12 a grant of assistance from the fund. Application shall be made on
- 13 forms developed by the department.
- 14 Sec. 8. Original sections 13-2601, 13-2604, 13-2605, and
- 15 13-2706, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, and sections 13-2603
- 16 and 13-2610, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2008, are
- 17 repealed.
